The following address was presented to the KING on Monday, the 17th instant, on the occasion of the opening by His Majesty of the new London County Hall, Westminster Bridge, S.E. 1:—

LONDON COUNTY COUNCIL.

TO THE KING'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY.

The loyal and dutiful address of the Council of the administrative County of London.

MAY IT PLEASE YOUR MAJESTY:

We, the Chairman, Aldermen and Councillors of the London County Council, representing the people of the capital of Your Majesty's Empire, desire respectfully to express our warmest thanks for the honour conferred on London by Your Majesty in graciously consenting to perform the opening ceremony at the new County Hall. It is now more than ten years since we were privileged to receive Your Majesty here on the occasion of the laying of the foundation-stone. The lapse of such a length of time since the commencement of the building is due to the Great War, during the major part of which work was sus-

pending on the site. For some time the building was taken possession of for State work and was indeed not handed back completely until October, 1919. The changed conditions since the War have had the effect of increasing largely the original estimated cost of the building, and the pressure of economic circumstances has necessitated the postponement for the present of the addition of a wing on the north side. The completed portion of the building, however, provides suitable accommodation for both members and staff, of whom no fewer than 2,400 will be under one roof.

Mr. Ralph Knott, F.R.I.B.A., whose design was unanimously placed first by the assessors of the competition, has designed and planned the building, in collaboration with the Council's official architect, Mr. W. E. Riley, F.R.I.B.A., M.I.C.E., R.B.A.

Your Majesty, in viewing some of the principal features of this building, will be shown where it is proposed to inscribe the names of two members of the Council and 1,065 members of the staff who gave their lives for their King and country in the Great War.

Your Majesty is aware of the width of the range of the powers and duties of the Council; for example—public health in its broadest aspect, including main drainage, housing, the care of the insane and provisions against cer-

tain diseases; public protection, including the Building Acts, Fire Brigade, theatres and music halls and cinematograph halls, weights and measures, diseases of animals; transport, including tramways, arterial roads, street improvements, bridges and tunnels; public amenities, including parks and open spaces and museums, to say nothing of the enormous and far-reaching service of education, elementary, secondary, technical and university.

The concentration of most of the Council's central administrative staff engaged on such work in one building instead of many will conduce to that smooth working of the administrative machinery which is essential not only to the Council but to the public whom the Council represents. That the Council's efforts to secure this end are crowned by the recognition of our Sovereign is a source of pride and satisfaction to us, and we trust that the new building may become a centre whence enduring achievement will follow sustained efforts for the common weal of London.

We desire to tender to Her Majesty the Queen our humble and grateful thanks for Her gracious presence here to-day and for the encouragement always afforded to us by Her Majesty's sympathetic interest in the welfare of the people of London.

We pray that Your Majesty may long be spared to reign over the realm and to receive the manifestations of devoted loyalty and goodwill of its people.

To which Address His Majesty was pleased to return the following gracious Answer:—

On behalf of the Queen and myself I thank you very sincerely for your loyal and dutiful Address. It gives me much pleasure to comply with the request of the London County Council to open the new County Hall, for I feel a particular interest and satisfaction in seeing the completion of this splendid building, the foundation-stone of which I laid more than ten years ago.

The local government of every great city is a municipal problem, most difficult of solution. Opinions differ as to the machinery of local administration and the best methods of obtaining the best results, but it is universally recognised that the root of all good government is a live and active civic spirit.

The men of old times were wise in erecting fine buildings in their towns. It is necessary to appeal to the imagination—a public authority meanly housed may be meanly esteemed. This noble Hall, the seat of the government of the County of London, will be typical of the importance of their duties and responsibilities, and should stimulate the development of that sense of citizenship so difficult and yet so imperative to cultivate.

This building is, I believe, the first important public work completed in London since the War. We are struggling to regain the normal conditions of trade and industry, and I grieve to think how much unemployment still exists. But surely the completion of this County Hall is one more proof that the energies, diverted to carrying on the War of four long years' duration, are returning to their old channels, and that the same determination and perseverance displayed by the citizens of London in the attainment of victory will equally be exerted in the no less difficult task of rebuilding our prosperity in peace.

I am glad to know that the County Hall will contain a permanent memorial to those members and servants of the Council who gave their lives in the Great War. Their names are a testimony to the splendid contribution rendered to the fighting strength of the country by the municipal organisations—all the more splendid when we remember the heavy responsibilities imposed upon Local Authorities for essential services, the efficient performance of which was vital to victory.

