COTTON WASTE RECLAMATION TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

PROPOSAL TO VARY GENERAL MINIMUM TIME-RATES AND OVERTIME RATES FOR CERTAIN CLASSES OF MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established in Great Britain, under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, for the Branch of the Trade specified in the Trade Boards (Waste Materials Reclamation) Order, 1920, which is covered by the Regulations made by the Minister of Labour and dated 27th August, 1920, with respect to the Cotton Waste Branch of the Waste Materials Reclamation Trade, HEREBY GIVE NOTICE, as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that they PROPOSE TO VARY the General Minimum Time-Rates and Overtime-Rates for certain classes of Male and Female Workers as set out in the Schedule of the Notice C.W. (8) issued by the Trade Board and dated 31st March, 1922, the proposed Minimum Rates of Wages being as shown in the Schedule set out below.

The Minister of Labour has given his consent to the issue of this Notice.
