The Secretary of State for India in Council has appointed Mr. Charles Richard Edwards to superintend the transfer of lascars at Brixham on 4th October, 1922, only, and to grant the certificate required under section 125 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894 (57 and 58 Vic., cap. 60).

THE ROADS ACT, 1920.

COUNTY OF WESTMORLAND.

Notice is hereby given, that on the Twentieth day of September, 1922, the Minister of Transport made an Order under Section 7 (4) of the Roads Act, 1920, in respect of certain roads in the county of Westmorland.

The Order, which will come into force on the 12th October, 1922, and will remain in force for a period of five years, is to the following effect:—

(a) No person shall drive, or cause to be driven, on the highways or portions of highways specified in the First Schedule hereto any locomotive, any heavy motor-car (as defined by Article II of the Heavy Motor Car Order, 1904), or any motor-car with seats for more than fourteen persons exclusive of the driver;

(b) No person shall drive or cause to be driven on the highways or portions of highways specified in the Second Schedule hereto any mechanically propelled vehicle which has an unladen weight exceeding three tons or which has seats for more than twenty persons exclusive of the driver;

(c) Nothing in the Order shall prevent the driving upon the highways or portions of highways specified in the Schedules hereto (hereinafter referred to as "the said roads") of—

(i) Any vehicle which is being used for the purposes of agriculture in connection with land adjoining or lying near to the said roads;

(ii) Any vehicle which is being used for the conveyance of goods or merchandise to or from any house, building or other premises situate on or adjacent to the said roads; or

(iii) Any vehicle which is being used in connection with the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the said roads.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

High House Road from Natland to the Kendal-Burton road.

Hawes Lane from Natland to the Kendal-Milnthorpe Road.

Farleton Lane from the Kendal-Burton road at the Duke of Cumberland Inn, Farleton, to the Kendal-Lupton-Kirkby Lonsdale road near Cow Brow.
