WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 12th day of April, 1922 (C.W. 3632/22), in the words following, viz.:-

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by Orders in Council bearing dates the 12th December, 1885, and the 13th May, 1901, we are empowered to place Officers of Your Majesty's Naval and Marine Forces who are, in our opinion, unfit for or unworthy of further employment, on the retired list irrespective of age and service, and to grant to such Officers such rates of retired pay or pension or such gratuity as we may think fit:

"And whereas we have considered the case of Officers of Your Majesty's Naval and Marine Forces who may be judged by us to be unfit for further employment by reason of incapacity or peculiarity of temper or other defect not amounting to misconduct and not caused by intemperate or irregular habits of life:

"And whereas we are of opinion that it is desirable in the interests of Your Majesty's Naval and Marine Services that we should be empowered to place such Officers on the Retired List, irrespective of age and service, and to grant such Officers retired pay or gratuity on retirement at rates appropriate to their service and rank on the Active List:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction our placing such Officers on the Retired List, irrespective of age and service at such rates of retired pay, pension, or gratuity as we may, with the consent of the Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury, determine.

Majesty's Treasury, determine. "The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 12th day of April, 1922 (C.W. 2353/22), in the words following, viz.:-

viz.:---"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

Council: "And whereas by Clauses V, VI, XV and XVI of Section IX of the fifth Schedule to Your Order in Council bearing date the 22nd day of January, 1920, Your Majesty was graciously pleased to sanction, *inter alia*, and with effect from the 1st day of April, 1919, the introduction of fresh scales of retired pay to certain Officers holding the ranks of Lieutenant or Lieutenant Commander in the Royal Navy and of Lieutenant or Captain in the Royal Marines who might be invalided before attaining the age of 40 years:

"And whereas the actual rates of retired pay within these scales are determined according to the number of years of full pay service rendered in the ranks specified, no account being taken of any time during which they may have been unemployed:

"And whereas we are of opinion that time on unemployed pay or half pay in the said ranks should be allowed to count for increase of retired pay under the aforesaid scales in the manner provided in clause 8 of Section V and clause 4 of Section VII of the Orders in Council dated the 22nd February, 1870, as regards half pay time:

pay time: "We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to approve with effect from the 1st day of April, 1919, the proposal that all time on unemployed pay or half pay in the said ranks shall count as one-third of full service in determining the rates of retired pay to be awarded to these Officers, except as may be otherwise specially provided by Order in Council in the cases of Officers permitted to receive half pay while holding appointments not remunerated out of monies provided by Parliament for Naval services. W HEREAS on the 24th day of April, 1893, a Convention with respect to the protection to be given by way of copyright to the authors of literary and artistic works was concluded between Her late Majesty Queen Victoria and His late Majesty the Emperor of Austria, King of Bohemia and Apostolic King of Hungary, and the ratifications of the said Convention were exchanged on the 14th day of April, 1894, between Her late Majesty Queen Victoria and His late Majesty the Emperor:

And whereas by Orders in Council dated the 30th day of April, 1894, the 2nd day of February, 1895, and the 11th day of May, 1895, and made under the authority of the International Copyright Acts, 1844 to 1886, effect was given to the said Convention throughout His Majesty's Dominions except in the Dominion of Canada, the Cape, New South Wales and Tasmania:

And whereas by the Copyright Act, 1911, the said International Copyright Acts, 1844 to 1886, were repealed as from the date of the commencement of the said Copyright Act, 1911, in the parts of His Majesty's Dominions to which the said Act extends:

And whereas by the Order in Council dated the 24th day of June, 1912, and made under the authority of the Copyright Act, 1911, the Orders in Council dated the 30th day of April, 1894, the 2nd day of February, 1895, and the 11th day of May, 1895, were revoked as from the date of the commencement of the said Copyright Act, 1911, so far as regards the parts of His Majesty's Dominions to which the said Order applied:

And whereas by reason of the late war between the United Kingdom and Austria-Hungary the said Convention and the said Order in Council dated the 24th day of June, 1912, ceased to have effect and the said Order in Council dated the 24th day of June, 1912, was accordingly revoked as from the 12th day of August, 1914, by Order in Council dated the 21st day of December, 1920:

21st day of December, 1920: And whereas by the Trading with the Enemy (Copyright) Act, 1916, it was provided that copyright in all works first published or made in an enemy country during the present war therein referred to, the copyright wherein would had a state of war not existed have vested in any person as the owner thereof by virtue of the application to an enemy country of any Order in Council made under the Copyright Act, 1911, should be deemed to vest or to have vested in the Public Trustee in his capacity as Custodian under the Trading with the Enemy Amendment Act, 1914:

And whereas by Article 241 of the Treaty of Peace with Hungary it is provided that rights of literary and artistic property, as such property is defined in the International Convention referred to therein, shall be re-established or restored in the territories of the High Contracting Parties in favour as the case may be of the persons who were respectively entitled to the benefit of them at the moment when the state of war commenced or their legal representatives, and that rights which, except for the war, would have been acquired during the war in consequence of the publication of a literary or artistic work shall be recognised and established in favour of those persons who would have been entitled thereto, subject nevertheless to the right (thereby reserved) to impose limitations, conditions or restrictions as therein mentioned on rights of literary or artistic property acquired before, during ca after the war as therein referred to by Hungarian nationals (as defined in the said Treaty of Peace):

And whereas by the Treaty of Peace (Hungary) Order, 1921, and the Order of the Board of Trade dated the 16th day of August, 1921, effect has been given to the provisions of the Treaty of Peace mentioned in the preceding paragraph of this Order:

And whereas His Majesty, by virtue of the authority conferred on Him by the Copyright Act, 1911, and having regard to the provisions of the revised Berne Copyright Convention, was pleased to make an Order in Council', dated the 24th day of June, 1912 (hereinafter called the Principal Order), extending the protection of the said Act to certain classes of works to which protection is guaranteed by the said Convention:

And whereas Hungary has adhered to the said Convention:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, and by virtue of the authority conferred upon him by the Copyright Act, 1911, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:---

(1) The Principal Order shall extend to Hungary as if that country were amongst the foreign countries of the Copyright Union therein named, subject to the following modifications:—

(a) The provisions of Article 2, proviso (iii) (a), shall apply as if Hungary were included amongst the foreign countries named in those provisions.

(b) In the application of the provisions of Article 3 of the Principal Order to works of which the country of origin is Hungary the date of this Order shall be substituted for the commencement of the Act and for the commencement of the Principal Order.

(c) In the application to such works of Sections 1 (2) (d) and 19 of the Copyright Act, 1911, the date of this Order shall be substituted for the commencement of the Act in Sections 19 (7) and 19 (8) wherever that expression occurs, and the 14th day of February, 1922, for the passing of the Act.

(d) In the application to such works of Section 24 of the Copyright Act, 1911, the date of this Order shall be substituted for the commencement of the Act wherever that expression occurs in subsection 1 (a) and for the 26th July, 1910, in subsection 1 (b).

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(e) In the case of works to which the Treaty of Peace (Hungary) Order, 1921, and the Order of the Board of Trade, dated the 16th day of August, 1921, relate, nothing in this Order shall be construed as removing any limitations, conditions or restrictions imposed upon such works by the said Orders.

(2) This Order may be cited as the Berne Copyright Convention (Principal Order Amendment) (Hungary) Order, 1922.

And whereas by the said Act it is amongst other things provided that where His Majesty is satisfied that reciprocal provisions have been made by the Legislature of any part of His Majesty's Dominions outside the United Kingdom for the enforcement within that part of maintenance orders made by Courts within England and Ireland, His Majesty may by Order in Council extend the said Act to that part, and thereupon that part shall become a part of His Majesty's Dominions to which the said Act extends:

And whereas His Majesty is satisfied that the Legislatures of the parts of His Majesty's Dominions outside the United Kingdom hereinafter mentioned have made reciprocal provisions for the enforcement within those parts of maintenance orders made by Courts within England and Ireland:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers by the above recited Act in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

The Maintenance Orders (Facilities for Enforcement) Act, 1920, shall apply to the parts of His Majesty's Dominions outside the United Kingdom hereunder mentioned :---

Tasmania.

3. This Order shall come into operation forthwith.

THEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Act, 1919, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 2nd day of March, 1922, in the words and figures following, that

England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Act, 1919, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Great Whelnetham with part of the neighbouring Benefice (being an United Benefice) of Rushbrooke with Little Whelnetham and for effecting the union of the residue of the said Benefice of Rushbrooke with Little Whelnetham with the contiguous Benefice (being a Rectory) of Bradfield Saint George all of which Benefices are situate in the County of Suffolk and in the Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Henry Bernard, late Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ips-wich, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Act, 1919, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said Benefice of Great Whelnetham with a portion of the said United Benefice of Rushbrooke with Little Whelnetham and further to inquire into and report upon the union of the said Benefice of Bradfield Saint George with the remaining portion of the said United Benefice of Rushbrooke with Little Whelnetham duly made their Report to the Right Reverend Albert, now Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich and therein recommended the severance from the

said United Benefice of Rushbrooke with Little Whelnetham of the Benefice of Rushbrooke and the union of the Benefice of Rushbrooke so severed with the contiguous Benefice of Bradfield Saint George, and therein further recommended the union of the remaining portion of the said United Benefice of Rushbrooke with Little Whelnetham with the neighbouring Benefice of Great Whelnetham and the terms. for effecting the said two unions, and the said Albert, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and lpswich, signified in writing his approval of the said Report :

