PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by section sixteen of the Unemployment Insurance Act, 1922 (hereinafter referred to as the Act of 1922), it is enacted that provision may be made by Order in Council under the Irish Free State (Agreement) Act, 1922, for applying the Act of 1922, with or without modifications, to Ireland, exclusive of Northern Ireland, but that, except in so far as it is so applied, that Act shall not apply to Ireland:

And whereas by the Provisional Government (Transfer of Functions) Order, 1922, made in pursuance of the Irish Free State (Agreement) Act, 1922, the functions in connection with the administration of public services, including unemployment insurance, in Ireland, exclusive of Northern Ireland, have been transferred to departments and officers of the Provisional Government established in pursuance of Article 17 of certain Articles of Agreement for a Treaty between Great Britain and Ireland dated the sixth day of December, nineteen hundred and twenty-one, which Government is hereinafter referred to as the Provisional Government:

And whereas the Provisional Government is desirous that the Act of 1922 should apply to Ireland, exclusive of Northern Ireland, in manner and subject to the modifications hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The Act of 1922 shall apply, and as from the fourth day of May, nineteen hundred and twenty-two, shall be deemed to have applied, to Ireland, exclusive of Northern Ireland, subject to the modifications hereinafter mentioned:

Provided that if at any time the Provisional Government, by notice in the Official Gazette, declare that the Act of 1922 shall no longer so apply, it shall cease to apply to Ireland, exclusive of Northern Ireland, as from such date, not being less than fourteen days after the publication of the notice, as may be specified in the notice.

2. In its application to Ireland, exclusive of Northern Ireland, the Act of 1922 shall be subject to the modifications set out in Article 13 of the Provisional Government (Transfer of Functions) Order, 1922, and, in addition thereto, to the following modifications:—

(a) References to the unemployment fund and the unemployed workers' dependants'

fund shall be construed as references to the unemployment fund of the Provisional Government and the unemployed workers' dependants' fund of the Provisional Government.

(b) The reference to the contribution to be made out of moneys provided by Parliament shall, until the expiration of one month after the constitution of the Provisional Parliament, be construed as a reference to the contribution to be made out of the Exchequer of the Provisional Government.

(c) Subsection (1) of section three of the Act of 1922 shall have effect as if the third day of May were substituted for the fifth day of April.

(d) Subsection (2) of section three of the Act of 1922 shall have effect as if the fourth day of May were substituted for the sixth day of April.

(e) So much of subsection (2) of section four of the Act of 1922 as provides that if at any time before the seventeenth day of April, nineteen hundred and twenty-two, the amount of benefit received by any person since the commencement of the second special period amounts in the aggregate to twenty-two weeks he shall not be qualified for receiving any further benefit until the said seventeenth day of April shall not apply.

(f) In section five of the Act of 1922 the reference to the date of the passing of that Act shall be construed as a reference to the date of the making of this Order.

(g) Section seven of the Act of 1922 shall not apply, but the Ministry of Finance of the Provisional Government may advance any sums required for discharging the liability of the unemployment fund of the Provisional Government under the Unemployment Insurance Acts, 1920 to 1922, to such an amount and at such rate of interest (if any) as may be fixed by the Ministry of Finance, and for the purpose of providing the sums to be so advanced the Ministry may borrow money in such manner as the Ministry may think proper, and any sums so advanced, together with the interest (if any) thereon, shall be charged on and payable out of the unemployment fund of the Provisional Government.

(h) Subsection (1) of section sixteen of the Act of 1922 shall have effect as if after the words "person formerly engaged in war service" the word "includes" were substituted for the word "means" and as if for the definition of "local employment committee" the following definition were substituted:—

"The expression 'local employment committee' means any local committee to which questions may be referred under subsection (5) of section thirteen of the principal Act, or a court of referees."

(i) Subsection (8) of section sixteen of the Act of 1922 shall have effect as if the fourth day of May were substituted for the sixth day of April.

3. This Order may be cited as the Provisional Government (Unemployment Insurance) Order, 1922.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 6th day of April, 1922, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure (hereinafter called 'the said Benefice') of Lower Beeding, in the County of Sussex and in the Diocese of Chichester:

"Whereas by a Local Act of the 1st and 2nd years of Her said late Majesty the District of Lower Beeding was constituted a Parish for all Ecclesiastical purposes by the name of Lower Beeding Parish and such Parish was created a Benefice Representative by the name of the Chapelry of Lower Beeding:

"And whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Lower Beeding is vested for an estate in fee simple in possession free from incumbrances in Henry Stephen Hope, of Winchester House, Old Broad Street, in the City of London, Chartered Accountant, and John Charles Jesson, of Number 13, South Parade, Bedford Park, Chiswick, in the County of Middlesex, Director of Public Companies, as the Personal Representatives of William Egerton Hubbard, late of Number 17, Saint Helens Place, in the City of London, and Number 5, South Park, Sevenoaks, in the County of Kent, Esquire, who died on the 10th day of January, 1918, and whose Will with one Codicil was proved in the principal Probate Registry of the High Court of Justice by the said Henry Stephen Hope and John Charles Jesson on the 12th day of March, 1918:

"And whereas the said Henry Stephen Hope and John Charles Jesson are the persons entitled to present or nominate to the said Benefice in case the same were now vacant:

"And whereas the said Henry Stephen Hope and John Charles Jesson, pursuant to a wish expressed by the said William Egerton Hubbard during his lifetime, are desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Lower Beeding should be transferred to and

be vested in the Right Reverend Winfrid Oldfield, now Bishop of Chichester, and his successors in the same Bishopric:

