

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Great Britain) Order of 1922 (No. 22) shall be read and have effect as if the words "*except the parishes of Thorganby, Stainton-le-Vale, and Binbrook*" were inserted immediately after the words "*Market Rasen*," and the words "*except the parishes of Knaith, Gate Burton, Marton, Kezby, and Willingham*" after the word "*Gainsborough*" in the description of the Scheduled District No. 15 in the First Schedule thereto.

WARWICKSHIRE (TANWORTH DISTRICT) (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1922. (No. 3.)

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Declaration of Prohibited Area and Modification of Restrictions in Scheduled District.

1.—(1) The area described in the Schedule hereto is hereby declared to be a Prohibited Area for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Control of Movement) Order of 1920, hereinafter referred to as the "principal Order."

(2) Part III. of that Order is hereby applied to the Scheduled District described in the Warwickshire (Tanworth District) (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1922.

(3) The provisions of Article 2 of the Warwickshire (Tanworth District) (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1922 shall continue to apply to the Prohibited Area, and the provisions of Article 6 of the "principal Order" shall be read and have effect subject to this modification.

Commencement.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-fourth day of April, nineteen hundred and twenty-two.

Short Title.

3. This Order may be cited as the WARWICKSHIRE (TANWORTH DISTRICT) (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1922 (No. 3).

Prohibited Area.

An area comprising: In the administrative county of Warwick—

The parishes of Solihull, Tanworth, Nut-hurst, Beadesert, Bushwood, Lapworth, Packwood, Knowle, Baddesley Clinton, Balsall, Barston, and Elmdon, and such part of the parish of Hampton in Arden as lies to the west of the London and North-Western Railway line from Kenilworth to Birmingham, and

In the administrative county of Worcester—
The parish of Wythall.

The restrictions on movement of swine imposed by the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908, and the Kent and Surrey (Swine-Fever) Order of 1917, shall not apply to the movement of swine from the Sale mentioned in the Schedule hereto to any premises in Great Britain not being a Swine-Fever