And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for effecting the two unions of Benefices so recommended as aforesaid which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report but with the assent of the said Albert, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, embodies certain modifications thereof:

"And whereas all the said Benefices of Great Whelnetham, Rushbrooke with Little Whelnethan, and Bradfield Saint George are now full, the Reverend Thomas Alan Johnson Ridpath being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Great Whelnetham the Reverend Robert Gibson being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Rushbrooke with Little Whelnetham and the Reverend Edward George Boultbee Inge being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Bradfield Saint George:

And whereas the said Thomas Alan Johnson Ridpath if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Great Whelnetham has consented to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice of Whelnetham and the said Edward George Boultbee Inge if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Bradfield Saint George has consented to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice of Bradfield Saint George with Rushbrooke if and when the unions which are hereinafter recommended and proposed shall take effect:

"And whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to each of the said Benefices of Rushbrooke with Little Whelnetham and Bradfield Saint George now belongs to the same Patron:

Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Albert, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich (in testimony whereof he has hereunto set his hand), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows. that is to say:

"1. That a portion of the said United Benefice of Rushbrooke with Little Wheinetham that is to say the Benefice of Rushbrooke shall be severed from the remaining portion of the United Benefice of Rushbrooke with Little Whelnetham and that the said United Benefice of Rushbrooke with Little Whelnetham after the severance of such portion as aforesaid and the said Benefice of Great Whelnetham shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Whelnetham ' but the Parishes of the said Benefices of Great Whelnetham and Little Whelnetham shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That the severed portion of the said United Benefice of Rushbrooke with Little Whelnetham and the said Benefice of Bradfield Saint George shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls

under the style of 'The United Benefice or Bradfield Saint George with Rushbrooke ' but the Parishes of the said Benefices of Bradfield Saint George and Rushbrooke shall continue distinct in all respects.

"3. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the said Benefice of Rushbrooke with Little Whelnetham shall be vacant the unions shall forthwith take effect, and the said Thomas Alan Johnson Ridpath if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Great Whelnetham shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice of Whelnetham, and the said Edward George Boultbee Inge if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Bradfield Saint George shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice of Bradfield Saint George with Rushbrooke and if the said Benefice of Rushbrooke with Little Whelnetham be not then vacant the unions shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Rushbrooke with Little Whelnetham and the said Thomas Alan Johnson Ridpath if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Great Whelnetham or otherwise his successor Incumbent of the said Benefice of Great Whelnetham shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice of Great and Little Whelnetham, and the said Edward George Boultbee Inge if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Bradfield Saint George or otherwise his successor Incumbent of the said Benefice of Bradfield Saint George shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice of Bradfield Saint George with Rushbrooke.

"4. That upon the said unions taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Little Whelnetham shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Whelnetham and the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Bradfield Saint George shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Bradfield Saint George with Rushbrooke.

"5. That after the said unions have taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice of Whelnetham from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, that in each series of three successive turns of presentation or nomination to the United Benefice of Whelnetham for ever thereafter the Patron of the said Benefice of Rushbrooke with Little Whelnetham shall have the first turn and the Patron of the said Benefice of Great Whelnetham shall have the second and third turns. ,

"6. That upon the said unions taking effect the endowments of the said Benefice of Rushbrooke with Little Whelnetham shall be divided as follows, that is to say, there shall be transferred and annexed to the United Benefice of Bradfield Saint George with Rushbrooke the whole of the Tithe Rentcharges commuted at Two hundred and sixty pounds and one shiling at present payable to the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Rushbrooke with Little Whelnetham and arising within the Parish of Rushbrooke, and all the remaining endowments of the said Benefice of Rushbrooke with Little Whelnetham shall be transferred and annexed to the United Benefice of Whelnetham. "Provided always that nothing herein con-

tained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been published locally in the manner prescribed in the Statutory Rules made under the said Act and also transmitted in the manner so prescribed to the Patrons affected together with a Notice in each case requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules.

