## TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS AND TREASURY BONDS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 15th September, 1922, at 1 o'clock, for

(a) Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877; the National Debt Act, 1889; and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919; and

(b) £4 10s. per cent. Treasury Bonds, repayable at par on the 15th April, 1932.

2. The maximum amount of Treasury Bills and Treasury Bonds to be issued will be £45,000,000. The amount of Treasury Bonds issued will not exceed £5,000,000, but, subject to that limit, the total amount issued will be divided between Bills and Bonds in such proportions as Their Lordships may determine.

### TREASURY BILLS.

3. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 18th September, 1922, to Saturday, the 23rd September, 1922, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

5. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

### £4 10s. PER CENT. TREASURY BONDS, 1932.

6. The Bonds will be in denominations of £50, £100, £200, £500, £1,000 and £5,000. They will be exempt from Corporation Profits Tax, and will in all respects rank *pari passu* with those issued under the Prospectus of the 21st April, 1922. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 18th September, 1922, to Saturday, the 23rd September, 1922, inclusive; the first dividend payable on the 15th October, 1922, will represent in the case of each Bond interest to that date from the date of the Bond.

7. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bonds required are to be dated and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one shilling), which will be given

for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bonds of different dates.

8. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

9. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills or Bonds are to be dated.

10. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills and Bonds.

11. Tenders must be made on the printed forms, which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

12. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

A note was addressed to His Majesty's Acting Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs by the Norwegian Chargé d'Affaires in London on the 17th July last, stating that the Norwegian Government considered that the Treaty between Great Britain, France, Germany, Norway and Russia respecting the Independence and Integrity of Norway, signed at Christiania on the 2nd November, 1907, had lapsed as far as Great Britain, France and Norway were concerned, as it was incompatible with the terms of the Covenant of the League of Nations, and that, as regards Germany and Russia, the Treaty had lost its principal basis owing to events which have occurred since it was signed.

2. A note was addressed by the Marquess Curzon of Kedleston to the Norwegian Chargé d'Affaires on the 22nd ultimo, stating that His Majesty's Government agreed to consider the Treaty to be no longer in force.

Under and by virtue of the powers conferred upon the Clearing Office and the Administrator by Article I. (XIV.) of the Treaty of Peace (Austria) Orders, 1920-1921, I hereby prescribe the 30th (thirtieth) day of December, 1922, as the final date by which proofs by British nationals of debts due to them by Austrian nationals or of pecuniary obligations of the Austrian Government under Article 248 of the Treaty of Saint Germain-en-Laye and other claims by British nationals against the Austrian Government, with the payment of which the property rights and interests within His Majesty's Dominions or

Protectorates belonging to nationals of the former Austrian Empire at the date when the said Treaty came into force (not being property rights or interests acquired under any general license issued by or on behalf of His Majesty), and the net proceeds of their sale, liquidation or other dealings therewith are charged by Article I. (IX.) of the above mentioned Orders in Council, must be made upon the prescribed forms and lodged with this Department in order to rank for payment of the first dividend to be declared by me out of the above mentioned property rights and interests belonging to nationals of the former Austrian Empire.

1. The limits of age for this situation are 15 and 17. Candidates must be within the prescribed limits of age on the day of the examination.

2. Candidates will be required to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners:—

It will be within the authority of the Postmaster-General to decline to employ a candidate successful in the Examination if he is not satisfied on enquiry that the candidate complies with this requirement.

6. Candidates must be at least 5 feet in height.

7. Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to attend the Examination before the commencement of the competition.

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF  
AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 23RD AUGUST 1922.)

REGULATION OF MOVEMENT OF  
SWINE ORDER OF 1922.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

CHAPTER I.

*Restriction of Movement of Swine out of Scheduled Area.*

1. Swine shall not be moved out of the Area described in the First Schedule hereto, hereinafter referred to as "the Scheduled Area," except in accordance with the provisions of this Order authorising such movement.

*Provision for Movement out of Scheduled Area from Markets.*

2.—(1) Swine may be removed from a market, fairground or saleyard in the Scheduled Area to the following premises outside that area, namely:—

(a) to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse if the swine are intended for immediate slaughter, provided that they are marked before the movement commences in the manner described in Article 11 of this Order, and are accompanied by a licence (Form C); or

(b) to premises, other than a market, fairground or saleyard, if accompanied by a licence (Form A). Swine so moved shall be subject to the conditions as to subsequent movement, detention, and isolation specified in Article 4 of this Order.

(2) Licences under this Article may be granted without the production of a declaration (Form B).

