At the Court at *Buckingham Palace*, the 13th day of *October*, 1922.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 9th day of October, 1922 (C.W. 18960/21), in the words following, viz.:—

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine thereon, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased by Your Order in Council bearing date the 30th day of September, 1914, to authorize us to increase the numbers of the various classes and ranks in Your Majesty's Naval, Marine and Reserve Forces during the recent hostilities:

“And whereas Officers of certain branches entered for temporary service have been trans-

ferred to the permanent lists and it is necessary that regulations should be laid down governing the conditions of such transfer:

“And whereas it is also necessary to continue the entry of Instructor Officers authorized by Your Majesty's Order in Council of the 13th July, 1915, and to define the conditions of their transfer to the permanent list:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased to authorize us to continue the entry of Instructor Officers accordingly, and to approve the regulations set forth in the annexed Schedule.

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.

“ SCHEDULE.

“Temporary Medical Officers of the Royal Navy and the Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve, Temporary Instructor Officers, and Temporary Chaplains of the Church of England, to be eligible, at the discretion of the Admiralty, for transfer to the permanent lists of the Royal Navy, and Temporary Officers Royal Marines to be similarly eligible for transfer to the permanent list of the Royal Marines, subject to the following conditions:—

“(a) *Medical Officers transferred from the Temporary List.*

(i) To reckon seniority from the date of entry for temporary service for purposes of promotion and full, unemployed and

half pay, Officers entered on the same day being placed in the order in which they applied for entry;

(ii) to reckon service for retired pay as from the same date, but to reckon service for gratuity on withdrawal or retirement if retired before becoming eligible for retired pay as from the date of their transfer to the permanent list;

(iii) to lose all rights and privileges as temporary Medical Officers as from the date of transfer to the permanent service.

“(b) *Medical Officers transferred from the Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve.*

(i) To reckon seniority as from the date of their commissions in the Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve, or from the 2nd August, 1914, whichever is the later date, for purposes of promotion and full, unemployed and half pay, Officers entered on the same day being placed in the order in which they applied for entry;

(ii) to reckon service for retired pay as from the same date, but to reckon service for gratuity on withdrawal or retirement, if retired before becoming eligible for retired pay, as from the date of transfer to the Royal Navy;

(iii) to lose all rights and privileges as Officers of the Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve as from the date of transfer to the permanent list of the Royal Navy.

“(c) *Instructor Officers entered during the war.*

(i) To reckon seniority as from the date of entry for temporary service for purposes of promotion and full, unemployed and half pay;

(ii) to reckon service for retired pay from the same date;

(iii) to reckon service from the same date for the purpose of withdrawal or retirement with gratuity, if retired before becoming eligible for retired pay and further to be eligible, subject to deduction of the war gratuities paid to them, for gratuities of £200 after two years' total service, £300 after three years' total service, or £400 after four years' total service as provided in Order in Council of the 13th April, 1918, if permitted to withdraw before completing 12 years' total service.

“(d) *Instructor Officers entered after the war.*

(i) To reckon seniority as from date of entry for temporary service for purposes of promotion and full, unemployed and half pay;

(ii) to reckon service from the same date for retired pay and for retirement with gratuity after 12 or 16 years' service, but to cease on transfer to the permanent list to be eligible for the gratuities of £200, £300 and £400 authorized for temporary Officers after two, three and four years' service respectively.

“(e) *Chaplains, Church of England.*

(i) To reckon seniority as from the date of entry for temporary service for the purposes of full, unemployed and half pay and allowances, Officers entered on the same day being placed in the order in which they applied for entry;

(ii) to reckon service for retired pay as from the same date, but to reckon service for withdrawal or retirement with gratuity if retired before becoming eligible for retired pay as from the date of their transfer to the permanent service;

(iii) to lose all rights and privileges as temporary Chaplains as from the date of transfer to the permanent service.

“(f) *Officers, Royal Marines.*

(i) To reckon seniority for promotion as from dates to be determined by the Admiralty with due regard to the seniority of Officers whose first entry was for permanent service;

(ii) to reckon seniority for purposes of full, unemployed and half pay in the rank of Lieutenant as from the date of entry for temporary service;

(iii) to reckon service for purposes of retired pay or retirement with gratuity as from the date of entry for temporary service;

(iv) to lose all rights and privileges as temporary Marine Officers as from the date of transfer to the permanent service.”

