in the county borough of Wolverhampton if they are accompanied during the whole movement by a Licence granted under this Order by the Local Authority of the said county borough.

Restriction on Movement of Animals from Market.

(2) Animals exposed for sale at the said market, whether moved to the market with a Licence under this Order or otherwise, shall not be moved therefrom except to the public abattoirs in the county borough of Wolverhampton, and on arrival at such abattoirs shall not be removed therefrom and shall be slaughtered within ninety-six hours of their arrival thereat.

Application of certain other Orders.

(3) Except as specifically provided in this Article the provisions of the principal Order shall continue to apply to the said market and to any animals exposed thereat.

Revocation.

6. The Birmingham District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1922 and the Birmingham District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Orders of 1922 (Nos. 2, 3, and 4) are hereby revoked.

Commencement.

7. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of July, nineteen hundred and twenty-two.

Short Title.

8. This Order may be cited as the Birming-HAM DISTRICT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1922 (No. 5).

FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (GREAT BRITAIN) ORDER OF 1922 (No. 39).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Withdrawal of Restrictions from Certain Scheduled Districts.

1. The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Great Britain) Order of 1922 (No. 22) and the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Great Britain) Order of 1922 (No. 36) shall be read and have effect as if the Scheduled Districts Nos. 4 and 6 described in the Schedule to the last-mentioned Order were deleted therefrom, and those districts shall cease to be Scheduled Districts for the purposes of the first-mentioned Order.

Commencement.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the third day of July, nineteen hundred and twenty-two.