"And whereas the said Winfrid Oldfield, Bishop of Chichester, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is made necessary, he, the said Winfrid Oldfield, Bishop of Chichester, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Lower Beeding which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the Parish or District in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the said Parish of Lower Beeding:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Henry Stephen Hope and John Charles Jesson, being the persons whose consent as Patrons is required by the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts and of the Act of the 1st and 2nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 106 (in testimony whereof they have signed and sealed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said Winfrid Oldfield, Bishop of Chichester (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Lower Beeding shall be transferred to the said Winfrid Oldfield, Bishop of Chichester, and his successors in the same Bishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Winfrid Oldfield, Bishop of Chichester, and his successors in the said Bishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Chichester.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 16th and 17th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 50, and of the Act of the 23rd and 24th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 124, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 6th day of April, 1922, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 16th and 17th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 50, and of the Act of the 23rd and 24th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 124, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting an exchange of the Patronage of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Saint Matthew, Southampton, situate in the County of Southampton and in the Diocese of Winchester, for the Patronage of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of the Holy Trinity, Ventnor, situate in the Isle of Wight and in the said Diocese of Winchester:

"Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Saint Matthew, Southampton, is vested in the Right Reverend Edward Stuart, Bishop of Winchester, in right of his See:

"And whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of the Holy Trinity, Ventnor, is vested in the persons commonly known as the Church Patronage Trustees (hereinafter called 'the said Church Patronage Trustees'), that is to say, John Francis William Deacon, of Number 20, Birchin Lane, in the City of London, Banker, the Reverend Ernest Newton Sharpe, of the Vicarage, Paddington, in the County of Middlesex, Clerk in Holy Orders and a Prebendary of the Cathedral Church of Saint Paul in London, the Reverend Henry Lawe Corry Vully de Candole, of Number 6, Little Cloisters, in the City of Westminster, Clerk in Holy Orders and a Canon of the Collegiate Church of Saint Peter in Westminster, the Reverend Edward Grose Hodge, of the Rectory, Birmingham, Clerk in Holy Orders and an Honorary Canon of the Cathedral Church of Birmingham, and Edward Ranulph Kenyon, a Major General in Your Majesty's Army, their heirs and assigns, upon the trusts and subject to the powers, provisos and declarations comprised in and forming the 9th Schedule to an Indenture dated the 21st day of December, 1871, and expressed to be made between Edmund Hollond, William Long and James Morgan Strachan, of the first part, The Honourable and Right Reverend John Thomas, Lord Bishop of Norwich, and the said Edmund Hollond, William Long and James Morgan Strachan of the second part, the said Bishop of Norwich, Edmund Hollond, William Long and James Morgan Strachan and the Reverend Charles Kemble of the third part, the said James Morgan Strachan, of the fourth part, the said Bishop of Norwich, of the fifth part, the said Charles Kemble, of the sixth part, Charles James Bevan, of the seventh part, and the said Bishop of Norwich, Edmund Hollond,

Charles Kemble, William Long, and Charles James Bevan, of the eighth part, which Indenture was enrolled in the High Court of Chancery on the 6th day of January, 1872:

"And whereas the said Edward Stuart, now Bishop of Winchester, and the said Church Patronage Trustees have respectively signified to us their desire that the Patronage of the said two Benefices of Saint Matthew, Southampton, and the Holy Trinity, Ventnor, may be rearranged by way of exchange in the manner which is hereinafter recommended and proposed:

"And whereas we have made due inquiry and calculation as to the circumstances and relative value of the said two Benefices and of the Patronage thereof respectively and we do hereby certify to Your Majesty in Council that the circumstances and present values of the said two Benefices are as set forth in the Schedule hereunto annexed:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Edward Stuart, Bishop of Winchester, acting as such Bishop (in testimony whereof to this Scheme he has set his hand and affixed his Episcopal Seal) and with the consent of the said Church Patronage Trustees, that is to say, the said John Francis William Deacon, Ernest Newton Sharpe, Henry Lawe Corry Vully de Candole, Edward Grose Hodge, and Edward Ranulph Kenyon (in testimony whereof to this Scheme they have respectively set their hands and seals) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the

whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Saint Matthew, Southampton, and the Church thereof shall be assigned and transferred from the said Edward Stuart, Bishop of Winchester, and from his successors in the same Bishopric and shall become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time and at all times be exercised by the said Church Patronage Trustees, their heirs and assigns, upon the same trusts and subject to the same powers, provisos and declarations as are comprised in and form the 9th Schedule of the said Indenture dated the 21st day of December, 1871, and as by the operation of the said Indenture affect and relate to the said Benefice of the Holy Trinity, Ventnor, and that in exchange for the same the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of the Holy Trinity, Ventnor, and the Church thereof shall be assigned and transferred from the said Church Patronage Trustees, their heirs and assigns, freed and discharged from all and every the trusts powers provisos and declarations comprised in and forming the said 9th Schedule of the said Indenture of the 21st day of December, 1871, and shall so freed and discharged become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time and at all times be exercised by the said Edward Stuart, Bishop of Winchester, and his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of either of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Minister of Health, after giving to the Incumbent and the Churchwardens of the Parish of Machynlleth, in the County of Montgomery, 10 days' previous Notice of his intention in that behalf, did, under the provisions of the Burial Act, 1853, as amended by subsequent enactments, make a Representation to His Majesty in Council that, for the protection of the public health, the opening of any new Burial Ground in the Civil Parish of Machynlleth, in the said County of Montgomery, save with the previous approval of the Minister of Health, should be prohibited, and that burials should be discontinued therein, as hereinafter directed:

And whereas by an Order in Council of the 15th March, 1922, Notice of such Representation was given, and it was ordered that the same should be taken into consideration by the Privy Council on the 22nd April, 1922, and such Order has been published in the London Gazette and copies thereof have been affixed as required by the said Act:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, as it is hereby ordered, that no new Burial Ground shall be opened in the said Civil Parish of Machynlleth, save with the previous approval of the Minister of Health, and that burials shall be discontinued therein as follows, viz.:—

**MACHYNLLETH.**—Forthwith and entirely in the Parish Church of Machynlleth and in the Churchyard attached thereto.

Provided that—

(a) In any walled grave now existing in the said Churchyard, burial may be allowed subject to the condition that every coffin buried in such grave be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