It is fitting in many ways that this Hall should have been erected on the banks of the Thames, the great highway of London, the means of her prosperity and the opportunity of her greatness: and it is significant also that the site chosen should be on the southern side of the river. A few years ago all the vast expanse of this bank, now covered with dwellings, factories and workshops of a teeming population, was mainly field and marshland, and it is only natural that development here should have been slower than on the north. But reconstruction is sure to come and, whatever its form, will be accelerated by the erection of this new civic building.

On the opposite side of the river is a small area of land, historic in the pageantry of national life, and throughout long years of steady progress the focus of ever-expanding activities. Here, also, let us hope, that the opening of this new centre of county life in London will be the beginning of a chapter no less beneficial to the citizens of the metropolis.

It would be difficult to emphasise too strongly the importance of efficient Local Government to the general well-being of this country. Signal advances have been made: the improvements in sanitation and in the amenities of communal life have been enormous. In the reduced death rates and, most significant and far-reaching of all, in the reduced infantile mortality, in which respect our Capital City holds so proud a record, the value of this work has been shown. Much still remains to be done, not only in measures of reconstruction but also in renewed progress towards even better conditions. Great as have been the achievements of the past, results equally remarkable can be confidently looked for in the future; and nothing will more conduce to this end than the mutual confidence of all classes in the government of the London County Council, and their co-operation in supporting the Council's efforts to secure all that is best for the contentment and prosperity of the community.

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By an Exchange of Notes, dated the 3rd instant, between His Majesty's Acting Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs and the Assistant Official Agent of the Russian Trade Delegation in this country, it has been agreed that the provisions of the Trade Agreement between Great Britain and the Russian Socialist Federal Soviet Government, signed at London on the 16th March, 1921, shall apply as from the 3rd July, 1922, to the Dominion of Canada, and to merchandise the produce and manufacture of Canada, and shall govern the relations between Canada and Russia

Provided that all hours worked by a worker on Sundays and Customary Public Holidays, or on Statutory Holidays, shall be regarded as Overtime to which the Overtime Rates shall apply.

The Minimum Rates for Overtime in respect of hours worked by a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over or by a Female Worker (whether employed on time-work or on piece-work), in excess of the declared normal number of hours shall be as follows :—

1. ON ANY DAY other than Sundays, Customary Public Holidays, and Statutory Holidays :—
  - (a) For the first two hours of Overtime, One-and-a-Quarter times the minimum rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, TIME-AND-A-QUARTER.
  - (b) For Overtime after the first two hours of Overtime, One-and-a-Half times the minimum rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, TIME-AND-A-HALF.
2. On SUNDAYS, on CUSTOMARY PUBLIC HOLIDAYS, and on STATUTORY HOLIDAYS :—For all hours worked, Twice the minimum rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, DOUBLE-TIME.
3. IN ANY WEEK :—For all hours worked in any week in excess of 48, One-and-a-Quarter times the minimum rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, TIME-AND-A-QUARTER, except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are payable under the provisions of Sub-Sections 1 (b) and 2 of this Section.
4. The Overtime Rates set out in Sub-Sections 1 and 2 of this Section are payable in respect of all hours of Overtime worked on any day, notwithstanding that the number of hours worked in the week does not exceed 48.

Provided that where it is the established practice of an employer to require attendance only on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday, the Overtime Rate shall only be payable on such days after 9½ hours have been worked.

NOTE.—The hours which Female Workers, Young Persons and Children are allowed to work are subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts and of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920.

#### PART IV.

The above respective Minimum Rates of Wages apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all Male Workers of 21 years of age or over and to all Female Workers in Great Britain in respect of all time during which they are employed in the General Waste Branch of the Waste Materials Reclamation Trade, as defined in the Regulations made by the Minister of Labour, dated 27th August, 1920, that is to say :—

- (1) The collecting, sorting or grading of the following materials :—
 

Rags, waste paper, paper stock, woollen, worsted, cotton, jute, flax, hemp or other textile waste, textile clippings or cuttings, used bags, sacks or sacking, scrap rubber, scrap iron or other scrap metal, fur cuttings, rabbit skins, bones or fat, used tins, broken glass or earthenware.
- (2) The collecting, sorting or grading of the following articles when collected, sorted or graded in association with or in conjunction with the collecting, sorting or grading of the waste materials specified above :—
 

Discarded clothing (including head-gear or foot-gear), discarded textile articles, old ropes, used bottles or used jars.
- (3) The following operations when carried on in association with or in conjunction with the collecting, sorting or grading of any or all of the waste materials specified in 1 above—
 

The ripping of worn clothes for rags, the picking of old ropes, the trimming of paper salvage, the washing of used bottles or used jars, the washing of used tins, the breaking of scrap metal, the drying of rabbit skins, the making or repairing of sacks or bags, the willowing, pulling, scouring, carbonising or putting down mixings of textile waste.
- (4) The operations of receiving, packing, compressing, teagling, craning, despatching, or warehousing when carried on in association with or in conjunction with any of the above-mentioned operations.

