The following are the Regulations to be observed:—

1. Gentlemen who have been presented and who wish to attend the Levée should make a written application, as detailed below.

2. Peers, Bishops, His Majesty's Lieutenants of Counties, Deputy Lieutenants of

Counties, Members of Parliament, Officials connected with the Houses of Parliament, Clergy of all Denominations, and all gentlemen other than those mentioned hereafter, should communicate with the Comptroller, Ceremonial Department, St. James's Palace. No applications can be received from gentlemen in the foregoing categories wishing to be presented. Their names must be forwarded by the gentleman making the presentation.

3. All Officers, whether on the active or retired lists of the Royal Navy and the Royal Marines, will communicate with and obtain their cards, whether for attendance or presentation, from the Private Secretary to the First Lord of the Admiralty.

4. All Officers, whether on the active or retired lists of the Army, except Officers of the Household Cavalry and the Brigade of Guards, and those on the Indian and Colonial Establishments, will communicate with and obtain their cards, whether for attendance or presentation, from the Secretary, War Office.

Officers of the Household Cavalry and the Brigade of Guards will communicate, through their Regimental Headquarters, with the Comptroller, Ceremonial Department, St. James's Palace, to obtain their cards for attendance or presentation.

5. All Officers of the Royal Air Force, whether on the active or retired lists, will

communicate with and obtain their cards, for attendance or presentation, through the usual channels.

6. All Officers of the Indian Civil Service and of the Indian Army, whether on the active or retired lists, will communicate with and obtain their cards, for attendance or for presentation, from the Private Secretary to the Secretary of State at the India Office, Whitehall.

7. All Officers of the Colonial Service and Colonial Forces, whether on the active or retired lists, will communicate with and obtain their cards, whether for attendance or presentation, from the Colonial Office, Whitehall, with the exception of Officers of the local Forces of the self-governing Dominions, who will apply to the Secretary, War Office, for their cards for attendance or presentation, supporting their applications in all cases by a credential from the Governor-General, Governor, Officer commanding the local Forces, or the representative in London of the Dominion concerned.

8. Lord Mayors and Mayors, High Sheriffs, Sheriffs, Recorders, Chairmen of Quarter Sessions, Metropolitan Police Magistrates and other Stipendiary Magistrates, and all gentlemen connected with the Home Office, will make their applications, whether for attendance or for presentation, through the Private Secretary to the Secretary of State for the Home Department.

9. Chairmen of County Councils, and all gentlemen connected with the Ministry of Health, will similarly make their applications through the Private Secretary to the Minister of Health.

10. Judges, Law Officers, King's Counsel, and all Legal Officials holding appointments under the Crown, other than those already mentioned, will similarly make their applications through the Private Secretary to the Lord Chancellor.

11. All gentlemen connected with the Foreign Office or any other Government Department will adopt the same procedure, and will communicate with and obtain their cards for attendance or presentation from the Department under which they serve.

12. The names both for attendance and presentation must be received at the various Offices above indicated not later than ten days prior to the date of the Levée.

PAPER BOX TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

PROPOSAL TO VARY MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS FOR PERIODS DEPENDENT UPON THE COST OF LIVING INDEX FIGURE AND TO CANCEL A PIECE-WORK BASIS TIME-RATE IN ITS APPLICATION TO CERTAIN CLASSES OF MALE WORKERS.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established under that Act for that branch of the Box Trade in Great Britain which is engaged in the making of boxes or parts thereof made wholly or partially of paper, cardboard, chip or similar material, hereby give notice, as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that they propose to vary (the Minister of Labour having given his consent to such notice being given) the General Minimum Time-Rates, Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates and Overtime Rates for Male and Female Workers at present fixed and set out in their Notices B. (2) and B. (8), dated 13th November, 1919, and 3rd November, 1921, respectively, and to cancel the Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate at present fixed and set out in their Notice B. (2) in its application to certain classes of Male Workers, the proposed rates to be operative for periods dependent upon the Cost of Living Index Figure.
