“And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased by Schedule V., Section VI. of Your Order in Council bearing date the 22nd day of January, 1920, to sanction, *inter alia*, payment of an allowance of 5s. a day to a Paymaster Commander or Paymaster Captain in charge of the accounts of a Division at the Royal Naval Barracks at Portsmouth, Devonport or Chatham:

“And whereas we are of opinion that the Accountant Officer (who will normally be of the

rank of Paymaster Captain) in charge of the accounts at the Royal Naval Base, Port Edgar, should under existing circumstances be granted a similar allowance:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased to authorize payment of an allowance of 5s. a day to the Accountant Officer, Royal Naval Base, Port Edgar, for so long as the number of accounts for which he is responsible does not fall below 4,000, and with effect as from the 1st January, 1922.

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal.”

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

WHEREAS it is enacted by section six of the Juries Act, 1922, that provision may be made by Order in Council for requiring and authorizing the registration officer to mark as jurors or as special jurors in the Autumn Register for the year in which that Act comes into operation the names of the persons qualified and liable or qualified to serve as such, notwithstanding that their names have not been so marked in the electors lists, and for making, so far as relates to the operation of that Act in that year any consequential modifications in the provisions thereof:

And whereas for the purposes aforesaid it is expedient to make such provision as is hereinafter contained for the purpose of the marking of jurors in the Autumn Register for the year 1922:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon Him by that section and of all other powers enabling Him in that behalf, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1.—(1) The name of any person appearing in the Autumn Register for the year 1922 who is qualified and liable to serve as a juror shall

be marked with the letter "J," and the name of any person so appearing who is qualified to serve as a special juror shall be marked with the letters "SJ" in the manner hereinafter specified.

(2) The said letter or letters shall be printed in heavy type and shall be inserted in column 3 of the register, immediately after the names of the juror concerned, as shown in the following example:—

Whitehead, Albert Stanley—J
Longmore, William—SJ

Provided that the Secretary of State may, in any particular case, authorize such variation as he thinks fit.

2.—(1) The overseers of every parish shall, if so required by the registration officer of their area, furnish him with a list of all the persons in their parish, or where the parish consists of more than one registration unit, in each registration unit in their parish, who are qualified and liable to serve as jurors, showing in the case of each person the address of his qualifying premises in that unit and elsewhere in the parish and the value of those premises for the purposes of assessment to the poor rate or inhabited house duty and his occupation, and whether he is qualified to serve as a special juror:

Provided that the registration officer may, if he thinks fit, require the overseers to insert in copies of the electors lists and lists of claimants, if any, the marks required by this Order to be inserted in the Autumn Register for the year 1922 against the names of those persons in those lists who are qualified and liable to serve as jurors or qualified to serve as special jurors, as the case may be, and to transmit to him the copies so marked.

(2) The foregoing provisions of this Article shall not be deemed to relieve the overseers of their liability under subsection (3) of section one of the Juries Act, 1922, to furnish the registration officer with any further information which he may require for the purpose of enabling him to carry out the provisions of that Act and any Order in Council made thereunder with respect to the Autumn Register for the year 1922.

(3) For the purpose of furnishing the registration officer with any further information which he may require under the provisions of this Order Form C of heading I of Schedule I to the Representation of the People Order shall, with the necessary modifications, be deemed to be applicable.

3.—(1) For the purpose of the operation of the Juries Act, 1922, in the year 1922, the following shall be substituted for the first paragraph of subsection (4) of section one of that Act:—

"(4) If any person who is marked as a juror or as a special juror in the Autumn Register for the year 1922 claims that by reason of some disqualification or exemption he ought not to be so marked, he may at any time after publication of the Register and not later than the 25th day of October, 1922, apply to the registration officer to have the mark placed against his name removed."

(2) If the registration officer complies with any application made to him under subsection (4) of section one of the said Act as modified by this Order he shall forthwith notify the sheriff in writing of his decision, and in the case of every such application shall notify in

writing his decision thereon to the applicant not later than the 10th day of November, 1922.

(3) Notice of the dates fixed by virtue of and in consequence of this provision with respect to applications to the registration officer and appeals to a court of summary jurisdiction shall be published at the time of publication of the Register at all places where copies of the register are kept for inspection and in such other places as the registration officer may think fit.

4. This Order may be cited as the Juries Order, 1922.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers by the above recited Act in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

The Maintenance Orders (Facilities for Enforcement) Act, 1920, shall apply to the parts of His Majesty's dominions outside the United Kingdom hereunder mentioned:—

Bermuda.

