

PART V.

PROPOSED GENERAL MINIMUM PIECE-RATES FOR HOME-WORKERS.

A.—For Carding Safety Pins (Assorted Sizes) where pins of separate sizes are given out to Home-Workers in separate packets:—

(1) Where cards are dotted and pierced:—

(2) Where cards are neither dotted nor pierced the General Minimum Piece-Rates set out in (1) shall be increased by 20 per cent.

(3) Where cards are dotted only the General Minimum Piece-Rates set out in (1) shall be increased by 10 per cent.

B.—For Carding Snap Fasteners:—

(1) Where Back-Boards are supplied to the Home-Worker by the Employer 6d. per great gross.

(2) Where Back-Boards are not supplied to the Home-Worker For Black Work the foregoing rates for Carding Snap Fasteners shall be subject to ¼d. per great gross extra in each case. 9d. ,,

C.—(1) For Carding Hooks and Eyes:—

Sizes:	12 Hooks and Eyes per card:
00 and 0	3s. 6d. per gross cards.
1 to 8 (inclusive)	2s. 7½d. ,, ,,

(2) For Carding Hooks and Loops where articles to be carded are given out to the Home-Worker, separate sizes in separate packets, and Hooks separate from Eyes or Loops:—

Sizes:	12 Hooks and Loops per card:
00 and 0	4s. 2½d. per gross cards.
1 to 8 (inclusive)	3s. 1½d. ,, ,,

NOTE.—Cotton, needles, twine and wrappers must be provided by the Employer.

D.—For Bunching Safety Pins (Assorted Sizes):—

Per gross of Bunches of 50 Pins each 2s. 0d.

PART VI.

For the purpose of this Notice, the expression "Home-Worker" means a worker who works in his or her own home or in any other place not under the control or management of the employer.

PART VII.

The above proposed Minimum Rates of Wages apply, subject to the Provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to Workers in Great Britain of the classes specified in this Notice, in respect of all time during which they are employed in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Pin, Hook and Eye, and Snap Fastener) Order, 1919, as set out in Part V. of the Trade Board's Notice O. (11) dated 24th March, 1922.

The Trade Board will consider any OBJECTIONS to the above Proposals which may be lodged with them within two months from the 13th April, 1922. Such Objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary, The Pin, Hook and Eye and Snap Fastener Trade Board (Great Britain), 7-11, Old Bailey, London, E.C. 4.

It is desirable that the Objections should state precisely, and so far as possible with reasons, what is objected to.