(b) In any earthen grave now existing in the said Churchyard, the burial may be allowed of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons heretofore buried in such grave, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin, containing the body, shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

(c) In the said Churchyard, in any grave space in which no interment has heretofore taken place, the burial may be allowed of the body of any person for whom or of any member of a family for which such grave space has been reserved and appropriated as a burial place, with the exclusive right of burial therein, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by section sixty-nine of the Government of Ireland Act, 1920, His Majesty is empowered by Order in Council to make such regulations as seem necessary or proper for setting in motion the Parliaments and Governments of Southern and Northern Ireland, and also for any other matter for which it seems to His Majesty necessary or proper to make provision for the purpose of bringing the said Act into full operation or for giving full effect to any of the provisions of the said Act, and in particular His Majesty is empowered amongst other things, by any such Order in Council—

(1) To make such adaptations of any enactments so far as they relate to Ireland as may appear to Him necessary or proper in order to give effect to the provisions of the said Act, and also to make any adaptations of any enactments so far as they relate to England or Scotland as may appear to Him necessary or proper as a consequence of any change effected by the provisions of the said Act:

(2) To make provision for securing the payment of an old age pension to any person who is entitled to the payment of such a pension at the appointed day, while he so continues entitled:

And whereas for the purposes of the provisions of the said Act relating to the transfer of services the first day of December, nineteen hundred and twenty-one, was fixed as the appointed day as respects Northern Ireland in relation to Irish services in connection with the matters dealt with in this Order, but no day has yet been fixed for the purposes aforesaid as respects Southern Ireland:

And whereas the provisions of section 1 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, have been complied with:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Government of Ireland (Modification of Old Age Pensions Acts) Order, 1922.

(2) In this Order—

The expression "appointed day" means the first day of December, nineteen hundred and twenty-one:

The expression "the Acts" means the Old Age Pensions Acts, 1908 to 1919, and section one of the Blind Persons Act, 1920:

The expression "pension" means an old age pension under the Acts, and the expression "pensioner" shall be construed accordingly.

(3) The Interpretation Act, 1889, applies to the interpretation of this Order in like manner as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

2.—(1) The Acts shall as from the appointed day be deemed to have had effect subject to the modifications set out in this Order, save where inconsistent with the Government of Ireland Act, 1920, or the provisions of any subsequent Order in Council under that Act, and subject as respects matters within the

powers of the Parliament of Northern Ireland to repeal or alteration by Acts of that Parliament.

(2) Subject to the express provisions of this Order any Orders made under the Government of Ireland Act, 1920, containing adaptations of general application shall, if and so far as they are applicable to the enactments adapted by this Order, apply thereto in like manner as to other enactments.

(3) The modifications made by this Order shall apply to any regulation or instrument made or issued under any of the enactments so modified and in force immediately before the appointed day, in like manner as they apply to the enactment under which it was made or issued, and any such regulation or instrument shall continue in force in like manner and subject to the like powers of revocation and alteration as if it had been made or issued under the said enactment as so modified.

3.—(1) Subject as hereinafter provided, no sum shall be payable on account of a pension granted under the Acts as applying to Northern Ireland (hereinafter referred to as "a Northern Ireland pension") in respect of any period during which the pensioner is resident in a part of the United Kingdom outside Northern Ireland, and no sum shall be payable on account of an old age pension granted under the Acts as applying to the rest of the United Kingdom (hereinafter referred to as "a United Kingdom pension") in respect of any period during which the pensioner is resident in Northern Ireland:

Provided that where a person in receipt of a Northern Ireland pension becomes resident in some other part of the United Kingdom or where a person in receipt of a United Kingdom pension becomes resident in Northern Ireland, the pension shall, notwithstanding that he is so resident but subject always to the provisions of the Acts, continue to be payable for a period of twelve weeks from the Friday next following the date on which the pensioner ceased to be resident in the part of the United Kingdom in which the pension was granted, or, if that date was a Friday, from that date, but no payment shall be made on account of the pension until a period of five weeks has elapsed from the date aforesaid.

(2) Where under the provisions of this Article a pension granted in one part of the United Kingdom is payable while the pensioner is resident in the other part of the United Kingdom, the liability for the pension shall rest with the Government of that part of the United Kingdom in which the pension was granted, but all payments on account thereof shall be made by the Government of the part of the United Kingdom where the pensioner is resident as agents for and on behalf of the Government so liable as aforesaid.

4. If a person to whom a pension has been granted under the Acts as applying to one part of the United Kingdom is granted a pension under the Acts as applying to the other part of the United Kingdom, he shall, as from the date on which the last-mentioned pension commences to accrue, be disqualified for continuing to receive the first-mentioned pension.

5. Nothing in this Order shall affect the right of any person who was in receipt of a pension at the appointed day so long as he continues to be entitled thereto, but the pension shall continue payable to him whether he resides in Northern Ireland or in any other

part of the United Kingdom, and the liability for the pension shall, in respect of any period during which he is resident in Northern Ireland, rest with the Government of Northern Ireland, and shall, in respect of any period during which he is resident in any other part of the United Kingdom, rest with the Government of the United Kingdom.

6. Notwithstanding anything in the Government of Ireland Act, 1920, or in this or any other Order made under section sixty-nine of that Act, the expression "the United Kingdom" in the Acts, both in their application to Northern Ireland and in their application to the rest of the United Kingdom, shall mean Northern Ireland and the rest of the United Kingdom.

