Application of Part I. of the Sheep (Double Dipping) Order of 1920.

1. (1) Part I. (*Restriction on Movement of Sheep out of a Movement Area*) of the Sheep (Double Dipping) Order of 1920 is hereby applied to the Area described in the Schedule hereto, hereinafter referred to as "the Area."

(2) This article shall come into operation on the twenty-fourth day of July, and shall cease to operate on the tenth day of September, nineteen hundred and twenty-two.

Restrictions on Exposure of Sheep at Markets, &c., within the Area during the Period from 24th July to 9th September.

2. Sheep on any premises in the Area shall not (except as hereinafter provided) be permitted to enter, or be exposed for sale or exhibition in, any market, fairground, saleyard or place of exhibition in that Area during the period from 24th July to 9th September in the current year, unless they have been dipped twice on separate dates with an interval of not less than ten and not more than fourteen days between the two dates, the second dipping having taken place within twenty-eight days before the date of entry or exposure, and are accompanied by a declaration signed by the owner of the sheep, or his agent authorised in writing for this purpose, stating that the sheep have been so dipped, and the dates of dipping, and that since the second dipping the sheep have been kept separate as far as practicable while in the Area from other sheep not so dipped.

Special Provision as to Fat Sheep for immediate Slaughter.

3. Where an Inspector of a Local Authority is satisfied that any sheep in his District in the Area are intended for immediate slaughter, and that it is impracticable or inexpedient that the same should in accordance with this Order be dipped before exposure for sale or exhibition, he may, subject to any directions by the Local Authority, by licence authorise the movement of the sheep to any market, fairground, saleyard or place of exhibition in the Area, subject to such conditions (if any) as are inserted in the licence, and thereupon the sheep may, in accordance with such licence and conditions, be exposed for sale in the market, fairground, saleyard or place of exhibition free from any restrictions imposed by any Order of the Minister relating to Sheep Scab or Sheep Dipping; provided that an Inspector of a Local Authority shall not issue any such licence for movement to premises in the District of another Local Authority unless the consent of such Local Authority, either generally or in the particular instance, has been previously obtained.

Offences.

4. If a sheep is permitted to enter or is exposed for sale in any market, fairground, saleyard, or place of exhibition, in contravention of this Order, the occupier of the premises, and the owner and person in charge of the sheep, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty

of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

LANCASHIRE, CHESHIRE AND DISTRICT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1922.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Application of Restrictions to Scheduled District.

1. Parts I, III and IV of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Control of Movement) Order of 1920, hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order," are hereby applied without modification, save as hereinafter provided, to the district described in the First Schedule hereto, which shall be a Scheduled District for the purposes of that Order.

Declaration of Prohibited Areas.

2. The areas described in the Second Schedule hereto are hereby declared to be Prohibited Areas for the purposes of the Principal Order.

Movement within the Prohibited Areas.

3.—(1) Where an Inspector of the Ministry considers it necessary or expedient, after inquiry, that an animal in either of the Prohibited Areas should be permitted to be moved within the same Prohibited Area as often as occasion may require between different parts of the same farm, he may, notwithstanding
