registration for a probation period not exceeding four weeks, but the probation period shall be included in her period of Learnership.

Provided that notwithstanding compliance with the conditions contained in this Section a person shall not be deemed to be a Learner if she works in a room used for dwelling purposes and is not in the employment of her parent or guardian.

## SECTION II.

A Homeworker is a Worker who works in her own home or in any place not under the control or management of the employer.

## PART V.

The above proposed Minimum Rates of Wages shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all FEMALE WORKERS in respect of all time during which they are employed in Great Britain in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Shirtmaking) Order, 1920, as set out in Part V of the Schedule to the Notice S. (7) issued by the Trade Board and dated 1st July, 1922.

NOTE.—The employment of women, young persons and children is subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts, and to the provisions of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920.

The Trade Board will consider any OBJECTIONS to the above Proposal to Vary which may be lodged with them within two months from the 5th day of January, 1923. Such objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary of the Shirtmaking Trade Board (Great Britain), 1, Whitehall Gardens, London, S.W. 1.

It is desirable that the Objections should state precisely, and, so far as possible, with reasons, what is objected to.

## TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 AND 1918.

## JUTE TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

## MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR MALE LOOM TENTERS OF 21 YEARS OF AGE AND OVER WITH A RECOGNISED FULL CHARGE.

EFFECTIVE AS FROM 8TH JANUARY, 1923.

Should this date not correspond with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid by an employer who pays wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, the rates shall become effective as from the beginning of the next full-pay period, but in any case not later than 14th January, 1923.

## SCHEDULE.

## PART I.

## GENERAL MINIMUM TIME-RATES AND OVERTIME RATES FOR MALE LOOM TENTERS OF 21 YEARS OF AGE AND OVER WITH A RECOGNISED FULL CHARGE.

SECTION I.—(a) General Minimum Time-rate, 56s. 8d. per week of 48 hours.

(b) The General Minimum Time-Rate set out in (a) above, is a weekly rate based on a week of 48 hours and is subject to a proportionate adjustment according as the number of hours of employment in any week is less than 48.

SECTION II.—Overtime Rates calculated on the general minimum time-rate set out in Section I. in the manner specified in Part III. of the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice J (18) dated 7th February, 1922, apply in substitution for the general minimum time-rate set out in Section I. in respect of all hours worked in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board in the Schedule to the above-mentioned Notice J (18) to be the normal number of hours of work in the trade.

## PART II.

The above Minimum Rates of Wages apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all workers of the class specified in Part I. of this Schedule in respect of all time during which they are employed in Great Britain in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Jute) Order, 1919, and set out in Part VI. of the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice J (18) dated 7th February, 1922.

## PART III.

The above minimum rates of wages must be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any superannuation or other provident fund.

Signed by Order of the Trade Board and in pursuance of an Order of the Minister of Labour confirming the Minimum Rates as varied by the Trade Board and set out above, and specifying the 8th day of January, 1923, as the date from which they should become effective.
