TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS AND TREASURY BONDS.

- The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 21st April, 1922, at 1 o'clock, for
 - (a) Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877; the National Debt Act, 1889; and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919; and
 - (b) £5 per cent. Treasury Bonds, repayable at par on the 1st February, 1927.
- 2. The maximum amount of Treasury Bills and Treasury Bonds to be issued will be £55,000,000. The amount of Treasury Bonds issued will not exceed £10,000,000, but subject to that limit the total amount issued will be divided between Bills and Bonds in such proportions as Their Lordships may determine.

TREASURY BILLS.

3. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 24th April, 1922, to Saturday, the 29th April, 1922, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the

Bank of England.

5. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even

multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

£5% TREASURY BONDS, 1927.

- 6. The Bonds will be in denominations of £50. £100, £200, £500, £1,000 and £5,000. They will be exempt from Corporation Profits Tax, and will in all respects rank pari passu with those issued under the Prospectus of the 21st January, 1922. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 24th April, 1922, to Saturday, the 29th April, 1922, inclusive; the first dividend, payable on the 1st August, 1922, will represent in the case of each Bond interest to that date from the date of the Bond.
- 7. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bonds required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one shilling) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bonds of different dates.

8. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

- 9. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills or Bonds are to be dated.
- 10. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills and Bonds.

11. Tenders must be made on the printed forms, which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

12. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 AND 1918.

BOOT AND SHOE REPAIRING TRIADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

MINIMUM RIATES OF WAGES (AS VARIED) FOR CERTAIN CLASSES OF MALE APPRENTICES, PROVIDED WITH BOARD AND LODGING, &c.

EFFECTIVE AS FROM 18TH APRIL, 1922.

Should this date, however, not correspond with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid by an employer who pays wages

at intervals not exceeding seven days, the rates shall become effective as from the beginning of the next full-pay period, but in no case later than 24th April, 1922.

PART I.

GENERAL MINIMUM TIME RATES (AS VARIED) FOR CERTAIN CLASSES OF MALE APPRENTICES, PROVIDED WITH BOARD, LODGING, &c.

The General Minimum Time Rates for the following classes of MALE INDENTURED APPRENTICES (as defined in Part III of the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice D (13), dated 21st September, 1921), namely:—

(a) APPRENTICES who are apprenticed for a period of five years to HAND-SEWN

MAKING; and

(b) APPRENTICES who are apprenticed for a period of five years to HAND-SEWN MAKING AND REPAIRING, and not less than one-third of whose time is spent in HAND-SEWN MAKING;

Who in both the above-mentioned cases:

(1) are employed under an indenture which is in the form set cut in Part IV of the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice D (13), dated 21st September, 1921, and, in addition, contains a provision that the apprentice shall be provided by his employer with sufficient meat, drink, washing, medicine, medical attendance, clothing, lodging, and all other necessaries during the period of his appenticeship,

(2) Commence their apprenticeship on or before their sixteenth birthday, and

(3) Are registered with the Trade Board and are employed under the conditions laid down for Apprentices in Part III of the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice D (13), dated 21st September, 1921,

are the following net sums (that is, clear of all deductions, including deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, and deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any superannuation or other provident fund), namely:—

During the 1st year of Apprenticeship, 1s. 6d. per week of 48 hours.

During the 2nd year of Apprenticeship, 2s. 6d. per week of 48 hours.

During the 3rd year of Apprenticeship, 3s. 6d. per week of 48 hours.

During the 4th year of Apprenticeship, 4s. 6d. per week of 48 hours.

During the 5th year of Apprenticeship, 5s. 6d. per week of 48 hours.

Provided that the above rates shall also apply to Indentured Apprentices of the classes specified above, who were indentured prior to the 15th May, 1920, and who are under adequate instruction in Hand-Sewn Making or Hand-Sewn Making and Repairing, notwithstanding that the indenture provides also for instruction in Boot and Shoe Repairing generally.

PART II.

SECTION I.—The Minimum Rates of Wages set out in this Schedule apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all workers in Great Britain of the classes specified in this Schedule in respect of all time during

which they are employed in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Boot and Shoe Repairing) Order, 1919, namely:—

"the Boot and Shoe Repairing Trade, that is to say, the repairing wherever carried on of boots, shoes, slippers and all kinds of leather footwear including the making of bespoke handsewn, riveted or pegged leather footwear, but excluding the manufacture of leather footwear on a large scale, the repairing of saddlery and leather goods other than leather footwear and the retailing of leather otwear."