#### BUT EXCLUDING—

- (a) Any of the above-mentioned operations when carried on in the establishment in which the waste materials are produced or in which they are used as raw materials for further manufacture.
- (b) The making or repairing of sacks or bags when carried on in a factory or workshop engaged solely or mainly in the making or repairing of sacks or bags.
- (c) The collecting, sorting, grading or drying of rabbit skins when carried on in an establishment in which such operations are the main or principal business, or when carried on in association with or in conjunction with any business establishment, branch, or department engaged in the manufacture of hatters' furs.
- (d)—(i) The collecting, sorting, or grading of cotton waste when carried on in an establishment in which such operations are the main or principal business.
  - (ii) Any of the operations included in paragraphs (1), (2), (3) and (4) above (other than the operations specified in paragraph (d)—(i) above) when carried on in or in association with or in conjunction with any establishment of the kind specified in sub-paragraph (1) above.

Provided that notwithstanding anything contained in this Notice the above minimum Rates shall NOT apply to Male Workers who are engaged in the loading or discharging of water-borne craft in any section of the Trade.

PART V.  
GENERAL PROVISIONS.

SECTION I—

The Minimum Rates of Wages must be paid clear of all deductions, other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any superannuation or other provident fund.

SECTION II—

The above Minimum Rates of Wages are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages or to agreements made or that may be made for the payment of wages in excess of the Minimum Rates.

PART VI.

Cancellation of GUARANTEED TIME RATES for Female Piece Workers.

The Guaranteed Time Rates for Female Piece-Workers fixed by the Trade Board and set out in the Schedule to their Notice D. B (3), dated 15th February, 1922, which became effective as from 1st March, 1922, are cancelled as from 31st July, 1922.

## (A) FOR WORKERS EMPLOYED ON TIME-WORK.

(1) For the first two hours of Overtime on any day, except Sunday and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Quarter times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, TIME-AND-A-QUARTER.

(2) For Overtime after the first two hours of Overtime on any day, except Sunday and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Half times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, TIME-AND-A-HALF.

(3) For all time worked on Sunday and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be Twice the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, DOUBLE-TIME.

(4) For all hours worked in any week in excess of 48 the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Quarter times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, TIME-AND-A-QUARTER, except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are payable under the provisions of paragraphs (2) and (3) of Sub-Section (A) of this Section.

The Overtime Rates shall be payable where on any day (not being a Sunday or a Customary Public or Statutory Holiday) the number of hours worked exceeds nine, or, in the case of Saturday, exceeds five, notwithstanding that the number of hours worked in the week does not exceed 48.

Provided that where it is or may become the established practice of an employer to require attendance only on five days a week, the Overtime Rates shall only be payable on such days after 9½ hours have been worked.

## (B) FOR FEMALE WORKERS EMPLOYED ON PIECE-WORK:—

(i) All Female Workers employed on

Piece-Work shall receive in respect of each hour of overtime worked, IN ADDITION TO PIECE-RATES, each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an ORDINARY worker, not less than the Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate applicable:—

(a) AN AMOUNT EQUAL TO ONE-QUARTER OF THE APPROPRIATE PIECE-WORK BASIS TIME-RATE,

(b) AN AMOUNT EQUAL TO ONE-HALF OF THE APPROPRIATE PIECE-WORK BASIS TIME-RATE, or

(c) AN AMOUNT EQUAL TO THE FULL AMOUNT OF THE APPROPRIATE PIECE-WORK BASIS TIME-RATE,

according as the Overtime Rate which would have been payable under the provisions of paragraph (A) of this Section, if the worker had been employed on Time-Work, were—

(a) TIME-AND-A-QUARTER,

(b) TIME-AND-A-HALF, or

(c) DOUBLE-TIME, respectively.