#### GAS MANTLES.

##### COMMITTEE UNDER PART II. OF THE SAFEGUARDING OF INDUSTRIES ACT, 1921.

The Board of Trade give notice that they have received a complaint by the Incandescent Mantle Manufacturers' Association that Mantles for Incandescent Lighting manufactured in Germany are being sold or offered for sale in the United Kingdom at prices which, by reason of the depreciation in the value in relation to sterling of German currency, are below the prices at which similar goods can be profitably manufactured in the United Kingdom, and that by reason thereof employment in the Incandescent Mantle industry in the United Kingdom is being, or is likely to be, seriously affected. The Board of Trade, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by Part II of the Safeguarding of Industries Act, 1921, have referred the matter for inquiry to a Committee constituted for the purposes of that Part of the Act, and consisting of:—

The Committee are directed, after ascertaining the facts, to report to the President of the Board of Trade

(a) Whether the conditions specified in Section 2, Sub-section (1), of the Safeguarding of Industries Act, 1921, are fulfilled;

(b) On the effect which the imposition of a duty under Part II. of the Act on goods of the class or description covered by the complaint would exert on employment in any other industry being an industry using goods of that class or description as material; and

(c) Whether in the opinion of the Committee production in the industry manufacturing similar goods in the United Kingdom is being carried on with reasonable efficiency and economy.

**SECTION I.**—In accordance with Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trade Boards Acts, 1918, the Trade Board HEREBY DECLARE the

SECTION II.—The Minimum Rates for Overtime in respect of hours worked by a worker in excess of the declared normal number of hours of work in the trade are as follows:—

(a) For all hours worked in excess of four on Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays the Overtime Rate is twice the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, DOUBLE TIME.

(b) For the first eight hours worked in excess of the first four hours of Overtime in any week the Overtime Rate is One-and-a-Quarter times the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, TIME-AND-A-QUARTER, and thereafter One-and-a-Half times the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, TIME-AND-A-HALF, except in so far as a higher Overtime Rate is payable under the provisions of Sub-Section (a) of this Section.

*Note.*—During the first four hours in excess of 48 in any week the minimum rate applicable is the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate as set out in Part I or Part II of this Schedule, except in so far as a higher rate may be payable under the provisions of Sub-Section (a) of this Section.

#### PART V.

##### DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES OF WORKERS.

SECTION I.—For the purpose of this Notice:—

A "FOREMAN" is a person who is employed in any branch of the Trade specified in the Trade Boards (Milk Distributive) Order, 1920, and to whom is deputed the duty of exercising supervising authority over workers exceeding five in number (exclusive of the foreman) working in the same shop, department or branch of the trade;

SECTION II.—A "ROUNDSMAN" or "ROUNDSWOMAN" is a person in charge of a round or rounds and is wholly or mainly so employed.

SECTION III.—A "CLERK" is a male or female person wholly or mainly employed on clerical work.

SECTION IV.—A "SHOP ASSISTANT" is a male or female person wholly or mainly employed in a shop in serving customers and/or in checking in and out.

#### PART VI.

SECTION I.—Notwithstanding anything contained in this Notice the Minimum Rates of Wages set out in this Schedule do NOT APPLY to:—

Workers employed in collection or delivery work by horse, motor, steam or oil driven vehicle, in garaging, in horse or motor keeping, in cleaning vehicles, or in stable work,

in respect of the time during which they are so employed.

SECTION II.—Subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts the Minimum Rates of Wages set out in this Notice apply to all Male

and Female workers (other than those specified in Section I of this Part) in respect of all time during which they are employed in Scotland in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Milk Distributive) Order, 1920, *viz.*:—

1.—(a) The wholesale or retail sale of fresh milk when carried on as a main or distinct business or as a distinct branch or department of a business.

(b) The sale of food or drink for consumption on the premises, or of other goods, when any such sale is carried on in association with and as a subsidiary part of such business, branch or department as aforesaid, if such sale involves the employment of workers who are principally employed in the sale specified in (a) above.

2.—(a) The following operations when incidental to the sales specified in 1 above:—

(i) Boxing, parcelling, labelling, weighing, measuring, checking, bottling, unpacking, packing;

(ii) Collecting, delivering, despatching, horsekeeping, cleaning vehicles;

(iii) Portering, lift or hoist operating, timekeeping, storing, stock-keeping, warehousing, cleaning premises;

(iv) Pasteurising, cooling, separating of milk;

(v) Cleaning utensils or receptacles;

(vi) Blending, testing, sampling;

(vii) Other incidental operations;

(b) Clerical work or canvassing when incidental to and carried on in conjunction with the work specified in 1 above.

But excluding any operations in:—

(a) The transport of goods by common carriers;

(b) Any industry or trade concerned exclusively with carting and operations incidental thereto;

(c) Post Office business;

(d) Agriculture within the meaning of the Corn Production Act, 1917.

#### PART VII.

SECTION I.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages must be paid clear of all deductions under than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any superannuation or other provident fund.

SECTION II.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages, or to agreements made or that may be made between employers and workers for the payment of wages in excess of these Minimum Rates of Wages.

SECTION V.—THE PROPOSED GENERAL MINIMUM TIME-RATE for Male Workers commencing employment in the Corset Trade for the first time at and over the age of 19 years shall be for the first period of six months 6½d. per hour, and for the second period of six months 8d. per hour.

On the expiration of one year's service in the trade, these workers shall receive such rates as their age may entitle them to under the foregoing proposals.

## PART III.

## PROPOSED VARIATION OF OVERTIME RATES FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS.

In lieu of the Overtime Rates at present fixed and set out in the Trade Board's Notice K (8) dated 27th September, 1921, Overtime Rates, calculated on the Proposed Minimum Rates specified in Parts I and II of this Schedule, in the manner set out in Part III of the Schedule to the above mentioned Notice K (8), shall apply in substitution for the Minimum Rates otherwise applicable, set out in Parts I and II of this Schedule, in respect of all hours worked in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board, in the above mentioned Notice K (8), to be the normal number of hours of work in the trade.

## PART IV.

The above proposed Minimum Rates of Wages apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all workers in respect of all time during which they are employed in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Corset) Order, 1919, that is to say:—

- (a) The manufacture of corsets, stays, children's corset bodices, infants' stay bands, bust confiners, such as brassieres and bandeaux when boned or with elastic webbing in their construction.
- (b) The manufacture of support or abdominal belts and similar articles, except where made in association with or in conjunction with the manufacture of surgical instruments.
- (c) The assembling of stocking suspenders in conjunction with or in association with the manufacture of any of the above mentioned articles.
- (d) All warehousing, packing, or other operations incidental to or appertaining to the manufacture of any of the above mentioned articles.

