THEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 20th day of October, 1922 (N.P. (4) 893/22), in the words follow-

ing, viz.:—
"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas the Regulations for the government of Your Majesty's Naval Service preclude the award of the Naval Long Service and Good Conduct Medal to native ratings,

other than Europeans, who first entered the Royal Navy on or after the 1st January, 1904:

And whereas we consider it desirable that the native ratings who are at present so debarred should be allowed to receive the Good Conduct Medal, as a mark of appreciation of

long and faithful service:
"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council, to authorize us to award, at our discretion, the Naval Long Service and Good Conduct Medal, without gratuity, to those Native ratings whose records of service and character conform to the requirements of the Regulations governing the award of that Medal.

Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Com-

missioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

"This Act shall come into operation on

the 1st day of July, 1915:
"Provided that His Majesty may, by Order in Council, from time to time postpone the coming into operation of this Act for such period, not exceeding on any occasion of postponement one year, as may be specified in the Order ":

And whereas by divers Orders in Council the coming into operation of the said Act has been from time to time postponed, and now stands postponed, by virtue of an Order in Council of the 20th day of June, 1922, until

the 1st day of January, 1923:

And whereas His Majesty deems it expedient that the provisions of the said Act should be

further postponed:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, in pursuance of the powers vested in Him by the aboverecited provision and of all other powers Him thereunto enabling, doth order, and it is

hereby ordered, that the provisions of the Merchant Shipping (Convention) Act, 1914, shall be postponed from coming into operation until the 1st day of July, 1923.

"Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Redhill is at present exercised alternately by the Rector or Incumbent for the time being of the Rectory of the Parish of Havant, in the said County of Southampton and in the said Diocese of Winchester, and by the Rector or Incumbent for the time being of the Rectory of the Parish of Warblington, in

the said County and Diocese:

"And whereas the Reverend Harold Nickinson Rodgers, Rector or Incumbent of the said Parish of Havant, and the Reverend William Burrell Norris, Rector or Incumbent of the said Parish of Warblington, are desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Redhill now vested in them as aforesaid, as such Rectors or Incumbents, should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop for the time being of the said Diocese

of Winchester:

Notwithstanding the provisions of the Regulation of Movement of Swine Order of 1922, swine intended for immediate slaughter may be moved from any market, fairground or saleyard in the Scheduled Area to which that Order applies, to Water Street Market, in the City of Manchester, if they are accompanied by a licence in the Form C set forth in the Second Schedule to that Order granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the district in which the first mentioned market, fairground or saleyard is situated. A copy of every licence granted under this Article shall forthwith be sent by the Inspector granting the same to the Town Clerk, Manchester.

Movement of Swine from Water Street Market for Slaughter only.

- 2. Swine shall not be moved from Water Street Market except to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse and unless they are accompanied by a licence authorising the movement granted by an Inspector of the Bocal Authority of the City of Manchester. Swine so moved shall be subject to the following conditions, namely:
 - (i) The swine shall before movement be marked by and at the expense of the owner by the painting with an indelible composition of red colour of a broad line down the back and another broad line across the loins of each of the swine, thus +, each line being not less than nine inches long.

(ii) The swine shall be moved by railway so far as is practicable to the bacon factory or slaughterhouse specified in the licence, and during such movement shall not be permitted to come in contact with swine not

marked under this Article.

(iii) The licence shall be in force for eight days inclusive of the day of issue, and shall specify the name and address of the person to whom the licence is granted and the name or description of the bacon factory or slaughterhouse to which the swine are to be moved.

(iv) The Local Authority of the City shall cause a copy of the licence to be sent forthwith to the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination is situate in any case in which that place is outside the

(v) The swine shall after their arrival at the bacon factory or slaughterhouse be there

detained until they are slaughtered.
(vi.) The Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination is situate shall take such steps as are necessary to insure that the swine are moved to the bacon factory or slaughterhouse specified in the licence, and are duly slaughtered there.

Revocation.

3. The Order dated the thirtieth day of July, nineteen hundred and eight, relating to the movement of swine to Water Street Market, Manchester, is hereby revoked.

COUNTY-BOROUGH OF BIRKENHEAD.