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas, owing to the increased number of Stoker ratings employed during the late war, and the reduced requirements of Your Majesty's Fleet under post-war conditions a large surplus of Stoker Petty Officers and Leading Stokers resulted:

“And whereas it has been considered desirable to reduce the number of ratings to the establishment estimated to be necessary for the year 1921-22 and to effect such reduction by discharging surplus ratings with bonus at the undermentioned scales, viz.:—

Stoker Petty Officers £130.

Leading Stokers £100.

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that

Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction this arrangement.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence therein."

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 9th day of October, 1922 (C.W. 18960/21), in the words following, viz. : —

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas it is provided by Order in Council dated the 31st day of July, 1835, that no person shall be appointed a Chaplain in Your Majesty's Navy whose age shall exceed 35 years, and in Order in Council dated the 22nd day of February, 1870, Section III, Clause 4, that the appointments of Clergymen allowed to take temporary service in the Navy shall be as 'Acting Chaplains for Temporary Service':

"And whereas we are of opinion that suitable candidates over the age of 35 should be eligible for entry as Chaplains of the Church of England in special cases when it is not possible to fill vacancies in the Establishment by suitable Chaplains of the prescribed age:

"And whereas the designation as 'Acting Chaplain' of Chaplains entered for temporary service gives rise to difficulties in respect of the award of increments of full pay, etc., for which they are eligible but for which acting time does not normally count:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to authorize us at our discretion to enter Chaplains over the age of 35, and to approve of Chaplains entered for temporary service being granted commissions as 'Temporary Chaplains' and not designated 'Acting Chaplains for Temporary Service.'

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in the latter proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with

the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased by Your Order in Council bearing date the 2nd day of August, 1918, to approve of temporary commissions as Acting Chaplains being issued during the period of hostilities to Ministers of Religious Bodies not in conformity with the Church of England who were rendering full time service in the Royal Navy:

"And whereas we are of opinion that the grant of temporary commissions to such Ministers should be continued under the same conditions in time of peace, and that they should be designated 'Temporary Chaplains' and not 'Acting Chaplains':

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to authorize us to continue the grant of commissions to such Ministers accordingly, with effect as from the 1st day of September, 1921, subject to the regulations set forth in the annexed Schedule.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal.

"SCHEDULE.

"1. Commissions as Temporary Chaplains to be granted at the discretion of the Admiralty to Ministers of Religious Bodies not in conformity with the Church of England rendering whole time service in the Royal Navy.

"2. Chaplains so commissioned to be subject to the Regulations applicable to Chaplains on the permanent list of the Royal Navy in regard to full pay and allowance.

"3. All whole time service under the Admiralty during the war to count as qualifying service for purposes of increase of full pay and allowances under Article 660 of King's Regulations and Admiralty Instructions.

"4. Such Chaplains to be ineligible for unemployed pay or half pay during unemployment."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with

the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas by Your Order in Council bearing date the 20th June, 1922, Your Majesty was pleased to sanction the payment of Pensioner Naval Recruiters, as from the 1st July, 1922, at a flat rate of 12s. a day to cover all expenses, except kit, with additional allowances of 1s. a day to men employed in the London District, and 1s. a day to the Senior Headquarters Recruiter of each district:

“And whereas we consider it expedient that the foregoing rate of pay should be revised in the case of Pensioner Naval Recruiters appointed or re-appointed as such on or after the 11th July, 1922:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the payment of Pensioner Naval Recruiters appointed or re-appointed as such on or after the 11th July, 1922, at a flat rate of 10s. a day to cover all expenses except kit, together with the additional allowances aforesaid.

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal.”

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being, or having been, an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas by the Naval Forces Act, 1903, it is enacted that the Admiralty shall have power to raise and maintain a force to be called the Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve and that any volunteer enrolled under this Act when serving for training afloat or called out for actual service, shall be deemed to be serving in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force within the meaning of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865:

“And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased by Your Orders in Council bearing dates the 19th day of December, 1913, and the 8th day of November, 1918, to sanction the establishment of the rank of Surgeon Sub-Lieutenant, R.N.V.R.:

“And whereas we deem it expedient to revise the rate of pay of Officers of this rank:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the payment of Probationary Sub-Lieutenants and Surgeon Sub-Lieutenants, R.N.V.R. while serving in H.M. Ships or Establishments, whether for obligatory or voluntary training, or on being called out for Active Service, at the uniform rate of 10s. a day irrespective of seniority, in lieu of the rate of pay and special allowance hitherto authorized.

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal.”

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS His Majesty has been pleased to approve a change in the Constitution of the Army Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The Secretary of State is to be responsible to His Majesty and Parliament for all the business of the Army Council. All business other than business which the Secretary of State specially reserves to himself is to be transacted in the following principal sub-divisions:—

(a) The Under-Secretary of State shall be responsible to the Secretary of State for the administration of business affecting the

Territorial Army Associations and War Department Lands, and for so much of the other business of the Army Council as may be assigned to him, from time to time, by the Secretary of State.