*Provision for Movement out of Scheduled Area from Premises other than Markets, etc.*

3.—(1) Swine may be moved from premises in the Scheduled Area, other than a market, fairground or saleyard, to the following premises outside that Area, namely:—

(a) a bacon factory or slaughterhouse, or a market, fairground or saleyard, if the swine are intended for immediate slaughter, provided that they are marked before the movement commences in the manner described in Article 11 of this Order, and are accompanied by a licence (Form C). Swine so moved to a market, fairground or saleyard shall be moved therefrom only to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse or back to the premises from which the swine were moved to the market, fairground or saleyard.

(b) any other premises (except a market, fairground or saleyard) if accompanied by a licence (Form A). Swine so moved with a licence (Form A) shall be subject to the conditions as to subsequent movement, detention and isolation specified in Article 4 of this Order.

(2) Before a licence (Form A) or (Form C) is granted under this Article the owner of the swine, or his agent authorised in writing for this purpose, shall sign and deliver or send by post to the Inspector a declaration (Form B). The Inspector shall retain the declaration, and before granting the licence thereon shall satisfy himself as far as practicable as to the correctness of the statements contained therein.

*Detention and Isolation at Destination of Swine moved out of Scheduled Area with Licence (Form A).*

4.—(1) Where swine are moved with a licence (Form A) under the preceding Articles 2 and 3 the swine shall not, for a period of 28 days after arrival at the place of destination specified in the licence, be moved therefrom except to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse, and then only if the swine are marked before the movement commences in the manner described in Article 11 of this Order, and are accompanied by a licence (Form C).

(2) Swine while detained under this Article shall be kept separate from all other swine.

(3) This Article does not prohibit the movement of the carcass of a pig slaughtered on the premises during the said period of 28 days.

*Special Provision for Movement for Breeding Purposes.*

5. Swine may also be moved out of the Scheduled Area if accompanied by a licence (Form C) granted under this Article expressly for the movement of swine for breeding purposes, or for the purpose of the return movement of swine which have been moved for breeding purposes into the Scheduled Area from premises outside that area. The licence in such cases shall be granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which are situate the premises within the Scheduled Area from which the swine are to be moved, and shall be marked by the Inspector granting the same "For Breeding Purposes." A licence so marked shall be available for 28 days inclusive of the date thereof. If required for the purpose of service, the swine referred to therein may be moved on two occasions within the said period of 28 days under the authority of the licence. No such licence (Form C) shall be granted without the production to the Inspector of a declaration (Form B) by the occupier of the premises within the Scheduled Area from which the swine are to be moved, or by his agent authorised in writing for this purpose.

*Movement out of Scheduled Area for Shipment.*

6. Swine may be moved out of the Scheduled Area in any vessel for shipment, or to any premises in Great Britain for detention until shipment and thence to a vessel, if the swine during such movement are accompanied by a licence (Form C) authorising such movement, which may be granted only on production of a declaration (Form B).

*Provision for Movement to and from Agricultural Shows.*

7. Swine may be moved from any premises in the Scheduled Area to an agricultural show outside the Area, or from an agricultural show in the Area to a place of destination outside the Area, if the swine are accompanied

by a licence (Form C) authorising such movement granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the district in which such show is held, or by some person specially authorised by the said Local Authority to grant such licences. In the case of movement to and from such shows the licence required may be granted without the production of a declaration (Form B).

#### CHAPTER II.

##### *Regulation of Markets, etc., in Scheduled Area.*

8. No sale of swine shall be held in any market, fairground, or saleyard in the Scheduled Area unless it is authorised by the Local Authority of the district under this Order (which authority the Local Authority are hereby empowered to grant) or is specially authorised under the Swine-Fever (Movement from Ireland) Order of 1904, or any Order amending it.

##### *Regulation of Movement of Swine from Markets, etc., or Pig-Dealer's Premises, in Scheduled Area.*

9. Swine shall not be moved from any market, fairground or saleyard in the Scheduled Area, or from premises in that Area in the occupation of, or used by, any pig-dealer, except in accordance with the following provisions of this Article:—

(1) If the market or saleyard is specially authorised by the Local Authority under the Swine-Fever (Movement from Ireland) Order of 1904, or any Order amending it, swine may, while the premises are being used for the purposes of that Order, be moved therefrom only to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse and only if accompanied by a licence (Form C). The swine shall, before the movement commences, be marked in the manner described in Article 11 of this Order.

(2) Swine may be moved from any other market, fairground or saleyard, or from premises in the occupation of, or used by, any pig-dealer, in the Scheduled Area, either:—

(a) To any bacon factory or slaughterhouse if the swine are marked before the movement commences in the manner described in Article 11 of this Order, and are accompanied by a licence (Form C); or

(b) To any premises, except a market, fairground or saleyard, either within or outside the Scheduled Area, if accompanied by a licence (Form A).