## PART V.

The above proposed General Minimum Time-Rates, Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates and Overtime Rates must be paid clear of all deductions, other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorised by any Act, to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any Superannuation or other Provident Fund.

The Trade Board will consider any OBJECTIONS to the above Proposals to Vary which may be lodged with them within two months from 13th May, 1922. Such Objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to The Secretary of the Corset Trade Board, 7-11, Old Bailey, London, E.C. 4.

It is desirable that the Objections should state precisely, and so far as possible with reasons, what is objected to.

RULES PUBLICATION ACT, 1893.

INDIAN CIVIL SERVICE.

In conformity with the provisions of Section 1 of the Statute 56 and 57 Victoria, Chapter 66, notice is hereby given, that the Secretary of State for India in Council proposes, with the advice and assistance of the Civil Service Commissioners, at the expiry of forty (40) days from the date of this Gazette, to make revised rules as shown below in pursuance of the power conferred on him by Section 97 of the Government of India Act.

INDIAN CIVIL SERVICE.

*Regulations for Competitive Examinations to be held in India.*

(1) A competitive examination for admission to the Indian Civil Service shall be held annually in India in the months of January and February, or at such other time as the Governor-General in Council may direct.

(2) The maximum number of candidates to be admitted to the examination may, at the discretion of the Governor-General in Council, be limited to 200. If the number of applicants exceeds 200 and a limitation is decided upon it

will be effected by quota committees in accordance with the following regulations:—

(3) Of the candidates to be admitted if limitation is decided upon, the number to be drawn from each of the areas specified in the first column of the annexed table shall not exceed that specified in the corresponding entry of the second column thereof; such number is hereinafter referred to as "the provincial quota."

(4) If limitation is decided upon, and in any area of Rule 3 the number of applicants exceeds the provincial quota, the Local Government of the Governor's Province or of the Province of Burma, coinciding with or included in the area, shall appoint a Committee to be called the Quota Committee, the majority of the members of which shall be non-officials. Such Quota Committee shall select the provincial quota for its area from among such of the persons applying for admission to the examination from that area as possess the qualifications hereinafter prescribed. The selection or rejection of an applicant by the Quota Committee shall be final. Provided, nevertheless, that the Local Government may remove from the quota a candidate who is reported by a Medical Board to be physically unfit for appointment in the Indian Civil Service.

(5) If limitation is decided upon the Local Government of Madras, and of the United Provinces, shall be responsible for the due representation of Coorg and Ajmer-Merwara respectively on the Quota Committees appointed by them, and the Local Government of the Punjab shall in like manner be responsible for the due representation of the North-West Frontier Province and Delhi.

(6) A person desiring to be admitted to the examination shall apply, before such date as the Governor-General in Council may prescribe, in the area of Rule 3 in which his parents reside at the time of the application, or have previously resided for a period of not less than three years, or in which he has himself resided, otherwise than as a student at a University only, for a like period. His application must be made to the Chief Secretary of the Governor's Province, which coincides with or is included in that area;

Provided that no candidate shall make more than one application in any year;

Provided, further, that persons resident in a State in India shall apply through their Durbars to the Chief Secretary of the province in which they wish to serve or of the province included in the area in which they wish to serve, and that for the purposes of Rule 3, if limitation of the number of candidates is decided upon, such persons shall be considered by the appropriate Quota Committee, and if chosen by that Committee shall constitute a part of the provincial quota for that area.

(7) Application shall be made at such time and in such manner as the Governor-General in Council may prescribe.

(8) A candidate must be either a British subject or a ruler or subject of a State in India in respect of whom the Governor-General in Council has made a declaration under section 96A of the Government of India Act. If the candidate (being a British subject) or his father or his mother was not born within His Majesty's Dominions and allegiance, the father must, at the time of the candidate's birth, have been a British subject or the subject of a State in India; and, if alive, must be, or, if dead, must have continued to be until his death, a British subject or a subject of such State.

(9) A candidate must have attained the age of 21 and must not have attained the age of 23 on the first day of August in the year in which the examination is held, or be in a position to claim such a concession under the provisions of the Appendix to these Regulations as will render him eligible.

(10) A candidate must be free from disease, constitutional affection, or bodily infirmity, unfitting him, or likely to unfit him, for the Indian Civil Service.

(11) A candidate must be of good moral character.

(12) A candidate must hold a degree of a University incorporated by law in British India, or of the Mysore University, or the senior diploma of the Mayo College, Ajmer.

(13) No candidate shall be admitted to the examination unless he holds a certificate of having been accepted for admission, given by the Quota Committee in an area in which a Quota Committee has been set up and given by the Local Government in any other area.

(14) Any attempt on the part of a candidate to enlist support for his application through persons of influence will disqualify for appointment. Spontaneous recommendations from persons who are not themselves acquainted with the candidate's work at school or at the University, or otherwise, will be disregarded.

(15) A candidate will pay a fee of Rs. 5 with his application form, and a candidate chosen for admission to the examination will pay a further fee of Rs. 100.

(16) The examination will include the following subjects, under the conditions stated in rules 17 to 22. Each subject will carry the number of marks shown against it.

(17) The literature, etc., associated with the language can only be taken by candidates who also offer the language itself.

(18) In subject 5 Vernacular a candidate may offer any one of the following languages:—Assamese, Bengali, Burmese, Gujarati, Hindi, Kanarese, Malayalam, Marathi, Oriya, Punjabi, Sindhi, Tamil, Telugu, Urdu.

