

Of the French 23 were killed in the Fight, and the rest, 66 in number, are brought ashore, several of which are wounded, and the Captain so dangerously, that 'tis thought he will hardly recover. There was another Privateer in his Company, who seeing his Companion come off so ill, fell astern, and stood off to Sea. The laden Fleet of Colliers, being about 400, failed hence yesterday in the Evening, under Convoy of 4 Men of War.

Yarmouth, April 12. This Evening came into this Road a great Fleet of laden Colliers, with their Convoys, bound to the River.

Falmouth, April 10. Yesterday in the Evening passed by this Port to the Eastward, a Fleet of about 100 sail, which are supposed to be the Fleet that lately failed from Cadiz, under Convoy of several Dutch Men of War commanded by Vice-Admiral Evertz.

Plymouth, April 11. Yesterday came in the *St. John Baptist* of and from *Bilboa*; and this day *Nostra Signiora de Carmar* from *O-Porto*. Yesterday were seen off this Place about 100 sail of Ships making to the Eastward.

Bristol, April 12. Yesterday came in the *Charity* and *Success* of this Port from *Stockholm*, they came from *Scilly* with a Fleet of 50 sail, who are gone with their Convoy to *Milford*.

Portsmouth, April 13. On the 11th Instant a Squadron of His Majesty's Ships commanded by Rear-Admiral *Benbow*, failed from *Spithead* to the Westward. And yesterday arrived here from the *Downes* several outward bound Merchant Ships with their Convoys.

Kensington, April 11. The King having Constituted *Sir Thomas Mompesson*, *Sir Charles Cottrell Junior*, and *James Tyrrell Esq;* Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord Privy Seal, during the absence of the Right Honourable the Earl of *Pembroke*; His Majesty was pleased this Evening to deliver the said Seal into their Custody.

Kensington, April 12. The Baron *de Simeoni*, Envoy from the Elector of *Cologne*; and *Monseigneur Hefsen*, Envoy from the Duke of *Wirtemberg*, had this day their Audiences of Leave of His Majesty, being Conducted by *Sir Charles Cottrell*, Master of the Ceremonies.

Whitehall, April 14. His Majesty has been pleased to appoint the Right Honourable *Charles Earl of Manchester* to be his Ambassador Extraordinary to the Republick of *Venice*. *Sir James Rusbous* Baronet, his Ambassador to the Grand Signior. And *Lambert Blackwell Esq;* his Envoy to the Great Duke of *Tuscany*.
