#### MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES (AS VARIED) FOR CERTAIN CLASSES OF MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS.

EFFECTIVE AS FROM 12TH JUNE, 1922.

Should this date not correspond with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid by an employer who pays wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, the rates shall become effective as from the beginning of the next full-pay period, but in any case not later than 18th June, 1922.