(19) A candidate for a science on the higher grade (subjects 37, 39, 41, 43, 45, 47) must have undergone 2 years' laboratory training in an institution authorised to prepare candidates in that subject for a university degree and must send in a voucher to that effect from the head of the institution. For candidates for a science on the lower grade or Geography or Experimental Psychology (subjects 36, 38, 40, 42, 44, 46, 48, 50) a similar voucher of one year's laboratory training is required.

(20) As Vernacular Literature a candidate may offer the literature of any one of the following languages:—Bengali, Burmese, Gujarati, Hindi, Marathi, Tamil, Telugu, Urdu.

(21) From the marks assigned to candidates in each subject, such deduction will be made as the Civil Service Commissioners may consider necessary in order to secure that no credit is allowed for merely superficial knowledge.

(22) If a candidate's handwriting is not easily legible, a deduction will be made on this account from the total marks otherwise accruing to him.

(23) A list of the competitors shall be made in order of their proficiency as disclosed by the aggregate marks finally awarded to each competitor, and in that order so many competitors, up to the determined number of appointments, as are found by the Civil Service Commissioners to be qualified by examination shall be designated to be selected candidates for the Indian Civil Service, provided that the Governor-General of India in Council is satisfied that they are duly qualified in other respects. Should any selected candidate become disqualified, the Secretary of State for India will determine whether the vacancy thus created shall be filled or not. In the former case the candidate next in order of merit, and in other respects duly qualified, shall be deemed to be a selected candidate.

(24) Selected candidates will be on probation for two years in the United Kingdom.

#### Appendix.

1. Any person who has joined since the 4th August, 1914, the Army or Navy or Royal Marines or the Royal Air Force, or has rendered since that date actual military service in the Special Reserve or Territorial Force, Royal Naval Reserve, or Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve, may, if eligible in point of age under the above Regulations as they now stand for admission to the competitive examination held in 1922, but over age in 1923, deduct from his actual age at the time of the competitive examination to be held in 1923—

(a) the actual period of such service, if it has not exceeded three months;

(b) one year, if the actual period of service has exceeded three months. No candidate will be allowed to deduct more than one year from his actual age.

2. The same concession may also be granted to those who have been employed during the same period in connection with the armed forces of the Crown at home or abroad, giving their whole time and under obligation to serve for the duration of the war or until their discharge, or for any period not terminable at their own option, provided that their employment be not on ordinary commercial terms, such as that of Assistant Paymasters, Clerks, Artisans, and the like.

3. The grant of the concession described in para. 2 will be at the discretion of the Governor-General of India in Council, whose decision in each case will be final.

4. Candidates to be eligible for the concessions in 1 or 2 must furnish an official certificate of the period and satisfactory character of their service, and if any doubt arise whether the service of any candidate is of the kind contemplated the decision of the Governor-General of India in Council will be final.

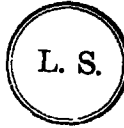

*Contraction of Certain Scheduled Districts.*

1. The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Great Britain) Order of 1922 (No. 26) shall be read and have effect as if the Scheduled District No. 7 were excluded from the Schedule thereto,

and as if the Scheduled Districts Nos. 1, 5, 14, 21, 22 and 25 described in the Schedule hereto were substituted respectively for the Scheduled Districts Nos. 1, 5, 14, 21, 22 and 25 described in the Schedule to that Order.

*Commencement.*

2. This Order shall come into operation on the eleventh day of May, nineteen hundred and twenty-two.

1. A district comprising the city of Dundee and such portions of the counties of Perth and Forfar as lie to the north of the Firth of Tay and within the following boundary, namely:— Commencing at the point where the western boundary of the parish of Longforgan reaches the River Tay, thence along that boundary to the point where it crosses the road from Inohture to Longforgan, thence in an easterly direction along that road via Longforgan and North Mains to its junction with the road from Balgarthno, thence in a northerly and easterly direction along the latter road to its junction with the western boundary of the parish of Liff and Benvie (Burghal), thence in northerly and north-easterly directions along that boundary and the boundary of the city of Dundee until it meets the southern boundary of the parish of Mains and Strathmartine near Pitempton, thence in an easterly direction along the latter boundary to its junction with the road leading from Dundee via Baldovan Station and Pitempton to Balmydown, thence in a northerly direction along that road to Balmydown, thence in an easterly direction along the road leading from Balmydown to its junction with the road from Dundee to Forfar north of Powrie, thence in a southerly direction along the latter road to its junction with the road from Dundee to Middleton via Powrie, thence in a generally easterly direction along the latter road via Barns of Wedderburn, Murroes, Templehall and Downie to the point where it meets the western boundary of the parish of Panbride, thence in a south-easterly direction along that parish boundary to the River Tay.

5. *In the county of Dumbarton—*

The parishes of Old Kilpatrick and New Kilpatrick

14. *In the administrative county of Durham—*

SOUTHAMPTON AND DISTRICT (MUZZLING AND CONTROL OF DOGS) ORDER OF 1922.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

PART I.

*Prohibition of Movement of Dogs out of certain District.*

1.—(1) No dog shall be moved out of the District described in the Schedule hereto hereinafter referred to as "the Scheduled District," unless it is accompanied by a licence of the Minister authorising such movement signed by an Officer of the Ministry, and any such licence may be subject to such conditions as to the detention and isolation of the dog or otherwise as the Ministry may think necessary or desirable and shall be specified in

the licence: Provided that this Article shall not apply to—

(a) the movement of a dog under a licence granted by the Ministry under the Importation of Dogs Order of 1914 and the Importation of Dogs (Amendment) Order of 1918 (No. 2) to a port in Great Britain for shipment, or to a place of detention for the purpose of detention and isolation; or

(b) the movement of a dog through the Scheduled District by railway from a place outside the District to another place outside the District without unnecessary delay and without being re-booked within the District.

(2) No dog shall be allowed by the owner or person in charge thereof to stray out of the Scheduled District.

(3) If any farm (except any detached part) is partly within and partly without the Scheduled District, the whole shall be deemed to be within the Scheduled District.