- Bye-laws and Regulations made by the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the County-Borough of Birkenhead, at a Meeting of the Town Council, held on Wednesday, the fourth day of October, 1922, with respect to the Tramways under the powers conferred upon them by the Tramways Act, 1870, and the Motor Omnibuses as defined by the Birkenhead Corporation Act, 1914, under the powers conferred upon them by that Act.
- 1. From and after date of these Bye-laws coming into force the Bye-laws and Regulations with respect to Tramways made and passed by the Corporation of the Borough of Birkenhead at a Meeting of the Town Council, held on the 5th day of June, 1901, shall be repealed, but any proceedings pending at the time of such repeal may be continued and prosecuted as if such repeal had not taken effect. This repeal shall not operate so as to revive any bye-laws or regulations which were repealed by the repealed bye-laws and regulations.
- 2. The bye-laws and regulations hereinafter set forth shall extend and apply to all carriages of the Corporation and to all vehicles authorised by the Corporation used upon the Tramways for conveyance of passengers, and to all Motor Omnibuses for conveyance of passengers, and to all places with respect to which the Corporation have powers to make bye-laws and regulations.
- 3. The expression "conductor" shall include any officer or servant in the employment of the Corporation in connection with their Tramways or Motor Omnibuses; the expression "carriage" shall mean any tramcar, motor omnibus or vehicle of any kind whatsoever for the conveyance of passengers owned or run by the Corporation under the powers contained in any Act hereinbefore mentioned or referred to; and the expression "motor omnibuses" shall have the meanings attached to the expression "motor omnibus" in the Birkenhead Corporation Act, 1914. The word "person" does not include the conductor. The word "passenger" includes intending

- passenger. The inclusion of any additional words in any bye-law shall not have the effect. of limiting any definition in this bye-law contained.
- 4. Every passenger shall enter or depart from a carriage by the hindermost or conductor's platform, if any, and not otherwise (except where the carriage is constructed for entrance or exit of passengers from the driver's end on the near side, or for any other reason the construction of the carriage does not so permit). When a carriage stops no person shall board the carriage until all passengers desiring to alight therefrom shall have done so.
- 5. No person shall enter, mount or leave, or attempt to enter, mount or leave any carriage in motion.
- 6. No person, except a passenger, shall enter or mount any carriage.
- 7. When any carriage contains the full number of passengers which it is authorised to carry, no additional passenger shall enter, mount or remain in or on any such carriage when warned by the conductor not to do so.
- 8. No person (other than a passenger desiring to alight) shall climb over or under or remove or disturb any gate, chain or barrier on any carriage.
- 9. No person other than the conductor shall travel on the steps or platforms of any carriage or stand on the upper deck or sit or stand on the railings, guards, dashboards or buffers, or hold on hang on by or to any part of any carriage, and any person so travelling, standing, sitting or holding on shall cease to do so immediately on request by the conductor.
- 10. No person shall change or remove the route indicators or destination boards, or interfere with the controllers, brakes, lights, bells, switches, ventilators, trolley cord, or any part of a carriage or its appliances, machinery, mechanism or equipment, or signal a carriage to start.
- 11. No passenger shall smoke or carry a lighted pipe, cigar or cigarette in or on any carriage, except in a compartment or portion, if any, set aside for smoking, and no person shall spit in, on, or from any carriage.
- 12. No person shall swear or use obscene or offensive language whilst in or upon any carriage, or commit any nuisance in, upon, from, or against any carriage or any tramway station, tramway waiting room, or tramway premises used in connection with the Corporation's passenger services, or distribute, in or upon any carriage, bills, leaflets, or books, or in any way wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger.
- 13. No passenger or other person shall, while travelling in or upon any carriage, sing, or sound, play, or perform upon any musical instrument.
- 14. A person in a state of intoxication shall not enter or mount upon any carriage, and if found in or upon any carriage shall leave the carriage immediately on being requested to do so by the conductor.
- 15. A person whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of the conductor, soil or injure the linings or cushions of the carriage, or the dress or clothing of any passenger, or who, in the opinion of the conductor, might for any reason, whether of the like nature or not, be offensive to passengers, shall not mount, enter,

or remain on or in any carriage, and may be prevented from so doing, and, if found on or in any carriage, shall, on request of the conductor, leave the same upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned; Provided that on carriages specially run for artisans, mechanics and daily labourers, no person shall be prevented from entering or remaining in or on a carriage under the provisions of this bye-law, on the ground of the condition of his dress or clothing, if such condition is solely due to the nature of his employment.

16. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil, or damage the cushions or linings or remove or deface any lamp, number, number plate, printed or other notice in or on any carriage, or break, scratch, or mark in any way whatsoever any window, paint or varnish of, or in any way whatsoever wilfully damage, any carriage. Any person acting in contravention of this regulation shall be liable to pay the amount of any damage done, in addition to the penalty prescribed by these bye-laws and regulations.

17. Each passenger shall, either on demand or before leaving the carriage (whichever first happens), pay to the conductor, or other duly authorised officer of the Corporation, the fare for his journey, and shall accept a ticket for such fare. Any person travelling beyond the destination for which he has paid his fare shall pay a fresh fare from the point to which such fare was available, and shall accept a ticket for such fresh fare.

18. Each passenger shall show his ticket (if any) when required so to do to the conductor, inspector, or other duly authorised servant of the Corporation, and shall also, when required so to do, either deliver up his ticket or pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by such passenger.

19. Tickets shall not be transferable from person to person, and (except special tickets for transfer to another carriage) shall only be available on the carriage and for the journey for which they are issued, but this bye-law shall not apply to prevent any passenger who holds a return ticket from using the same in accordance with the terms of its issue.

20. A person holding a special ticket for transfer to another carriage shall complete his journey by the first available carriage upon which there is accommodation.

21. A passenger not being an artisan, mechanic or daily labourer, shall not use or attempt to use any ticket intended only for artisans, mechanics or daily labourers.

22. Personal or other luggage (including tools of artisans, mechanics or daily labourers) may (if there is in the opinion of the conductor room) be carried in or upon any carriage, provided such luggage is placed in or on the carriage where and as the conductor may require, but the conductor may decline to take any luggage which, from its size or otherwise is not, in the opinion of the conductor, suitable for conveyance in or upon any carriage.

23. No person shall place upon any carriage or travel in or on any carriage with any loaded firearm, or any article, instrument, implement or substance which is or may be likely to cause a nuisance or likely to soil or damage any

carriage or the person or clothing of any passenger or which is or may be dangerous.

24. It shall not be incumbent upon the conductor of a carriage to stop the same for the purpose of taking up or setting down passengers except at such places as may be appointed by the Corporation for the purpose.

25. No person shall in any way wilfully impede or interfere with the traffic of the tramcars used on any of the tramways of the Corporation.

26. No dog or other animal whatsoever shall be taken into or on any carriage except with the permission of the conductor. Any dog or other animal whatsoever found in or on any carriage in breach of this bye-law shall be removed by the person in charge of such dog or other animal from the carriage immediately upon request by the conductor, and in default of compliance with such request such dog or other animal may be removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

27. If at any time a carriage becomes disabled or in any way damaged, or if from any cause in the opinion of the conductor it is impracticable or undesirable to proceed with passengers, the passengers shall, upon request of the conductor, leave the same. If such passengers have paid their fares they shall not be entitled to demand back the amount of their fares so paid, but on production of their tickets shall be entitled to travel by the next available carriage the remainder of the distance in respect of which they have paid their fares. No person shall, except with the leave of the conductor, enter a disabled or damaged carriage.

28. No passenger or other person shall wilfully obstruct or impede any officer or servant of the Corporation in the execution of his duty in, upon, or in connection with any carriage of the Corporation.

29. Any person who shall commit whilst in or on any carriage any breach of these bye-laws and regulations shall, if the offence is continued, be liable, in addition to incurring the penalty hereinafter provided, to be immediately removed from the carriage by or under the direction of the conductor, and if such person shall have paid his fare he shall not, subject to bye-law 15, be entitled to claim its return.

30. Any person offending against or committing a breach of any of these bye-laws and regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings for each offence.

31. There shall be placed and kept placed in a conspicuous position inside the lower saloon of each carriage in use a printed copy of these bye-laws and regulations.

These bye-laws and regulations shall come into force on the first day of January, 1923.
