Madrid, March 20. N. S.

HE King of Spain continues in very good Health; He went yesterday in a publick Procession to a Convent of Cordelier Friers; and was this day at Cafa del Canyro to take the Air. The Letters from Cadiz of the 10th Instant give an account, that 16 Ships of the Flota from New-Spain are safely arrived in that Bay, and one is still wanting (the Commander's Name Corta Bracos) which is faid to be taken by the French; An Indulta of 4 per Cent. is laid upon the Silver and other Merchandizes brought home in the Flota. Vice-Admiral Evertz sailed from Cadiz the 7th Instant with 9 Durch Men of War, and about 40 Sail of Merchant Ships under their Convoy, bound home; and they will call at Lisbon and O-Porto for the Ships there. The 8th arrived; at Cadiz the Oxford and Soldadoes Prize, with the Merchant Ships from Alicant; and on the 9th came in the Trumbull Galley in 40 days from Smirna, and the Laurel from Barcelona. New Levies are making in this Kingdom to augment our Army in Catalonia.

Corunna, March 31. The 26th Instant arrived here the Spanish-Expedicion Pacquet-Boat in 3 days from Falmouth; and will fail again to morrow.

Naples, March 5. The Duke de Medina Celi, our Viceroy, has remitted 120000 Crowns to Cata-lonia, for the Expences of the War; Which Sum has been advanced by the Farmers of the King of Spain's Revenues in this Kingdom. Our Galleys are fitting out, as likewise the Squadron commanded by the Duke of Turfis, which are to join with the rest of the Spanish Galleys, and to serve on the Coast of Caralonia this Summer; Whither they talk likewise of sending some Land Forces from hence. The Popes and Maltese Galleys are thortly expected at Messia, where they will join together, and so proceed to the Levant to allist the

Venice, March 22. A great Convoy lies ready to fail for the Levant, staying only for a fair Wind; and another is preparing against the beginning of the next month; The Supplies of Men, Money, and Provisions, that are designed to be sent thither, will put the Fleet and Army of this State in a Condition, to make some considerable Attempr upon the Enemy. The last Advices from Turkey say, the Reports that came from Europe of the Ne-gotiation for a General Peace among the Christian Princes, did very much alarm the Octoman Court, and that the French Ambassador was under a great difficulty how to fatisfie them about it. The Sultan continues his Resolution of going into the Field again the next Summer; but the Assistance he must give the Tartars against the Moscovites, will divert a great Body of his Troops from the Service they were designed for in Hungary.

Dantzicke; March 27. The Elector of Branden-burgh is now at Coningsberg in Praffia, and intends to continue there till the Election in Poland is over; His Electoral Highness has sent an Envoy this ther; and 'tis faid he has Orders to contribute alk he can to the Promotion of Prince Lewis of Baden. Envoys are likewise arrived at Warsaw from the Elector Palatin, and the Duke of Lorrain; and Interests are making for both these Princes. The Queen uses her utmost Endeavours on behalf of her Son Prince James; and the French Ambassador employs the Money fent him from France, to advance the Prince of Conti. The Contention of so many Parties gives much Disturbance to the Publick; But above all the ill success of the Commission of Lembergh, which was ser on foot in order to diffolve the Confederacy of the Troops in Up. per-Poland, gives great uneatiness to the Primate and the Senators, who were to meet at Warfam the: 26th of "this month, to consider of proceeding by: Force to disperse the said Troops, seeing all other. Means employed for this purpose have proved in-effectual. Reports have been spread about, that this Confederacy is underhand encouraged by Prince James, which though altogether groundless, are cherished by his Enemies, and made use of to his prejudice. In the mean time the Bishop of Passaw, Ambassador from the Emperor, is impatiently expected at Warfam by the Friends of Prince James, who promise themselves great Support and Assistance from him.

Vienna, March 23. The Preparations for the next Campagne both in Hungary and on the Rhine, are very great; and the Officers that were here, are all gone to their several Commands. The Emperor has not yet declared who shall command his Army against the Turks under the Elector of Saxony; General Caprara, who had this Post the last year, defiring to be excused on account of his great Age and Infirmities. Letters from Peter-Waradin of the 13th of this month give an account, that a Party of that Garifon had made an Incursion as far as the Save, and had brought back several Prifoners, who say, Preparations are making at Belgrade for the Reception of the Grand Signior against his arrival there before the opening of the Campagne, and particularly, that a new Apartment is building for him

Cologne, April 2. N. S. The Deputies of the Circle of Westphalia continue their Meeting in this City, to Regulate Matters concerning the Troops they are to turnish for the Service of the Empire; The like is done by the rest of the Circles, purfuant to the Refolutions taken at their last general Meeting at Francfort. Great Care is taken to supply the Garisons of Mentz, Coblents, and other Places on the Rhine, with all that is necessary for their Defence, the Enemies Preparations giving ground to believe, that they intend to make fome great Effort on that side this Summer.
