FIRST SCHEDULE.

Scheduled District.

A district comprising; In the administrative county of Warwick—

The parishes of Solihull, Tanworth, Nut-hurst, Beaudesert, Bushwood, Lapworth, Packwood, Knowle, Baddesley Clinton, Balsall, Barston, and Elmdon, and such part of the parish of Hampton in Arden as lies to the west of the London and North-Western Railway line from Kenilworth to Birmingham, and

In the administrative county of Worcester—
The parish of Wythall.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

Prohibited Area.

An Area, in the administrative county of Warwick comprising such portions of the parishes of Solihull and Tanworth as lie within the following boundary, namely—

Commencing at Shirley Church on the main Birmingham-Stratford-on-Avon road, thence in a south-westerly direction along Church Lane, via Bill's Wood to the Dingle, thence in south-easterly and southerly directions along the Lane leading to Tythe Barn Lane to the point where it crosses the Stratford-on-Avon Canal, thence in a south-easterly direction along that canal to the point where it reaches the boundary between part of Dickens Heath Farm and Jerrings Hall Farm, thence in a generally easterly direction along the southern boundary of that part of Dickens Heath Farm, and of Light Hall Farm, until the boundary meets the Birmingham-Stratford-on-Avon main road near its junction with Dog Kennel Lane, thence in a north-westerly direction along the said main road to the point of commencement.

ANIMALS (LANDING FROM IRELAND) ORDER OF 1922 (No. 2).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

1. Article 4 of the Animals (Landing from Ireland) Order of 1922 is hereby revoked and the following Article substituted therefor:—

“4. No licence shall be granted under this Order for the movement of animals to premises other than a slaughterhouse from the Irish Animals Landing Place at Manchester.”

2. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-ninth day of April, nineteen hundred and twenty-two.

Short Title.

3. This Order may be cited as the ANIMALS (LANDING FROM IRELAND) ORDER OF 1922 (No. 2).

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 28TH APRIL 1922.)

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

1. The restrictions on movement of swine imposed by the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908, and the Suffolk (Swine Fever) Order of 1914, shall not apply to the movement of swine from the Sale mentioned in the Schedule hereto to any premises in Great Britain not being a Swine-Fever Infected Place, and not being in any Scheduled District for the purposes of the Foot-and-