(i) folding (or hooking), cutting, machining, turning;

(ii) brushing, selecting, mending;

(iii) branding, tarring, bundling;

(B) The warehousing of, the packing of, and similar operations in regard to sacks or bags of the kind mentioned above when carried on in association with or in conjunction with the making or repairing thereof;

(C) The warehousing of, the packing of, and similar operations in regard to any other articles when carried on in or in association with or in conjunction with any business, establishment, branch or department mainly engaged in any of the operations mentioned in paragraph (B) above;

but excluding:—

(i) any of the operations mentioned above

when carried on in association with or in conjunction with the weaving of jute, flax or hemp, or the dyeing, bleaching or finishing of jute, flax or hemp yarn or cloth;

(ii) any of the operations mentioned above when carried on in or in association with or in conjunction with any business, establishment, branch or department mainly engaged in a business in which the sacks or bags are used as containers for other articles the production or sale of which forms part of the business;

(iii) the making of rope-bound coal or coke sacks when carried on in association with or in conjunction with any business, establishment, branch or department engaged in the making of made-up textile articles other than sacks or bags, whether rope-bound or not, of the kind mentioned;

(iv) any of the operations mentioned in paragraph (B) above when carried on in or in association with or in conjunction with any business, establishment, branch or department mainly engaged in the warehousing of, the packing of, and similar operations in regard to made-up textile articles other than sacks or bags, whether rope-bound or not, of the kind mentioned;

(v) operations included in the Trade Boards (Waste Materials Reclamation) Order, 1920.

#### PART V.

The above Minimum Rates of Wages must be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any Superannuation or other Provident Fund.

The Trade Board established in Great Britain under the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, for that branch of the Box Trade in

Great Britain which is engaged in the making of boxes or parts thereof made wholly or partially of paper, cardboard, chip or similar material, have given notice, as required by Section 4 (3) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, of the making of an Order by the Minister of Labour dated 24th July, 1922, and of the contents of such Order, confirming the variation by the Trade Board of General Minimum Time-Rates, Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates and Overtime Rates for Male and Female Workers, the Minimum Rates as Varied to be operative for periods dependent upon the Cost of Living Index Figure, and the cancellation of a Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate in its application to certain classes of Male Workers, and specifying the 1st August, 1922, as the date from which the variation and cancellation of such minimum rates should become effective.

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

*Application of Part I of the Sheep (Double Dipping) Order of 1920.*

1.—(1) Part I (*Restriction on Movement of Sheep out of a Movement Area*) of the Sheep (Double Dipping) Order of 1920 is hereby applied to an Area comprising the administrative county of Cardigan, hereinafter referred to as "the Area."

(2) This article shall come into operation on the twenty-first day of August, and shall cease to operate on the thirtieth day of September, nineteen hundred and twenty-two.

*Restrictions on Exposure of Sheep at Markets, &c., within the Area during the Period from 21st August to 30th September.*

2.—(1) Sheep on any premises in the Area shall not (except as hereinafter provided) be permitted to enter, or be exposed for sale or exhibition in, any market, fairground, saleyard or place of exhibition in that Area during the period from 21st August to 30th September in the current year, unless they have since the 15th July in the current year been dipped twice on separate dates with an interval of not less than ten and not more than fourteen days between the two dates, and are accompanied by a declaration signed by the owner of the sheep, or his agent authorised in writing for this purpose, stating that the sheep have been so dipped, and the dates of dipping, and that since the second dipping the sheep have been kept separate as far as practicable while in the Area from other sheep not so dipped.

(2) An Inspector of the Local Authority acting under the direction of the Local Authority, may grant an exemption, subject to such conditions (if any) as may be specified therein, exempting sheep in the Area from one or both of the dippings in any particular case in which the Inspector is satisfied that it is impracticable or inexpedient to dip the sheep. In any such case the reasons for granting the exemption shall be stated therein, and the Local Authority shall forthwith cause a copy of the exemption to be forwarded to the Ministry. If the Minister considers that the exemption is for any reason undesirable, and directs the revocation thereof, the same shall thereupon cease to operate, but not so as to affect the previous operation of the exemption.

*Special Provision as to Fat Sheep for immediate Slaughter.*

3. Where an Inspector of the Local Authority is satisfied that any sheep in his District in the Area are intended for immediate slaughter, and that it is impracticable or inexpedient that the same should in accordance with this Order be dipped before exposure for sale or exhibition, he may, subject to any directions by the Local Authority, by licence authorise the movement of the sheep to any market, fairground, saleyard or place of exhibition in the Area, subject to such conditions (if any) as are inserted in the licence, and thereupon the sheep may, in accordance with such licence and conditions, be exposed for sale in the market, fairground, saleyard or place of exhibition free from any restrictions imposed by any Order of the Minister relating to Sheep Scab or Sheep Dipping; provided that an Inspector of the Local Authority shall not issue any such licence for movement to premises in the District of another Local Authority unless the consent of such Local Authority, either generally or in the particular instance, has been previously obtained.

*Offences.*

4. If a sheep is permitted to enter or is exposed for sale in any market, fairground, saleyard, or place of exhibition, in contravention of this Order, the occupier of the premises, and the owner and person in charge of the sheep, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

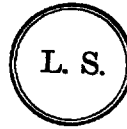