(b) The First Military Member of the Army Council (the Chief of the Imperial General Staff), the Second Military Member of the Army Council (the Adjutant-General), the Third Military Member of the Army Council (the Quartermaster-General), and the Fourth Military Member of the Army Council (the Master-General of Ordnance) shall be responsible to the Secretary of State for the administration of so much of the business relating to the organisation, disposition, personnel, armament, and maintenance of the Army, as may be assigned to them, or each of them, from time to time, by the Secretary of State.

(c) The Finance Member of the Army Council shall be responsible to the Secretary of State for the finance of the Army and for so much of the other business of the Army Council as may be assigned to him, from time to time, by the Secretary of State.

(d) The Secretary of the War Office shall be Secretary, and a Member, of the Army Council and responsible to the Secretary of State for the preparation of all official communications of the Council and for the interior economy of the War Office: he shall also be responsible, on his appointment as Accounting Officer of Army Votes, Funds and Accounts, for the control of expenditure and for advising the Secretary of State and the Administrative Officers at the War Office and in Commands on all questions of Army expenditure.

He shall further be charged with such other duties as may be assigned to him, from time to time, by the Secretary of State.

So long as there are two Joint Secretaries of the War Office, one of them will be appointed to exercise all the financial functions above mentioned.

2. This Order in Council shall be substituted for the Order in Council dated 10th day of June, 1921.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by section sixty-nine of the Government of Ireland Act, 1920, His Majesty is empowered by Order in Council to make such regulations as seem necessary or proper for setting in motion the Parliaments and Governments of Southern and Northern Ireland, and also for any other matter for which it seems to His Majesty necessary or proper to make provision for the purpose of bringing the said Act into full operation or for giving full effect to any of the provisions of the said Act, and in particular His Majesty is empowered amongst other things, by any such Order in Council—

(1) To make such adaptations of any enactments so far as they relate to Ireland as may appear to Him necessary or proper in order to give effect to the provisions of the said

Act; and also to make any adaptations of any enactments so far as they relate to England or Scotland as may appear to Him necessary or proper as a consequence of any change effected by the provisions of the said Act; and

(2) to make such adaptation of any enactments as appear to Him necessary or proper with respect to the execution of services with respect to which the Parliaments of Southern Ireland and Northern Ireland have not power to make laws, and in particular to provide for the exercise or performance of any powers or duties in connection with those services by any department of the Government of the United Kingdom or officer of that Government where any such powers or duties are, under any existing Act or by the common law, to be exercised or performed by any department or officer in Ireland who will cease to exist as a department or officer of the Government of the United Kingdom:

And whereas by the Government of Ireland (Adaptation of Enactments) (No. 3) Order, 1922, the Land Law (Ireland) Acts, in their application to Northern Ireland, were modified and adapted in the manner therein appearing, and it is expedient that the said Acts should be further modified and adapted in their application to Northern Ireland:

And whereas the provisions of section one of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, have been complied with:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Government of Ireland (Adaptation of Enactments) (No. 4) Order, 1922, and shall come into operation as from the date hereof in accordance with the provisions of section two of the Rules Publication Act, 1893.

(2) The Interpretation Act, 1889, applies to the interpretation of this Order in like manner as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

2. This Order shall be read as supplemental to the Government of Ireland (Adaptation of Enactments) (No. 3) Order, 1922, and the modifications and adaptations set out in this Order shall have effect as from the date of this Order save where inconsistent with the Government of Ireland Act, 1920, or the provisions of any subsequent Order in Council under that Act, and subject, as respects matters within the powers of the Parliament of Northern Ireland, to repeal or alteration by Acts of that Parliament.

3.—(1) The functions of a judicial commissioner with respect to appeals and rehearings under the Land Law (Ireland) Acts shall in Northern Ireland be discharged by such judge of the Supreme Court of Judicature of Northern Ireland as may be nominated in that behalf by the Lord Chief Justice of Northern Ireland, and that judge shall, for the purposes of such appeals and rehearings, have all the powers, jurisdiction, and authority under the said Acts of the judicial commissioner appointed under the Land Law (Ireland) Act, 1881, and also the powers in relation to rules and orders which, by Part III of the Irish Land Act, 1903, are conferred on the judicial commissioners.

