IRISH ANIMALS ORDER OF 1922.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Control of Movement of Cattle and Sheep from Irish Animals Landing Places.

1. Cattle and sheep landed at any Irish Animals Landing Place in Great Britain shall not be moved therefrom except in accordance with the following provisions of this Order.

2. Cattle and sheep shall not be moved from an Irish Animals Landing Place except with a licence granted by an Inspector of the Ministry, and then only to

(a) A market, fairground or saleyard specially authorised by the Ministry for the sale of animals moved from an Irish Animals Landing Place (hereinafter referred to as "a special market "), or

(b) premises other than a market, fairground, saleyard or slaughterhouse; or

(c) a slaughterhouse.

Conditions attaching to Markets at Specially Authorised Premises.

3.—(1) At a special market no animals shall be exposed for sale other than cattle and sheep moved from an Irish Animals Landing Place with a licence under this Order.

(2) Cattle and sheep exposed at a special market shall not be removed therefrom except with a further licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the district in which

the special market is held, and then only to premises other than a market, fairground or saleyard.

Conditions attaching to Licences Authorising Movement as in Article 2 (b) and 2 (c) and in Article 3.

4.—(1) Cattle and sheep moved to premises other than a market, fairground or saleyard from an Irish Animals Landing Place or from a special market shall on arrival at the place of destination specified in the licence be detained therein for a period of thirteen days after arrival thereat, unless the animals are slaughtered on the premises before the expiration of that period.

(2) Cattle shall not be moved from an Irish Animals Landing Place with a licence under this Order unless and until they are marked by and at the expense of the owner or his agent by the clipping of a broad arrow \uparrow about six inches long, on the left hindquarter of each of the cattle, if the place of destination specified in the licence is a special market or private premises other than a slaughterhouse, and on the right hindquarter of each of the cattle if the place of destination is a slaughterhouse.

Provisions as to Licences and Movement.

5.—(1) A movement licence granted under this Order shall be available for four days, inclusive of the date thereof, and no longer.

(2) A copy of every licence granted under this Order shall forthwith be sent by the Inspector granting the same to the Local Authority of the District in which the special market or other place of destination is situate, and also to the occupier of the place of destination, except where the place of destination is a special market.

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(3) In the case of every movement of animals authorised by a licence under this Order the licence shall accompany the animals throughout the movement, and shall be produced on demand to an Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority, or a Police Constable.

(4) A licence authorising movement to a special market shall be delivered up to a person appointed by the Local Authority to receive such licences at the entrance to the market, fairground or saleyard. Every other licence shall forthwith, after completion of the movement, be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest police station in the same District by the person in charge of the animals at the time of completing the movement.

(5) Animals moved with a licence under this Order shall, so far as is practicable, be moved by rail and be kept separate from all animals which are not being so moved. When being moved by road the animals shall be moved without unnecessary delay to the place of destination specified in the licence.

In the case of animals moved by rail the animals shall not be untrucked for any purpose until they reach the destination station from which they are to be moved to the premises specified in the licence, except that animals may be untrucked for the purpose of feeding or watering within railway station premises, provided that any dock, pen or other part of the railway premises used for this purpose is disinfected in the manner prescribed in Article 7 of this Order both immediately before and after each occasion of such use.

Movement of Animals subject to other Orders or Regulations.

6. Nothing in this Order shall be deemed to authorise the movement of an animal in contravention of any other Order of the Minister or any Regulation of a Local Authority prohibiting or regulating the movement of animals into their District.

Disinfection of Railway Trucks and Railway Loading Banks.

7.--(1) A railway truck or other railway vehicle used for the conveyance of any animals from an Irish Animals Landing Place shall, immediately before any such animal is placed in it, be thoroughly sprayed with liquid disinfectant, under the supervision and to the satisfaction of the Inspector of the Ministry at the Landing Place.

(2) A railway loading bank or loading dock used for the loading of Irish animals at an Irish Animals Landing Place for conveyance therefrom shall, when required by an Inspector of the Ministry at the Landing Place, be thoroughly sprayed with liquid disinfectant.

