OXFORDSHIRE AND DISTRICT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1922 (No. 3).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Contraction of Prohibited and Controlled Areas.

1.—(i) The Oxfordshire and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1922 (No. 2) shall be read and have effect as if the Prohibited Areas and Controlled Area described in the First Schedule hereto were substituted respectively for the Prohibited Area and Controlled Area described in the Schedule to that Order.

(ii) The area described in the Second Schedule hereto is released from the restrictions imposed by the above-mentioned Order.

Commencement.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the eighteenth day of November, nineteen hundred and twenty-two, and shall be read with the Order referred to in Article 1.

Short Title.

3. This Order may be cited as THE OXFORDSHIRE AND DISTRICT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1922 (No. 3).
