

Contraction of Scheduled District.

1. The Edinburgh and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1922 shall apply only to the Area described in the Schedule to this Order, and that Area, subject to the modification contained in Article 2 of the first-mentioned Order, shall be a Prohibited Area for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Control of Movement) Order of 1920.

Commencement.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of June, nineteen hundred and twenty-two.

Short Title.

3. This Order may be cited as the EDINBURGH AND DISTRICT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1922 (No. 4).

SCHEDULE.

Prohibited Area to which Restrictions still Apply.

An Area in the city of Edinburgh bounded as follows:—

On the East, by a line drawn from the junction of Chesser Avenue with the Edinburgh and Mid-Calder Roads to the point where the Caledonian Railway crosses the Water of Leith at Slateford;

On the South, by the Caledonian Railway line from the point where it crosses the Water of Leith at Slateford to Kingsknowe Station;

On the West, by a line drawn northward from Kingsknowe Station to the junction of the Longstone and Mid-Calder Roads; and

On the North by (but excluding) that part of the Mid-Calder Road lying between the junction of the Longstone and Mid-Calder Roads and the north end of Chesser Avenue.

FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (GREAT
BRITAIN) ORDER OF 1922 (No. 34).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Contraction of Certain Scheduled Districts.

1. The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Great Britain) Order of 1922 (No. 33) shall be read and have effect as if the Scheduled Districts Nos. 5, 10, 11, and 12 were excluded from the Schedule thereto, and as if the Scheduled District No. 9 described in the Schedule hereto were substituted for the Scheduled District No. 9 described in the Schedule to that Order.

Commencement.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the second day of June, nineteen hundred and twenty-two.

Short Title.

3. This Order may be cited as the FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (GREAT BRITAIN) ORDER OF 1922 (No. 34).