SECTION II.—The above Minimum Rates are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages.

TIN BOX TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

PROPOSAL TO VARY MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS IN THE TIN BOX AND CANISTER TRADE IN GREAT BRITAIN.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established under that Act and the Trade Boards Provisional Orders Confirmation Act, 1913, for the Tin Box and Canister Trade in Great Britain, as defined in the Regulations made by the Board of Trade, and dated 12th June, 1914, HEREBY GIVE NOTICE, as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that they PROPOSE TO VARY the General Minimum Time-Rates and Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates for Male and Female Workers at present fixed and set out in the Schedule to their Notice dated 18th November, 1921, and to Vary the Overtime Rates for Male and Female Workers set out in the Schedule to their Notice dated 1st November, 1919, the Proposed Variation of the Minimum Rates of Wages being as shown in the Schedule set out below.

This Notice is issued with the consent of the Minister of Labour.

Provided that-

- (a) As regards workers under 18 years of age, the above Minimum Rates shall apply only in cases where the worker is, during the whole or a substantial part of her time, learning any branch or process of the trade under conditions which afford her a reasonable prospect of advancement to the Minimum Rates applicable to workers of 18 years of age and upwards. Otherwise the General Minimum Time Rates applicable shall be 30s. per week (or 7½d. per hour) for a period of three months from the date on which the proposed variation takes effect, and thereafter 29s. per week (or 7¼d. per hour), and the Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate applicable in respect of the same periods shall be 35s. per week and 34s. per week respectively, irrespective of age.
- (b) In the case of WORKERS UNDER 18 YEARS OF AGE WHO ARE EMPLOYED ON POWER PRESSES, which on account of their size, or heaviness, of the risk of personal injury involved, or upon other grounds, are unsuitable for the employment of such workers, the General Minimum Time-Rates shall be 30s. per work (i.e., 7½d. per hour) for a period of three months from the date on which the proposed variation takes effect, and thereafter 29s. per week (i.e., 7¼d. per hour), and the Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates in respect of the same periods shall be 35s. per week and 34s. per week respectively. In the interpretation of this clause, regard shall be had for the practice of good employers.
- (c) A WORKER WHO ENTERS THE TRADE FOR THE FIRST TIME, AT THE AGE OF 15 YEARS OF AGE OR OVER, and who cannot suitably be employed on piecework, shall, until the expiry of six months' employment in the trade, be paid at a rate of not less than three-quarters of the General Minimum Time-Rate which would otherwise be applicable according to her age.

Provided that :-

- (a) As regards workers employed under 21 years of age, the above Minimum Rates shall apply only in cases where the worker is, during the whole or a substantial part of his time, learning any branch or process of the trade under conditions which afford him a reasonable prospect of advancement to the Minimum Rates applicable to workers of 21 years of age and over. Otherwise the General Minimum Time-Rate applicable shall be 52s. per week (i.e., 1s. 1d. per hour), and the Piece Work Basis Time-Rate applicable shall be 62s. per week, irrespective of age.
- (b) A worker who enters the trade for the first time at the age of 15 years or over, and who cannot suitably be employed on piece-work, shall, until the expiry of six months' employment in the trade, be paid at a rate of not less than three-quarters of the General Minimum Time Rate which would otherwise be applicable according to his age.

The weekly rates set out above are based on a week of 48 hours, but they shall be subject to a proportionate DECREASE according as the number of hours actually spent by the worker in the factory or workshop under contract of employment in any week is less than 48.

In cases where the worker is employed on piece-work, the piece rates paid shall be sufficient to yield to an ORDINARY worker an amount not less than the Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate applicable as set out above.

PART II.

PROPOSED VARIATION OF OVERTIME RATES FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS.

(All Ages.)

SECTION I.-

In accordance with Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board have declared the normal number of hours of work in the trade to be as follows :-

Provided that all hours worked on Sundays and on the days allowed as holidays under Section 35 of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, shall be regarded as Overtime to which the Overtime Rates shall apply.

SECTION II.-

The Minimum Rates for Overtime to apply in respect of all hours worked by Male and Female Workers, in excess of the declared normal number of hours, are as follows:-

(A) For Male and Female Workers employed on Time Work:-

For the first two hours of Overtime on any day except Sunday and the holidays specified above the Overtime Rate shall be One-and a Quarter Times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, i.e., TIME-AND-A-QUARTER.
 For Overtime after the first two hours of Overtime on any day, except Sunday and the

holidays specified above, the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Half Times the General

Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, i.e., TIME-AND-A-HALF.

