The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice, in pursuance of Clause 9 of the Order in Council of the 10th January, 1910, that, with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, they have prescribed that persons presented to them for the issue of Certificates of Qualification for appointments in the Forestry Commission shall be required to pay fees in accordance with the scale set forth in the notice in the London Gazette of the 31st January, 1922. The notice respecting payment of fees published in the issue of the London Gazette of the 2nd September, 1921, is hereby cancelled.

WEST LANCASHIRE (FOOT-AND-
MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1922.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

*Prohibition of Movement of Animals into
Certain Districts.*

1. Parts I and IV of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Control of Movement) Order of 1920, hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order," are hereby applied without modification, save as hereinafter provided, to the district described in the First Schedule hereto, which shall be a Scheduled District for the purposes of that Order.

Movement within the Scheduled District.

2.—(1) Where an Inspector of the Ministry considers it necessary or expedient, after inquiry, that an animal in the Scheduled District should be permitted to be moved within the Scheduled District as often as occasion may require between different parts of the same farm, he may, notwithstanding any prohibition of movement contained in the principal Order, authorise such movement by an Occupation Licence, and the Inspector may insert in the Licence such conditions as he may consider necessary or desirable for the purpose of preventing the animals referred to in the Licence from coming into contact with any other animals.

(2) If in respect of any animal the conditions of a Licence granted under this Article are not complied with, the owner of the animal and the person for the time being in charge thereof shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

*Movement into certain Boroughs for Immediate
Slaughter.*

3. Part II of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Control of Movement) Order of 1920 is hereby applied to the several boroughs described in the Second Schedule hereto.

Short Title.

4. This Order may be cited as the WEST LANCASHIRE (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1922.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

Scheduled District.

A District comprising:—

In the administrative county of Lancaster:

The petty sessional divisions of Garstang, Kirkham, Amounderness (*except the parishes of Dilworth, Hothersall, Alston, and Elston*), Leyland and Walton-le-Dale (*except the parish of Samlesbury*), and the Croston subdivision of the petty sessional division of Leyland Hundred; and

The parishes of Ashton with Stodday, Ellel, Cockersand Abbey, Thurnham, Cockerham, Bispham, and North Meols.

And also comprising the county boroughs of Blackpool, Preston and Southport.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

Boroughs to which Part II of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Control of Movement) Order of 1920 is applied:—

The county borough of Blackpool.
The county borough of Preston.
The county borough of Southport.