(2) In the application of the Land Law (Ireland) Acts to Northern Ireland, references to a judicial commissioner where they occur in con-

nection with such appeals or rehearings shall be construed as references to a judge so nominated, and article twenty-seven of the Government of Ireland (Adaptation of Enactments) (No. 3) Order, 1922, shall have effect subject to this provision.

WHEREAS by the Maintenance Orders (Facilities for Enforcement) Act, 1920, provision has been made for the enforcement in England and Ireland of maintenance orders made by any Court in any part of His Majesty's dominions outside the United Kingdom to which the said Act extends:

And whereas by the said Act it is amongst other things provided that where His Majesty is satisfied that reciprocal provisions have been made by the Legislature of any part of His Majesty's dominions outside the United Kingdom for the enforcement within that part of maintenance orders made by Courts within England and Ireland, His Majesty may by Order in Council extend the said Act to that part, and thereupon that part shall become a part of His Majesty's dominions to which the said Act extends:

And whereas by the said Act it is further provided that His Majesty may by Order in Council extend the said Act to any British Protectorate and that where so extended the said Act shall apply as if any such Protectorate was a part of His Majesty's dominions to which the said Act extends:

And whereas His Majesty is satisfied that the Legislature of the British Protectorate hereinafter mentioned has made reciprocal provisions for the enforcement within that Protectorate of maintenance orders made by Courts within England and Ireland:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers by the above recited Act in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

The Maintenance Orders (Facilities for Enforcement) Act, 1920, shall apply to the British Protectorate hereunder mentioned:—

British Solomon Islands Protectorate.

GENERAL LICENCE, DATED 13TH OCTOBER, 1922, GRANTED BY THE TREASURY UNDER SECTION 2 OF THE GOLD AND SILVER (EXPORT CONTROL, ETC.), ACT, 1920 (10 & 11 GEO. 5, c. 70), FOR THE MELTING DOWN OF SILVER COIN OTHER THAN COIN CURRENT IN THE UNITED KINGDOM.

The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of the power vested in Them by Section 2 of the Gold and Silver (Export Control, etc.), Act, 1920, hereby grant a general licence authorising all persons, notwithstanding anything in the said section, to melt down silver coin other than coin current for the time being in the United Kingdom.

REGULATIONS RESPECTING COMPETITIVE EXAMINATIONS FOR APPOINTMENTS IN THE FOREIGN OFFICE AND DIPLOMATIC SERVICE.

1. Candidates will be required to appear before a Board of Selection which will meet at the Office of the Civil Service Commission on the first Tuesday in May, and will decide which candidates possess suitable qualifications for entry into the Foreign Office or Diplomatic Service in order to enable them to compete at the examination prescribed below. Candidates may appear before this Board of Selection at any time after they have attained the age of nineteen; but a candidate who is not recommended for acceptance by the Board of Selection may not appear before that Board for interview a second time unless he is specifically notified after his first appearance that the Board will be prepared to see him again.

2. (i) Candidates must have attained the age of 22 and must not have attained the age of 25 on the first day of August in the year in which the Examination is held. In reckoning age for competition, candidates who have served in the Army, Navy or Air Force between the 4th August, 1914, and the 11th November, 1918, may deduct from their actual age any period of service between the 4th of August, 1914, and the 31st December, 1919.

(ii) No person will be eligible who obtained from any tribunal established under the Military Service Acts, 1916 to 1918, exemption from service in His Majesty's Forces under those Acts on the ground of a conscientious objection to the undertaking of military service, or, although not so exempted, declined to

comply with obligations imposed upon him by those Acts.

3. Candidates must be natural-born British subjects, and born within the United Kingdom or in one of the self-governing Dominions of parents also born within those territories, except when the circumstances are such as to justify a departure from the general rule, in which case they can be allowed to compete by special permission of the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, provided they fulfil the conditions of the rule in respect of nationality prescribed for candidates for admission to His Majesty's Civil Service as a whole, viz.:—

6. Candidates will be required to reach a high standard in subject 54 (French, translation, free composition, set composition, and conversation); they will also be required to qualify in the translation test of a second living language taken in Section B, or, if two living languages are not taken in Section B, to qualify in Subject 5.

7. The auxiliary language, in Section A or Section C will be tested by means of translation from the language. The following languages may be offered:—German, Italian, Spanish, Portuguese, Dutch, Norwegian, Swedish,

Danish, Russian, Latin, Ancient Greek; provided that—

(a) No Candidate offers any language twice in the examination.

(b) No Candidate offers in Section A and C together two languages of the group Italian, Spanish, Portuguese, or two of the group Norwegian, Swedish, Danish.

