

mitted to come in contact with swine not marked under this Article.

(iii) The licence shall be in force for eight days inclusive of the day of issue, and shall specify the name and address of the person to whom the licence is granted and the name or description of the bacon factory or slaughterhouse to which the swine are to be moved.

(iv) The Local Authority of the City shall cause a copy of the licence to be sent forthwith to the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination is situate in any case in which that place is outside the City.

(v) The swine shall after their arrival at the bacon factory or slaughterhouse be there detained until they are slaughtered.

(vi.) The Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination is situate shall take such steps as are necessary to insure that the swine are moved to the bacon factory or slaughterhouse specified in the licence, and are duly slaughtered there.

Revocation.

3. The Order dated the thirtieth day of July, nineteen hundred and eight, relating to the movement of swine to Water Street Market, Manchester, is hereby revoked.

Commencement.

4. This Order shall come into operation on the thirteenth day of November, nineteen hundred and twenty-two.

Short Title.

5. This Order may be cited as the MANCHESTER (WATER STREET MARKET) (SWINE FEVER) ORDER OF 1922.

URBAN DISTRICT OF LONG SUTTON.

PUBLIC HEALTH ACTS AMENDMENT ACT, 1907.

BY an Order dated the 25th day of October, 1922, the Minister of Health has declared that, on and after the 18th day of December, 1922, the following provisions of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1907, shall be in force in the Urban District of Long Sutton, viz.:—

Part II (which relates to streets and buildings) except Sections 23, 26, 27 and 30.

Part III (which relates to sanitary provisions) except Sections 39 to 42 inclusive.

Part IV (which relates to infectious diseases).

Part V (which relates to common Lodging houses); and

Part VI (which relates to recreation grounds),