*Notice of Detention in case of Illegal Movement.*

2.—(1) Where an Inspector or other Officer of the Ministry, or of a Local Authority, has reason to believe that a dog has been moved or has been allowed to stray in contravention of this Order he may give notice to the owner or person in charge of the dog requiring that the dog shall be returned forthwith to the premises in the Scheduled District from which it was moved or allowed to stray, or that it shall be detained and isolated in accordance with the provisions of such notice, and that within a time specified in such notice, the dog shall be moved to a place of detention for the purpose of such detention and isolation.

(2) Such provisions may be inserted in the notice as the Ministry may think necessary or desirable for any of the following purposes, namely:—

(i) For prescribing and regulating the detention and isolation of the dog.

(ii) For prescribing the person by whom and the premises on which the dog shall be detained and isolated.

(iii) For regulating the movement of the dog to the place of detention.

(iv) For prescribing the confinement of the dog in a suitable hamper, crate, box, or other receptacle, or the muzzling of the dog during its movement by railway, or along a highway or thoroughfare.

(v) For prescribing the mode of isolation of the dog.

(vi) For prescribing the notice to be given of the death or loss of the dog, or of any matter arising in connection with the movement, detention, or isolation of the dog and the persons by whom and to whom the notice is to be given; and

(vii) For prescribing the production of the notice for inspection by an officer of the Ministry or police constable, or officer of the Local Authority.

(3) The operation of a notice under this Article may be terminated by notice to that effect given by an Inspector or other Officer of the Ministry or of the Local Authority to the

owner or person in charge of the dog, on proof to the satisfaction of the Inspector or Officer that the dog was not moved in contravention of the said Order.

(4) If the owner or person in charge of the dog, after receipt of such notice, fails to move the dog as required by the notice, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(5) If the provisions inserted in any notice under this Article are not complied with, the owner of the dog and the person in charge of the dog and any person who being required to comply with any such provision fails to do so, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

*Seizure of Dogs in Case of Default.*

3.—(1) If a dog has been moved, or has been allowed to stray, in contravention of this Order, or having been moved with a licence, or in accordance with the provisions of a notice, under this Order is not detained and isolated or otherwise dealt with as required by the conditions of the licence or the provisions of the notice, an Inspector of the Ministry may seize the dog, and thereupon the Ministry shall detain and isolate it at the expense of the owner of the dog at the place of detention specified in the licence (if any) or any other place of detention selected by the Ministry for such time as the Ministry may think necessary or expedient.

(2) The owner of the dog shall from time to time as may be notified to the owner by the Ministry pay to the Ministry the expenses of the detention and isolation of the dog, and if the owner of the dog fails to comply with this provision the Ministry may destroy or otherwise dispose of the dog as they think expedient without further notice to the owner.

**PART II.**

*Control of Dogs in Scheduled District.*

4.—(1) A dog in the Scheduled District shall at all times:—

(a) whilst in or on any public place be efficiently muzzled with an effective wire cage muzzle;

(b) whilst in or on any other place, be kept under control by being—

(i) confined in a kennel or other enclosure from which the dog cannot escape; or

(ii) secured to some premises by a collar and chain; or

(iii) efficiently muzzled with an effective wire cage muzzle; or

(iv) accompanied by the owner or some person deputed by him and under effectual control.

(2) The provisions of this Article shall not apply to—

(a) any pack of hounds while being exercised under the supervision of two or more competent attendants; or

(b) any dog in charge of a competent person while being used for sporting purposes, or for the capture or destruction of vermin, or for the driving or tending of cattle or sheep; or

(c) any dog confined in a suitable hamper, crate, box or other receptacle, so constructed as to render it impossible for such dog while so confined to bite any person or animal.

*Seizure, Detention and Disposal of Uncontrolled Dogs.*

5.—(1) Any dog in the Scheduled District which is not muzzled, or kept under control, as prescribed by this Order, may be seized by the Local Authority or by the Police, and any dog so seized shall be dealt with by the Local Authority as follows:—

(i) If the dog is diseased or suspected, or has been bitten by a diseased or suspected dog, it shall be forthwith slaughtered

(ii) If the dog has been exposed to the infection of rabies it shall be detained, slaughtered, or otherwise dealt with as the Local Authority think expedient, but so that the dog shall not, while detained by the Local Authority, be allowed to come in contact with any other animal.

(iii) In any other case the dog shall be treated as a stray dog seized under the powers conferred by section three of the Dogs Act, 1906.

(2) No dog so seized shall be given or sold for the purposes of vivisection.

(3) Every dog shall, for the purposes of this Article, be deemed to have been exposed to the infection of rabies which has been in the same shed, stable, building, kennel, field, or other place, or otherwise in contact with any diseased or suspected dog, or which has in any other way been exposed to the infection of rabies.

*Prohibition of Holding of Exhibitions or Shows of Dogs in Scheduled District.*

6. No exhibition or show of dogs whether for sale or otherwise shall be held in the Scheduled District except with a licence of the Ministry, and any such licence shall be subject to such conditions as the Ministry may think necessary or desirable, and shall specify in the licence.

PART III.

GENERAL.

*Offences.*

7.—(1) If a dog is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the dog, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the dog, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the dog is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2) If any dog in the Scheduled District is not muzzled, or kept under control, as prescribed by this Order, the owner of the dog, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(3) If a dog which is being moved or has been moved with a licence under this Order is not muzzled or confined or is not detained and isolated or otherwise dealt with as required by the conditions of the licence, the owner of the dog, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(4) If any person holds, or causes or permits to be held, any exhibition or show in contravention of this Order, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(5) If a person allows a dog to stray in contravention of this Order or with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order or of the conditions of a licence under this Order, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(6) If the owner or person in charge of a dog fails to give, produce, or do any notice, licence, or thing which by this Order, or by the conditions of a licence thereunder, he is required to give, produce, or do, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

*Interpretation.*

8. In this Order—

“The Minister and the Ministry” means the Minister and the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries.