(c) Only a Candidate who takes two modern languages in Section B may offer Latin or Ancient Greek as an auxiliary language.

8. In subjects 50 to 65 the civilization subject associated with a language can only be taken by candidates who offer the language itself for examination.

9. A Candidate desiring to offer any of the subjects 30 to 42 or subject 47 must produce evidence satisfactory to the Commissioners of laboratory training in an institution of univer-

sity rank. For Astronomy (28), Geography (43), Physical Anthropology (44), and Agriculture (46), other equivalent training will be required. There will be no laboratory test as a part of the examination.

10. From the marks assigned to Candidates in each subject such deduction will be made as the Civil Service Commissioners may deem necessary in order to secure that no credit be allowed for merely superficial knowledge.

11. Moreover, if a Candidate's handwriting is not easily legible, a further deduction will, on that account, be made from the total marks otherwise accruing to him.

12. Application for permission to attend one of these Examinations must be made in the writing of the Candidate, at such times and in such manner as may be fixed by the Commissioners.

13. A fee of £8 will be required from every Candidate attending an examination.

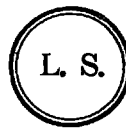

NEWCASTLE-UPON-TYNE MARKETS
(SWINE FEVER) ORDER OF 1922.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Regulation of Markets, etc.

1. No sale of swine shall be held in any market, fairground, or saleyard in the City of Newcastle-upon-Tyne unless it is authorised or licensed by the Local Authority of the City for the purposes of this Order.

Special Facilities for Movement of Swine to Markets, etc., in the City of Newcastle-upon-Tyne.

2. Notwithstanding the provisions of the Regulation of Movement of Swine Order of 1922, swine intended for immediate slaughter may be moved from any market, fairground, or saleyard in the Scheduled Area to which that Order applies to any market, fairground, saleyard or lair in the City of Newcastle-upon-Tyne authorised or licensed by the Local Authority of the City under this Order or any other Order of the Minister relating to Swine Fever if they are accompanied by a licence in the Form C set forth in the Second Schedule to that Order granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the district in which the market, fairground, or saleyard from which the swine are to be moved is situate. A copy of every licence granted under this Article shall forthwith be sent by the Inspector granting the same to the Town Clerk, Newcastle-upon-Tyne.

Movement of Swine from Authorised Markets or Licensed Lairs in the City of Newcastle-upon-Tyne.

3.—(1) Swine shall not be moved from any authorised or licensed market, fairground, or saleyard in the City of Newcastle-upon-Tyne except to authorised or licensed lairs within the City or to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse, and then only if accompanied by a licence authorising the movement granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the City of Newcastle-upon-Tyne.

(2) Swine shall not be moved from authorised or licensed lairs in the City of Newcastle-upon-Tyne except to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse or to an authorised or licensed market in the City, and then only if they are accompanied by a Movement Licence granted under this Order by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the City.

(3) Swine moved with a licence under this Order from an authorised or licensed market,

fairground, saleyard, or lairs in the City of Newcastle-upon-Tyne shall be subject to the following conditions, namely:—

(i) The swine shall, before movement, be marked by and at the expense of the owner by the painting with an indelible composition of red colour of a broad line down the back and another broad line across the loins of each of the swine, thus +, each line being not less than nine inches long.

(ii) The swine shall be moved, by railway so far as is practicable, to the lairs, bacon factory or slaughterhouse specified in the Licence, and during such movement shall not be permitted to come in contact with swine not marked under this Article.

(iii) The Licence shall be in force for eight days inclusive of the day of issue, and shall specify the name and address of the person to whom the Licence is granted and the name or description of the destination to which the swine are to be moved.

(iv) The Local Authority of the City of Newcastle-upon-Tyne shall cause a copy of the Licence to be sent forthwith to the Local Authority of the District into which the swine are to be moved.

(v) Where the place of destination is a bacon factory or slaughterhouse the swine shall, after their arrival at the bacon factory or slaughterhouse, be there detained until they are slaughtered, but where the bacon factory or slaughterhouse specified in the Licence is situate in the District of the Local Authority of the County of Northumberland the swine shall be slaughtered thereat within eight days after the date on which the Licence authorising the movement was issued. This requirement shall be specified in the Licence.

(vi) Where the place of destination is a bacon factory or slaughterhouse the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination is situate shall take such steps as are necessary to insure that the swine are moved to the bacon factory or slaughterhouse specified in the Licence and are duly slaughtered there.

Revocation.

4. The Orders described in the Schedule to this Order are hereby revoked.

Commencement.

5. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-third day of October, nineteen hundred and twenty-two.