(3) For all time worked on Sunday and the days allowed as holidays under Section 35 of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, the Overtime Rate shall b: Twice the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, i.e., DOUBLE TIME.

(4) For all hours worked in any week in excess of 48 the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-

Quarter Times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, i.e., TIME-AND-A-QUARTER, except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are payable under the provisions of paragraphs (2) and (3) of Sub-Section (A) of this Section.

(a) Where it is or may become the established practice of an employer only to require attendance on five days a week, the Overtime Rate shall only be payable on such days after 9½ hours have been worked.

(b) Where it is or may become the established practice of an employer to require attendance only on alternate Saturdays the Overtime Rate shall only be payable in the week in which attendance on Saturday is required AFTER 50 hours have been

(B) For Male and Female Workers employed on Piece-Work:—

All male and female workers who are employed on Piece-Work shall receive in respect of each hour of Overtime worked, in addition to payment at Piece-Rates each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an Ordinary Worker not less than the Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate applicable, an amount equal to One-Quarter of the appropriate Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate, One-Half of the appropriate Piece Work Basis Time-Rate or the appropriate Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate, according as the Overtime Rate which would have been payable under the provisions of Sub-Section (A) of this Section if the Worker had been employed on Time-Work were TIME-AND-A-QUARTER, TIME-AND-A-HALF or DOUBLE TIME respectively.

PART III.

The above proposed Minimum Rates of Wages apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts and of this Notice, to all workers who are employed during the whole or any part of their time in any branch of the trade as specified in Part II. of the Notice X. (5) issued by the Trade Board and dated 18th November, 1921.

The Trade Board will consider any OBJECTIONS to the above Proposals to Vary which may be lodged with them within two months from the 13th April, 1922. Such Objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary of the Tin Box Trade Board (Great Britain), 7-11, Old Bailey, London, E.C. 4.

It is desirable that the Objections should state precisely, and so far as possible with reasons,

what is objected to.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established in Great Britain under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, for the Pin, Hook and Eye and Snap Fastener Trade as specified in the Trade Boards (Pin, Hook and Eye and Snap Fastener) Order, 1919, HEREBY GIVE NOTICE, as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918 (the Minister of Labour having given his consent to such Notice being given), that they PROPOSE TO VARY the General Minimum Time-rates, Piece-work Basis Time-rates and Overtime Rates fixed and set out in the Schedule to their Notice O. (11) dated 24th March, 1922, in respect of CERTAIN CLASSES OF MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS, and that they PROPOSE TO FIX General Minimum Time rates, a Piece-work Basis Time-rate and Overtime Rates for FEMALE WORKERS (other than Home-Workers) employed in Carding Hooks and Eyes or Snap Fasteners, and General Minimum Piece-rates for Home-Workers, the proposed minimum rates of Wages being as shown in the Schedule set out below.

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 12TH APRIL 1922.)

(TANWORTH DIS-WARWICKSHIRE (FOOT - AND - MOUTH TRICT) DISEASE) ORDER OF 1922.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:

1. Parts I. and IV. of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Control of Movement) Order of 1920, hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order," are hereby applied without modification, save as hereinafter provided, to the district described in the First Schedule hereto, which shall be a Scheduled District for the purposes of that Order.

Movement Within the Scheduled District.

- 2.—(1) Where an Inspector of the Ministry considers it necessary or expedient, after inquiry, that an animal in the Scheduled District should be permitted to be moved within the Scheduled District as often as occasion may require between different parts of the same farm, he may, notwithstanding any prohibition of movement contained in the principal Order, authorise such movement by an Occupation Licence, and the Inspector may insert in the Licence such conditions as he may consider necessary or desirable for the purpose of preventing the animals referred to in the Licence from coming into contact with any other animals.
- (2) If in respect of any animal the conditions of a Licence granted under this Article are not complied with, the owner of the animal and the person for the time being in charge thereof shall each, according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(ii) The swine shall be moved by the nearest available route without unnecessary delay, and during the movement shall, so far as is practicable, be kept separate from all swine not being moved with a licence

under this Order.

(iii) After completion of the movement the licence shall forthwith be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest policestation in the same district by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing such movement.

2. Swine may also be moved from the Sale mentioned in the Schedule hereto to premises situate in any Scheduled District for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Control of Movement) Order of 1920, subject to the provisions of the Order of the Minister declaring such district to be a Scheduled District. Swine so moved shall also be subject to the conditions set out in paragraphs (i) (ii) and (iii) of Article 1 of this Order.
