LOANS BY PUBLIC WORKS LOAN COMMISSIONERS
TO PUBLIC UTILITY SOCIETIES.

WHEREAS by an Instrument dated the 24th day of August, 1922, the Minister of Health, with the consent of the Treasury and in exercise of the powers conferred on him by sub-section (2) of Section 20 of the Housing, Town Planning, &c. Act, 1919, specified the period from the 31st day of July, 1919, up to and including the 30th day of September, 1922, as the period for the purpose of the said sub-section;

AND WHEREAS it is expedient to extend the period specified in the said Instrument:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Minister of Health, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon him by sub-section (2) of Section 20 of the Housing, Town Planning, &c. Act, 1919, and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf and with the approval of the Treasury hereby specifies the period from the 31st day of July, 1919, up to and including the 31st day of December, 1922, in lieu of the period specified in the said Instrument of the 24th day of August, 1922, as the period for the purpose of the said sub-section.

FOOT - AND - MOUTH DISEASE
INFECTED PLACE.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

The premises mentioned in the Schedule hereto are hereby declared to be a place infected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease.

MANCHESTER (WATER STREET
MARKET) (SWINE FEVER) ORDER
OF 1922.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

*Special Facilities for Movement of Swine to
Water Street Market.*

1. Notwithstanding the provisions of the Regulation of Movement of Swine Order of 1922, swine intended for immediate slaughter may be moved from any market, fairground or saleyard in the Scheduled Area to which that Order applies, to Water Street Market, in the City of Manchester, if they are accompanied by a licence in the Form C set forth in the Second Schedule to that Order granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the district in which the first mentioned market, fairground or saleyard is situated. A copy of every licence granted under this Article shall forthwith be sent by the Inspector granting the same to the Town Clerk, Manchester.

*Movement of Swine from Water Street Market
for Slaughter only.*

2. Swine shall not be moved from Water Street Market except to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse and unless they are accompanied by a licence authorising the movement granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the City of Manchester. Swine so moved shall be subject to the following conditions, namely:—

(i) The swine shall before movement be marked by and at the expense of the owner by the painting with an indelible composition of red colour of a broad line down the back and another broad line across the loins of each of the swine, thus +, each line being not less than nine inches long.

(ii) The swine shall be moved by railway so far as is practicable to the bacon factory or slaughterhouse specified in the licence, and during such movement shall not be per-