“The Act of 1894” means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

“Disease” means rabies, “diseased” means affected with rabies, and “suspected” means suspected of rabies.

“Public place” includes any street, highway, thoroughfare, public bridge, royal park, public park, garden or pleasure ground, common unenclosed land, or other place to which the public have for the time being access.

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Rabies Order of 1919.

*Local Authority to Enforce Order.*

9. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

*Commencement.*

10. This Order shall take immediate effect.

*Short Title.*

11. This Order may be cited as the SOUTHAMPTON AND DISTRICT (MUZZLING AND CONTROL OF DOGS) ORDER OF 1922.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

*Contraction of Scheduled District.*

1. The Warwickshire (Tanworth District) (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1922 shall apply only to the area described in the Schedule to this Order, and that Area, subject to the modification contained in Article 2 of the first-mentioned Order, shall continue to be a Prohibited Area for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Control of Movement) Order of 1920.

*Commencement.*

#### PORT OF LONDON.

NOTICE is hereby given, that the Port of London Authority propose to make the following Bye-laws:—

#### BYE-LAWS

#### AMENDING THE PORT OF LONDON RIVER BYE-LAWS, 1914.

The Port of London Authority, in exercise of the powers and authority vested in them by the Port of London (Consolidation) Act, 1920, and of every other power them thereunto enabling, do make the following Bye-laws, that is to say:—

#### Repeal.

1. Bye-laws 10, 11, 12 and 13 of the Port

of London River Bye-laws, 1914, shall, after these present Bye-laws, come into operation, be and the same are hereby repealed.

*Short Title and Commencement.*

2. These Bye-laws may be cited as "The Port of London River Bye-laws, 1922," and shall come into operation the day after the same are confirmed by the Minister of Transport.

*Application.*

3. These Bye-laws shall apply to that part of the River Thames to which The Port of London River Bye-laws, 1914, are made applicable by the provisions of Bye-law 3 thereof.

*Interpretation.*

4. In these Bye-laws words and expressions to which a special meaning is assigned by The Port of London River Bye-laws, 1914, have the same meaning as they have in The Port of London River Bye-laws, 1914.

*Lights for Vessels Not under Steam.*

5. A sailing vessel under way and any vessel not under steam, being towed, shall exhibit the same lights as are prescribed by Bye-law 7 of The Port of London River Bye-laws, 1914, for a steam vessel under way, with the exception of the bright white lights mentioned therein, which they shall never exhibit.

This Bye-law shall not apply to:—

(a) A lighter, float, float or raft of timber, pontoon, caisson, non-propelling grain or coal elevator, non-propelling dredger, floating dry dock, non-propelling floating crane, or a non-propelling floating derrick.

(b) A keel, row-boat, randan, wherry, skiff, dingey, shallop, punt or a canoe.

*Lights for Lighters, &c.*

6. A lighter and every other vessel specified in Sub-clause (a) of Bye-law 5, when under way and not in tow, shall by night have a white light in a lantern of a pattern approved by the Port Authority always ready, and the person in charge thereof shall exhibit the same on the approach of any vessel, and every vessel specified in Sub-clause (b) of Bye-law 5, when under way, shall have ready at hand a lantern showing a white light, which shall be temporarily exhibited in sufficient time to prevent collision.

This Bye-law shall not apply to barges used for the conveyance of petroleum, as defined in the Bye-laws for the Regulation and Carrying of Petroleum on the Thames.

*Towing Lights.*

7. (a) The master of a steam vessel shall not by night commence to tow any lighter or other vessel specified in Sub-clause (a) of Bye-law 5, unless a white light, similar in construction and character to that mentioned in Bye-law 6, is exhibited on the stern or after-part of such lighter or other vessel. Provided that if more than one such lighter or other vessel is being towed in line the white light above referred to

shall be exhibited on the stern or after-part of the sternmost or last of such line.

(b) The master of a steam vessel shall not by night commence to tow any lighter or other vessel specified in Sub-clause (a) of Bye-law 5 lashed alongside such steam vessel unless a white light of the construction and character above mentioned is exhibited on the side of such lighter or other vessel farthest from such steam vessel.

(c) The person in charge of the lighter or other vessel specified in Sub-clause (a) of Bye-law 5 upon which, in compliance with the foregoing provisions a white light is exhibited, shall by night, after the towage has commenced and during the towage, continue to exhibit such light.

*Lights for Overtaken Vessel.*

8. A vessel other than a lighter or other vessel specified in Sub-clauses (a) and (b) of Bye-law 5, which is being overtaken by another vessel shall exhibit from her stern to such last-mentioned vessel a white light or a flare-up light.

The white light required to be exhibited by this Bye-law may be fixed and carried in a lantern and exhibited continuously, but in such case the lantern shall be so constructed, fitted and screened that it shall throw an unbroken light over an arc of the horizon of twelve points of the compass, viz.:—for six points from right aft on each side of the vessel so as to be visible at a distance of at least one mile. Such light shall be exhibited as nearly as practicable on the same level as the side lights.

*Construction.*

9. For the purposes of The Port of London River Bye-laws, 1914, and these Bye-laws the last preceding four Bye-laws shall be deemed to be in substitution for Bye-laws 10, 11, 12 and 13 of The Port of London River Bye-laws, 1914, and The Port of London River Bye-laws, 1914, as amended by these Bye-laws shall have effect as though references therein to Bye-laws 10, 11, 12 and 13 thereof were references to Bye-laws 5, 6, 7 and 8 of these Bye-laws.

*Penalty for Breach.*

10. Any person acting in contravention of any of these Bye-laws shall for every such act be liable to the penalty prescribed by Bye-law 82 of The Port of London River Bye-laws, 1914.

Any person desirous of making any objection to or representation respecting such proposed Bye-laws may do so, in writing or otherwise, on or before the twenty-fourth day of June, 1922, by sending the same to, or making the same at, the office of the said Port of London Authority, at 109, Leadenhall Street, London, E.C. 3.