(3) Swine moved with a licence (Form A) shall not, for a period of 28 days after arrival at the place of destination specified in the licence, be moved therefrom except to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse, and then only if the swine are marked before the movement commences in the manner described in Article 11 of this Order and are accompanied by a licence (Form C). Swine while detained under this Article shall be kept separate from all other swine. This Article does not prohibit the movement of the carcass of a pig slaughtered on the premises during the said period of 28 days.

(4) Licences under this Article may be granted without the production of a declaration (Form B).

#### CHAPTER III.—General.

##### *Provision for Movement through Scheduled Area.*

10.—(1) This Order shall not prevent or affect the movement of swine through the Scheduled Area by railway direct from and to places outside the Area if the swine are not untrucked within the Area except for the purpose of feeding and watering within railway premises where such untrucking takes place.

(2) Where swine are moved out of the Scheduled Area for the sole purpose of transit to a place of destination within the Area, or where they have been moved into the Area for the sole purpose of transit to a place of destination outside the Area, the swine shall be accompanied by a licence (Form C) authorising such movement granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the swine are when the movement commences. The licence shall specify the route to be taken, as well as the place of destination to which the swine are to be moved. The swine so moved shall not be subject to any restrictions imposed by this Order.

##### *Marking of Swine.*

11. Where swine are required by this Order to be marked they shall be marked by and at the expense of the owner by the painting with an indelible composition of red colour of a broad line down the back and another broad line across the loins of each of the swine, thus +, each line being not less than nine inches long.

##### *General Provisions as to Movement.*

12.—(1) Swine while being moved under the authority of a licence granted under this Order shall so far as is practicable be kept separate from all swine which are not being so moved, and shall be moved from the premises from which they are by the licence authorised to be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay to the place of destination specified in the licence and not elsewhere. Where swine are moved with a licence under this Order to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse they shall be there detained until they are slaughtered.

(2) Nothing in this Order shall be deemed to authorise the movement of swine which are in a Swine-Fever Infected Place or of swine the movement of which is prohibited by any other Order of the Minister or by notice served by an Inspector of a Local Authority or of the Ministry under any Order of the Minister.

##### *Granting of Movement Licences.*

13.—(1) Except where it is otherwise expressly provided movement licences granted under this Order shall be granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the district in which the premises from which the swine are to be moved under the licence are situated.

(2) A movement licence granted under this Order shall not be available if granted by the owner of the swine to be moved, or by his agent, or by the consignee of the swine, or by the occupier of the farm or premises or slaughterhouse from or to which the swine are

to be moved or by any individual member of an Executive Committee or Sub-Committee of a Local Authority.

(3) A movement licence shall not be granted by an Inspector if, in his opinion, it is undesirable to grant it.

*Duration of Movement Licences.*

14. Movement licences granted under this Order shall, except as provided in Article 5, be available for eight days, including the day of the date thereof, and no longer.

*Copies of Movement Licences to be sent to Local Authority of Place of Destination.*

15. A copy of a licence which authorises movement of swine to premises in a District other than the District for which the person granting the licence acts as Inspector shall forthwith be sent by the Inspector to the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination specified in the licence is situate.

*Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.*

16. Licences shall be produced by the person in charge of the swine moved therewith on demand to an Inspector or to a Constable, and such person shall, if required by such officer, give his name and address.

*Delivery of Licences after Completion of Movement.*

17.—(1) Where swine are moved with a licence under this Order the licence shall, except as provided in the following paragraph, forthwith after completion of the movement be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Station in the same District by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing the said movement.

(2) In the case of a licence (Form C) granted expressly for breeding purposes the licence shall be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Station in the same District by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing the movement or movements, and in any case not later than the day after the expiration of the period of 28 days for which the licence is available.

*Forms.*

18. Licences and declarations required or authorised by this Order shall be in the forms set forth in the Second Schedule hereto or to the like effect.

*Local Authority to enforce Order.*

19. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

*Offences.*

20.—(1) If a pig is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the pig, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the pig is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2) If a person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives

a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(3) If any person fails to deliver up or send a licence as required by this Order, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(4) If a pig is not isolated as required by this Order, the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the occupier of the place where the pig is detained, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(5) If any person, with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order, by washing or in any other manner, takes out, effaces or obliterates or attempts to take out, efface or obliterate any mark painted on any pig for the purposes of this Order, the person doing the same, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the same to be done, and the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

*Interpretation.*

21. In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires—

“Pig Dealer” means a person habitually engaged in the trade or business of selling swine (other than swine bred by him), but does not include a person who as auctioneer sells swine which are the property of another person

“Bacon factory” means premises in which the business of a curer of bacon is carried on:

“Slaughterhouse” means any premises where animals are habitually slaughtered:

“Person” includes any body of persons corporate or unincorporate:

“Inspector” includes Veterinary Inspector:

“The Minister” and “The Ministry” mean the Minister and Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries:

“The Act of 1894” means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Act of 1894.

