WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and eleven, section five, do hereby grant out of the Common Fund under our control the sum of one hundred and twenty-three thousand seven hundred and seventy pounds payable to the Incumbents of the Benefices named in the Schedule to a Report of our Estates Committee, dated the thirteenth day of July, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-two, adopted at our General Meeting of the twenty-seventh day of July, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-two, in the amounts to the same Incumbents therein respectively assigned by way of special augmentation of the incomes of these Benefices for the one year ending the thirty-first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-two, in accordance with a scheme of grants on the ground of the present high cost of living set out in the Regulations issued by us and dated the second day of March, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-two.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and eleven, section five, do hereby subject as hereinafter mentioned, grant and convey to the Incumbent of the Rectory of Evesbatch, in the county of Hereford, and in the Diocese of Hereford and to his successors Incumbents of the same Rectory, all and singular the yearly tithe commutation rent-charges which are particularly described in the Schedule hereunto annexed and now vested in us: To have and to hold the said yearly tithe commutation rent-charges to the use of the said Incumbent and his successors for ever. Provided always that the Incumbent for the time being of the same Rectory of Evesbatch shall be entitled to receive from us, or on our account, the net amount of the rents profits and proceeds of the said yearly tithe commutation rent-charges for and in respect of the period intervening between the first day of October, in the year one thousand nine hundred and twenty-two, and the date of the publication of these presents in the London Gazette.
