## PART II.

## PROPOSED VARIATION OF OVERTIME RATES FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS EMPLOYED IN HAND MACHINE BRAIDING ON PIECE-WORK.

In lieu of the Overtime Rates at present in operation, and set out in the Notice R (26), issued by the Trade Board and dated 27th June, 1922, the proposed Overtime Rates for Male and Female Workers employed in Hand Machine Braiding on piece-work for which General Minimum Piece Rates are proposed in Part I of this Schedule, to apply in substitution for the minimum rates which would otherwise be applicable, in respect of all hours worked by a worker in excess of the number declared by the Trade Board to be the normal number of hours of work in the trade as specified in Sections I and III of Part II of their Notice R (26), shall be as follows:—

- (i) For the first two hours of Overtime on any day except Saturday, Sunday and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be the appropriate General Minimum Piece-Rate proposed with the addition of 3d. per hour in the case of Male Workers and 1116d. per hour in the case of Female Workers.
- (ii) For Overtime after the first two hours of Overtime on any day except Sunday and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays and for all Overtime on Saturday, the Overtime Rate shall be the appropriate General Minimum Piece-Rate proposed with the addition of 6d. per hour in the case of Male Workers and 3\frac{3}{6}d. per hour in the case of Female Workers.
- (iii) For all time worked on Sunday and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be the appropriate General Minimum Piece-Rate proposed with the addition of 1s. per hour in the case of Male Workers and 6\frac{3}{4}d. per hour in the case of Female Workers.
- (iv) For all hours worked in any week in excess of 48, the Overtime Rate shall be the appropriate General Minimum Piece-Rate proposed with the addition of 3d. per hour in the case of Male Workers and of  $1\frac{11}{16}d$ . per hour in the case of Female Workers, except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are payable under the provisions of paragraphs (ii) and (iii) of this Part of this Schedule.

## PART III.

The above proposed Minimum Rates of Wages shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all Male and Female Workers (other than Home-Workers) within the scope of the Trade Boards (Rope, Twine and Net) Order, 1919, as amended by the Trade Boards (Made-Up Textiles) Order 1920, and set out in Section II of Part V of the Schedule to the Trade Boards Notice R (25), dated the 27th June, 1922, in respect of all time during which they are employed in Great Britain as Piece-Workers on work to which the Proposed General Minimum Piece-Rates set out in Part I of this Schedule apply.

NOTE.—The employment of Female Workers, Young Persons and Children is subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts and of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920.

The Trade Board will consider any OBJECTIONS to the above Proposal to Vary which may be lodged with them within two months from the 21st day of November, 1922. Such Objections should be in writing, and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to The Secretary of the Rope, Twine and Net Trade Board (Great Britain), 1, Whitehall Gardens, London, S.W. 1.

It is desirable that the Objections should state precisely, and, so far as possible, with reasons, what is objected to.