*Revocation of Orders.*

22. From and after the commencement of this Order the Orders described in the Third Schedule hereto, and any existing Order applying the provisions of any of those Orders with or without modifications to any Scheduled Area in Great Britain, are hereby revoked.

*Commencement.*

23. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of October, nineteen hundred and twenty-two.

*Short Title.*

24. This Order may be cited as the REGULATION OF MOVEMENT OF SWINE ORDER OF 1922.

**CONDITIONS TO BE OBSERVED.**

1. The swine must not, for a period of twenty-eight days after arrival at the place of destination specified herein, be moved therefrom, except as provided below. The swine, while so detained, must be kept separate from all other swine.

2. The swine may, however, at any time during that period be moved direct to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse, if they are marked on the back with a red cross before the movement commences in the manner prescribed by Article 11 of the Regulation of Movement of Swine Order of 1922, and are accompanied by a Licence (Form C) obtained from an Inspector of the Local Authority. The Order does not prohibit the movement of the carcass of any pig slaughtered on the premises during the period of the 28 days' detention.

*To be printed as Indorsement on Licence (Form A).*

The Regulation of Movement of Swine Order of 1922 contains provisions to the following effect:—

1. The swine must be accompanied by this Licence, and be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay. The swine must be moved to the place of destination specified in this Licence and not elsewhere, and must during the movement be kept separate as far as practicable from all other swine.

2. This Licence must forthwith, after completion of the movement, be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Station in the same district by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing the movement.

3. The swine must not, for a period of 28 days after arrival at the place of destination, be moved therefrom, except as provided in the next following paragraph. During the period of 28 days' detention the swine must be kept separate from all other swine. The Order does not prohibit the movement of the carcase of any pig slaughtered on the premises during that period.

4. The swine may, during the period of 28 days' detention, be moved to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse provided that they are marked on the back with a red cross before the movement commences in the manner described in Article 11 of the Order, and are accompanied by a Licence (Form C).

5. This Licence is not available if it is granted by the owner of the swine to be moved, or by his agent, or by the consignee of the swine, or by the occupier of the farm or premises or slaughterhouse from or to which the swine are to be moved, or by any individual member of an Executive Committee or Sub-Committee of a Local Authority.

*Caution.*—Persons acting without a Licence where a Licence is necessary, or acting thereon after the Licence has expired, or counterfeiting, fabricating, or altering, or obtaining or endeavouring to obtain a Licence by means of a false pretence, or granting or issuing a Licence, knowing the same to be false in any respect, or committing other offence with respect to a Licence, are liable, under the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, to fine and imprisonment.

1. The swine must be accompanied by this Licence, and must be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay. The swine must be moved to the place of destination specified in this Licence and not elsewhere, and must during the movement be kept separate, as far as practicable, from all other swine.

2.—(a) The swine, if intended for immediate slaughter, must be marked by and at the expense of the owner by the painting with an indelible composition of red colour of a broad line down the back and another broad line across the loins of each of the swine thus †, each line being not less than nine inches long.

(b) Where swine are moved under this Licence from premises within the Scheduled Area to a market, fairground, or saleyard outside the Scheduled Area, the swine must be marked for slaughter in the manner described in the preceding paragraph (a), and the swine can be moved from the market, fairground, or saleyard only to a bacon factory or slaughter-house, or back to the premises from which the swine were moved to the market, fairground, or saleyard.

(c) The swine, after their arrival at any bacon factory or slaughter-house specified in this Licence, must be there detained until they are slaughtered.

3. The conditions contained in the preceding paragraph 2 do not apply where this licence is granted for the movement of swine for breeding, or shipment, or exhibition at an agricultural show.

4. This Licence must forthwith, after completion of the movement, be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Station in the same District by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing the movement.

5. This Licence is not available if it is granted by the owner of the swine to be moved, or by his agent, or by the consignee of the swine, or by the occupier of the farm or premises or slaughter-house from or to which the swine are to be moved, or by any individual member of an Executive Committee or Sub-Committee of a Local Authority.

*Caution.*—Persons acting without a Licence where a Licence is necessary, or acting thereon after the Licence has expired, or counterfeiting, fabricating, or altering, or obtaining or endeavouring to obtain a Licence by means of a false pretence, or granting or issuing a Licence knowing the same to be false in any respect, or committing other offence with respect to a Licence, are liable, under the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, to fine and imprisonment.