The Gilbert and Ellice Islands.

And the Right Honourable Winston Spencer Churchill, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

And whereas His Majesty is satisfied that the Legislatures of the territories which are under His Majesty's protection hereinafter mentioned have made reciprocal provisions for the enforcement within those territories of judgments obtained in the High Court in England, the Court of Session in Scotland, and the High Court in Ireland:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers by the above-recited Act in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

Part II of the Administration of Justice Act, 1920, shall extend to the territories under His Majesty's protection hereunder mentioned:—

Northern Rhodesia.

Uganda Protectorate.

And the Right Honourable Winston Spencer Churchill, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

“We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, Chapter 77, of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, and of the Act

of the 37th and 38th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 63, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme with respect to the Rural Deanery of Richmond and the Rural Deanery of Barnes, both within the Archdeaconry of Kingston-upon-Thames, in the Diocese of Southwark:

"Whereas it has been represented to us by the Right Reverend Cyril Forster, Bishop of Southwark, that the arrangement which is hereinafter recommended and proposed with respect to the said Rural Deaneries of Richmond and Barnes is desirable and should be carried into effect, and we are of opinion that the same may be properly carried into effect:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Cyril Forster, Bishop of Southwark (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and Episcopal Seal to this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that as from the day on which any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the Rural Deanery of Richmond and the Rural Deanery of Barnes shall be united and form one Rural Deanery within the said Archdeaconry of Kingston-upon-Thames, and such new Rural Deanery shall be called 'The Rural Deanery of Richmond and Barnes.'

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other matter or thing with respect to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, by virtue of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas notice of the said Scheme has, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Archdeacon affected by the Scheme, that is to say, to the Archdeacon of Kingston-upon-Thames, and he has expressed his approval of the same:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Act, 1919, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 11th day

of May, 1922, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Act, 1919, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of two neighbouring Benefices, that is to say the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Saul and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Whitminster otherwise Wheatenhurst and hereinafter referred to as the Benefice of Whitminster, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Gloucester and in the Diocese of Gloucester:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Edgar Charles Sumner, Bishop of Gloucester, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Act, 1919, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Saul and Whitminster duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Gloucester, and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Gloucester signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas both of the said Benefices of Saul and Whitminster are now full, the Reverend Edward Nathaniel Needham-Davies being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Saul, and the Reverend George Frederick Drysdale being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Whitminster:

"And whereas only one Parsonage House will be left standing or remaining within or belonging to the United Benefice when the union which is hereinafter recommended and proposed shall take effect, namely, the Parsonage House belonging to the said Benefice of Saul and such house will accordingly become the Parsonage House of the United Benefice:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Edgar Charles Sumner, Bishop of Gloucester (in testimony whereof he has hereunto set his hand), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Saul and the said Benefice of Whitminster shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'the United Benefice of Saul with Whitminster' and that the Parishes of the said Benefices shall also be united into one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes and for such other purposes as in the said Act provided.

"2. That the Church of the Parish of Saul shall be the Parish Church of the United Benefice and that the Table of Fees for the said Parish of Saul shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of Fees for the United Parish.

"3. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant, the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith; and if the said Benefice of Whitminster only shall be then

vacant the said union shall also take effect forthwith if the Incumbent of the other of the said two Benefices shall consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall not so consent, then the said union shall take effect upon the then next avoidance of the said Benefice of Saul and the then Incumbent of Whitminster shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice; and if the said Benefice of Saul only shall be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Whitminster; and if neither of the said two Benefices be then vacant, then the said union shall take effect on the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Whitminster if the Incumbent at that time of the said Benefice of Saul shall have been instituted to Saul subsequently to the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or if instituted before that date shall consent to become the Incumbent of the United Benefice; but if he shall have been instituted to Saul before that date and shall not so consent, then the said union shall take effect immediately upon the next vacancy of the Benefice of Saul following such avoidance of the Benefice of Whitminster and the then Incumbent of Whitminster shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"4. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, that in each series of three successive turns of presentation or nomination for ever thereafter the Patrons of the said Benefice of Whitminster shall have the first turn and the Patron of the said Benefice of Saul shall have the second and third turns.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been published locally in the manner prescribed in the Statutory Rules made under the said Act and also transmitted in the manner so prescribed to the Patrons affected, together with a Notice in each case requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Gloucester has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, against the said Scheme, or any part

thereof, by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas neither of the two Benefices affected by the said Scheme is situate in a City or Municipal Borough:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme, and to order that the two Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Gloucester.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, Chapter 77, and of the Act of the 5th year of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, (session 2), Chapter 26, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 1st day of June, 1922, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, Chapter 77, and of the Act of the 5th year of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, (session 2), Chapter 26, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for authorizing certain improvements at the Episcopal House of Residence belonging to the See of Ely, which is known as The Palace, Ely:

"Whereas the Right Reverend Frederic Henry, now Bishop of the Diocese of Ely, is desirous that certain improvements should be made at the said Episcopal House of Residence, and has submitted to us the particulars of such improvements and we have specified our general approval of the same:

"And whereas the said Bishop is also desirous and it appears to us to be expedient that towards the cost of effecting the aforesaid additions and improvements a sum of £150 (being a sum which together with the outstanding balance of the sums already borrowed upon the same security under the authority of the statutes hereinbefore mentioned, does not exceed two years' income of the See) should be provided by his borrowing the same by way of mortgage upon the security of all and every part of the lands tenements and hereditaments endowments or emoluments which now belong, or may hereafter belong to the Bishopric of Ely:

" Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Frederic Henry, Bishop of the said Diocese of Ely, (testified by his having affixed his signature and Episcopal Seal to this Scheme) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that the said Bishop be authorized to borrow from the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne, and that the said Governors be empowered to lend under the provisions of the above mentioned Acts any sum not exceeding £150 and that as a security for the same the said Bishop do mortgage all and every part of the lands tenements and hereditaments and endowments or emoluments which now belong or may hereafter belong to the said See to the said Governors by Deed for a term of 15 years or until the said sum of £150, with interest for the same as hereinafter mentioned, and all costs and charges which may attend the recovery thereof, shall be fully paid and satisfied, and that such principal sum shall be repaid with interest in the manner following, that is to say, during and in respect of the first period of 12 months of the said term computed from the day of the date of the mortgage, no part of the said principal sum shall be repayable but the said Bishop or his successors shall yearly at the end of the second period of 12 months so computed and at the end of every such like period of 12 months thereafter, pay to the said Governors their successors or assigns one-tenth part of the said principal sum of £150 until the whole thereof shall be repaid, and shall also at the end of the first and each succeeding period of 12 months computed as aforesaid, pay interest at the rate of £4 per centum per annum on the said principal sum or on so much thereof as shall from time to time remain unpaid.

" And that if and when it shall happen that either the principal or the interest directed to be paid as hereinbefore mentioned shall be in arrear and unpaid for the space of 40 days after the same shall have become due it shall and may be lawful for the said Governors their successors and assigns to recover the same and the costs and charges attending the recovery thereof by distress and sale in the like manner as rents may be recovered by landlords or lessors from their tenants by the laws in force at the time of such distress and sale. And that such mortgage Deed shall be in the form and to the effect to be approved by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and shall bind as well the said Frederic Henry, now Bishop of the said Diocese of Ely, as every succeeding Bishop of the same Diocese, until the principal money and interest costs and charges shall have been paid off and discharged.

" And we further recommend and propose that the said sum of £150 so to be borrowed as aforesaid shall be paid to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, that the said Governors and their successors shall not be bound or required to see to the application thereof, and that upon the receipt of the said sum so to be borrowed as aforesaid the whole or any part or parts thereof shall be applied by us at such time or times and in such manner as shall appear to us to be expedient towards effecting the said proposed improvements at the Episcopal Residence aforesaid.

" And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or

any of them, in conformity with the provisions of the herein named Acts, or of either of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Ely.

NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE ACTS, 1911 to 1921.

ROAD VEHICLES.

THE HEAVY MOTOR CAR (AMENDMENT) ORDER, 1922, DATED MAY 29, 1922, MADE BY THE MINISTER OF TRANSPORT.

To the County Councils of the several Administrative Counties in Great Britain;—

To the Mayor, Aldermen, and Commons of the City of London in Common Council assembled;—

To the Councils of the several County Boroughs in England and Wales;—

To the Councils of the Royal Parliamentary and Police Burghs in Scotland concerned;—

To the Councils of the several Metropolitan Boroughs;—

To the Urban District Councils of the several Urban Districts in England and Wales;—

To the Rural District Councils acting as

Highway Authorities in Rural Districts in England and Wales;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by Section 6 of the Locomotives on Highways Act, 1896 (59 and 60 Vict., c. 36) (as modified by Section 12 of the Motor Car Act, 1903 (3 Edw. VII, c. 36)), the Local Government Board in England and Wales and the Secretary for Scotland in Scotland were respectively empowered to make regulations with respect to the use on highways of light locomotives and motor cars as defined in the said Acts, and their construction and the conditions under which they may be used;