(3) The liquid disinfectant to be used for the purposes of this Article shall be-

(a) A one per cent. (minimum) solution of chloride of lime containing not less than thirty per cent of available chlorine; or

(b) a five per cent. (minimum) solution of carbolic acid (containing not less than ninety-five per cent. of actual carbolic acid); or

(c) a disinfectant equal in disinfective efficiency to the above-mentioned solution of carbolic acid.

(4) Nothing in this Article shall interfere with the operation of the provisions of the Animals (Transit and General) Order of 1912 as to the cleansing and disinfection of railway trucks and other railway vehicles used for the conveyance of animals on a railway.

Offences.

8. If anything is done or omitted to be done in contravention of this Order, the owner and the person for the time being in charge of the animal, or, in respect of Article 7, the railway company loading the animals or owning the loading banks in respect of which, as the case may be, the same is done or omitted to be done, shall, each according to and in respect of his or their own acts or omissions, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Interpretation.

9. Slaughterhouse means any premises where animals are habitually slaughtered. Other terms, unless the context otherwise requires, have the same meaning as in the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Revocation.

10. The Animals (Landing from Ireland) Order of 1922 (No. 7) is hereby revoked.

Commencement.

11. This Order shall come into operation on the thirty-first day of August, nineteen hundred and twenty-two.

To provide that any consolidated stock and redeemable stock substituted for existing ordinary stock shall be held on the same trusts and for the same purposes and in the same manner as the stock for which it is substituted, and that transfers of existing ordinary stock shall, after the date of conversion, take effect as transfers of the appropriate amounts of consolidated stock and redeemable stock or one of such stocks (as the case may be).

To authorize the directors to appoint one or more of their number to be a managing director or managing directors of the Company, and to provide for the remuneration of any managing directors so appointed, and that they shall not be liable to retirement by rotation, and to authorize the delegation to them of all or some of the powers of the directors.

To provide for notice of the candidature of persons for election as directors and of opposition to the re-election of retiring directors, and that in the absence of such notice persons shall not be eligible for election as a director or shall not be entitled to oppose the re-election of a retiring director.

To empower the Company to use for the manufacture and storage of gas and the manufacture, working up and conversion of residual products the following lands (that is to say):—

Lands in the parish of St. Mary Stoke, in the Borough of Ipswich and County of Suffolk, bounded on the west in part by Wherstead Road and in other part by land and garden belonging or reputed to belong to Sarah Frances King, on the north in part by lands used for allotments belonging or reputed to belong to Sir Arthur Charles Churchman, Baronet and in other part by the River Orwell, on the east by the said River Orwell and on the south in part by that river and in other part by land and garden belonging or reputed to belong to the said Sarah Frances King,

and to empower the Company to purchase and work up and convert residual products.

To provide that any meters, fittings, stoves, engines, apparatus or appliances let for hire by the Company shall remain the property of and removable by them notwithstanding that they be fixed to the premises in which they are situate.

To empower the Company in any case in which they have cut off the supply of gas owing to the default of the consumer to recover from him the cost of reconnection in case he desires to resume the supply and to relieve the Company from the obligation to supply gas to him until he has paid such cost.

To authorize the Company to purchase, take on lease or erect houses and buildings for per-

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sons in their employ and offices, showrooms and other buildings, and to maintain and let any such houses or buildings.

To authorize the directors to make superannuation and other allowances and to pay gratuities and pensions to officers and servants of the Company in such circumstances as may be described in the Order, and to subscribe or make donations to hospitals and similar institutions and to exhibitions and to the superannuation, benevolent and sick funds of the employees of the Company, and to apply the funds and revenues of the Company for the said purposes or any of them.

To empower the Company to acquire and use licences or other authorities to work patents in connection with their undertaking.

To authorize the Company or the directors thereof to establish a scheme of co-partnership for their employees, and to provide for the allocation to or for the benefit of the employees participating in any scheme of co-partnership established under powers to be conferred by the Order or otherwise of moneys out of the funds and revenue of the Company.
