

Orsett:—

Road from the cross roads at Baker Street to the Stifford-Grays road east of Stifford Church.

Stifford Long Lane from Neville's Farm to Chalkpit Farm. (Part of this road is in the Urban District of Grays.)

Rochford:—

Road from Hadleigh to Thundersley via Dawes Heath.

The Battlesbridge-Ashingdon road from the road junction near Hanover Farm to the South Farnbridge-Rochford road near Ashingdon School.

Greensward Lane from the Battlesbridge-Ashingdon road near New Hall to the Rayleigh-Rochford road near Hockley.

Road running northwards from the Eastwood-Leigh road near "Picketts" to the Eastwood-Rayleigh road.

The two roads running from the road junction about $\frac{3}{4}$ mile west of Eastwood Church to the Rayleigh-Prittlewell road.

The Ashingdon-Canewdon road from the South Farnbridge-Rochford road near Ashingdon School to Canewdon.

Scott's Hall Road from the Ashingdon-Canewdon road to the road junction about 600 yards south of Scott's Hall.

Rawreth Lane from the Chelmsford-Rayleigh road at Rawreth to the Hullbridge-Rayleigh road.

Road from Barling via Burtons and Stone Bridge to the Rose Inn at the District Boundary near Southchurch.

Road from Sutton Schools via Shopland and Stone Bridge to the Barling-Great Wakering road.

Road from Ballards Gore on the Great Starnbridge-Creeksea road via South Hall to Eastend, including the branch to Churchend, Paglesham.

Rectory Road from the Hawkwell-Rochford road to the South Farnbridge-Rochford road near Golden Cross.

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF
AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 25TH APRIL 1922.)

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

1. The restrictions on movement of swine imposed by the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908, and the Suffolk (Swine-Fever) Order of 1914, shall not apply to the movement of swine from the sale mentioned in the Schedule hereto to any premises in Great Britain not being a Swine-Fever Infected Place, and not being in any Scheduled District for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Control of Movement) Order of 1920, if the swine are accompanied by a licence in

the Form F set forth in the First Schedule to the said Order of 1908, granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the borough of Bury St. Edmunds, and the following conditions, which shall be specified in the licence, are complied with:—

(i) The swine shall be moved to the place of destination specified in the licence and not elsewhere, and shall be there detained and kept separate from all other swine for twenty-eight days unless they are slaughtered on such premises before the expiration of that period, or are moved under and in accordance with the conditions of a licence in the Form G set forth in the said First Schedule to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse in the same Scheduled Area.

(ii) The swine shall be moved by the nearest available route without unnecessary delay, and during the movement shall, so far as is practicable, be kept separate from all swine not being moved with a licence under this Order.

(iii) After completion of the movement the licence shall forthwith be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest police-station in the same district by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing such movement.

2. Swine may also be moved from the sale mentioned in the Schedule hereto to premises situate in any Scheduled District for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Control of Movement) Order of 1920, subject to the provisions of the Order of the Minister declaring such district to be a Scheduled District. Swine so moved shall also be subject to the conditions set out in paragraphs (i) (ii) and (iii) of Article 1 of this Order.

3. A copy of a licence issued under Article 1 of this Order shall be sent by the Inspector granting the same to the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination specified in the licence is situate.

4. A licence under this Order shall for the purposes of the Orders mentioned in Article 1 of this Order be treated as a licence under those Orders.