And whereas by Section 7 of the Locomotives on Highways Act, 1896, it is enacted that a breach of any regulation so made may on summary conviction be punished by a fine not exceeding £10;

And whereas the Local Government Board by the Heavy Motor Car Order, 1904 (S.R. & O., 1904, No. 1809), and the Secretary for Scotland by the Heavy Motor Car (Scotland) Order, 1905 (S.R. & O., 1905, No. 1), respectively made regulations with respect to the weight, conditions of use, construction and speed of heavy motor cars;

And whereas the said recited Orders have been amended by various amending Orders;

And whereas by the Ministry of Transport Act, 1919 (9 and 10 Geo. V, c. 50), the Ministry of Transport (Ministry of Health Exception of Powers) Order, 1919 (S.R. & O., 1919, No. 1441), and the Ministry of Transport (Secretary for Scotland Transfer and Exception of Powers) Order, 1920 (S.R. & O., 1920, No. 2122), the powers of the Local Government Board and the Secretary for Scotland to make such regulations as aforesaid respectively are now vested in the Minister of Transport;

And whereas it is expedient that certain of the regulations made under the said recited Orders shall be modified in manner hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers in that behalf vested in him the Minister of Transport hereby orders as follows:—

ARTICLE I.—The Heavy Motor Car Order, 1904, and the Heavy Motor Car (Scotland) Order, 1905, as respectively amended by subsequent Orders, shall have effect as if—

(a) In Article VII of the said Orders the words "Provided also that" to the end of the Article were omitted and the following words inserted in substitution therefor (that is to say):—

"Provided also that if the heavy motor car has all its wheels fitted with tyres made of soft or elastic material and does not draw a trailer or draws a trailer which is so constructed and by partial super-imposition attached to the heavy motor car that at all times the weight upon the rear axle of the heavy motor car shall exceed the weight upon the axle of the trailer and which trailer has not more than two wheels in contact with the ground such wheels being fitted with pneumatic tyres or with tyres made of a soft or elastic material the speed at which the heavy motor car may be driven on any highway shall not exceed twelve miles an hour."

(b) In sub-section 3 of Article XI of the said Orders the words "four tons" were omitted and the words "six and a half tons and the sum of the axle-weights of all the

axles of a trailer and of the heavy motor car drawing such trailer shall not exceed twenty-two tons" were inserted in substitution therefor.

(c) In Article XI of the said Orders the following sub-section was added to the Article, that is to say:—

"(6) If a heavy motor car draws a trailer which is so partially super-imposed upon and attached to the heavy motor car that at all times the weight upon the rear axle of the heavy motor car shall exceed the weight upon the axle of the trailer the total length of the heavy motor car and the trailer so attached shall not exceed thirty-three feet when measured between the extreme projecting points."

ARTICLE II.—Nothing in this Order shall—

(a) Affect the operation prior to the date of this Order of the regulations made in the Heavy Motor Car Order, 1904, and the Heavy Motor Car (Scotland) Order, 1905, as respectively amended by subsequent Orders, or anything duly done or suffered under those regulations; or

(b) Affect any right, privilege, obligation or liability acquired, accrued or incurred under those regulations; or

(c) Affect any fine or punishment incurred in respect of a breach of those regulations; or

(d) Affect any legal proceeding or remedy in respect of any such right, privilege, obligation, liability, fine or punishment:

and any such legal proceeding or remedy may be instituted, continued or enforced and any such fine or punishment may be imposed as if this Order had not been made.

ARTICLE III.—This Order shall have effect on and from the first day of June, 1922, and may be cited as the Heavy Motor Car (Amendment) Order, 1922.

Movement Within the Scheduled District.

2.—(1) Where an Inspector of the Ministry considers it necessary or expedient, after inquiry, that an animal in the Scheduled District should be permitted to be moved within the Scheduled District as often as occasion may require between different parts of the same farm, he may, notwithstanding any prohibition of movement contained in the principal Order, authorise such movement by an Occupation Licence, and the Inspector may insert in the Licence such conditions as he may consider necessary or desirable for the purpose of preventing the animals referred to in the Licence from coming into contact with any other animals.

(2) If in respect of any animal the conditions of a Licence granted under this Article are not complied with, the owner of the animal and the person for the time being in charge thereof shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

3. Part II. of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Control of Movement) Order of 1920 is hereby applied to the several boroughs described in the Second Schedule hereto.

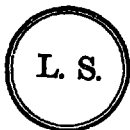
