DRESSMAKING AND WOMEN'S LIGHT CLOTHING TRADE BOARD (SCOTLAND).

PROPOSAL TO VARY MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR FEMALE WORKERS IN THE WHOLESALE MANUFACTURING AND ALL OTHER BRANCHES OF THE TRADE EXCEPT THE RETAIL BRANCH.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour and dated respectively 31st October, 1918, and 1st August, 1922, the Trade Board established in Scotland under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, and the Trade Boards (Women's Clothing) Order, 1919, for the Dressmaking and Women's Light Clothing Trade, as defined in the Regulations made by the Minister of Labour and dated 29th March, 1920 (as varied by the Trade Boards (Shirtmaking) Order, 1920), HEREBY GIVE NOTICE as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that they PROPOSE TO VALY the General Minimum Time Rates, Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates, and Overtime Rates for Female Workers in the Wholesale Manufacturing and all other Branches of the Trade except the Retail Branch, as at present fixed and set out in the Schedule to their Notice W.D.S. (9), the proposed variations being as shown in the Schedule below.