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme has proceeded with an appeal to His Majesty in Council against the Scheme or any part thereof within the period of one month after the date of the said public Notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Act:

And whereas none of the Benefices affected by the said Scheme is situate in a City or Municipal Borough:

And whereas the saïd Scheme has been pproved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, chapter 104, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme, bearing date the 6th day of April, 1922, in the words and figures following, that is to say :----

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, chapter 104, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for constituting a separate District for spiritual purposes to be taken partly out of the Parish of Brighton, and partly out of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint Luke, Brighton, both in the County of Sussex and in the Diocese of Chichester:

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said Parish of Brighton and the said New Parish of Saint Luke, Brighton, are Cures wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said Parish of Brighton and of the said New Parish of Saint Luke, Brighton, which are hereinafter mentioned and described should be constituted a separate District in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate District any consecrated Church or Chapel in use for the purposes of Divine Worship:

"And whereas we have agreed to make and pay out of the Common Fund created by the firstly herein mentioned Act a grant of £200 per annum to the Minister of the said proposed separate District so soon as a Minister shall have been duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein mentioned Act and to his successors:

"And whereas the said grant of the said yearly sum of £200 will after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme be made and secured by an Instrument to be executed by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under our Common Seal in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, chapter 111:

111: "Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Winfrid Oldfield, Bishop of Chichester (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said Parish of Brighton and of the said New Parish of Saint Luke, Brighton, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the Map or Plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme as aforesaid become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint Wilfrid, Brighton.'

#### **DEFINITION OF "WEEK."**

SECTION I.

(a) In the case of classes of whole-time workers employed by the week or longer period whose customary working week consists of a number of hours less than 48 but not less than 44, "a week" means a week of the number of hours customarily worked by the class in question; (b) In all other cases "a week" means a week of 48 hours.

SECTION II.

For the purpose of calculating the hourly rate applicable in respect of each hour of employment the rates set out in Part II of this Schedule must be divided :---

(a) In the case of the workers referred to in Section I (a) of this Part by the number of hours per week customarily worked by the class in question;

(b) In all other cases by 48.

SECTION III.-

Payment at not less than the hourly rate calculated as described in Section II of this Part must be made for all hours of employment, whether in excess of the customary working week or not. except for those hours in respect of which a higher rate is payable under the overtime provisions specified in Part IV below.

#### PART IV

# PROPOSED VARIATION OF OVERTIME RATES FOR CERTAIN CLASSES OF MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS.

Overtime Rates calculated on the proposed Minimum Rates set out in Parts I and II of this Schedule in the manner specified in Part VII of the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice F.H. (6) dated 21st October, 1921.

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# THE ROADS ACT, 1920

#### COUNTY OF ESSEX.

Whereas by sub-section (4) of Section 7 of the Roads Act, 1920, it is enacted that the Minister of Transport may, by order on the application of any county council (as defined in Section 17 of the Act), after holding a public inquiry, prohibit or restrict, subject to such exceptions or conditions as to occasional user or otherwise as may be specified in the Order, the driving of mechanically propelled vehicles of any specified class on any specified highway within the area of the council in any case in which it appears to him, as the result of the inquiry, to be proved that a vehicle of that class cannot be used on that highway without endangering the safety of the vehicle or the persons therein or of other traffic using the highway, or that the highway is unsuitable for use by a vehicle of that class:

And whereas the County Council of Essex have made application to the Minister of Transport for an Order to be made in pursuance of the said sub-section prohibiting or restricting the driving of Heavy Motor Cars and Locomotives on the highways specified in the Schedule hereto:

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 25TH APRIL 1922.)

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:

1. The restrictions on movement of swine imposed by the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908, and the Suffolk (Swine-Fever) Order of 1914, shall not apply to the movement of swine from the sale mentioned in the Schedule hereto to any premises in Great Britain not being a Swine-Fever Infected Place, and not being in any Scheduled District for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Control of Movement) Order of 1920, if the swine are accompanied by a licence in

the Form F set forth in the First Schedule to the said Order of 1908, granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the borough of Bury St. Edmunds, and the following conditions, which shall be specified in the licence, are complied with : --

(i) The swine shall be moved to the place of destination specified in the licence and not elsewhere, and shall be there detained and kept separate from all other swine for twenty-eight days unless they are slaughtered on such premises before the expiration of that period, or are moved under and in accordance with the conditions of a licence in the Form C set forth in the said First Schedule to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse in the same Scheduled Area.

(ii) The swine shall be moved by the nearest available route without unnecessary delay, and during the movement shall, so far as is practicable, be kept separate from all swine not being moved with a licence under this Order.

(iii) After completion of the movement the licence shall forthwith be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest police-station in the same district by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing such movement.

2. Swine may also be moved from the Sale mentioned in the Schedule hereto to premises situate in any Scheduled District for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Control of Movement) Order of 1920, subject to the provisions of the Order of the Minister declaring such district to be a Scheduled District. Swine so moved shall also be subject to the conditions set out in paragraphs (i) (ii) and (iii) of Article 1 of this Order.

3. A copy of a licence issued under Article 1 of this Order shall be sent by the Inspector granting the same to the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination specified in the licence is situate.

4. A licence under this Order shall for the purposes of the Orders mentioned in Article 1 of this Order be treated as a licence under those Orders.
