SECTION IV .- THE RETAIL BESPOKE DRESSMAKING BRANCH OF THE TRADE s that branch of the Dressmaking and Women's Light Clothing trade specified in the Regulations made by the Minister of Labour dated 24th November, 1919 (as varied by the Trade Boards (Shirtmaking) Order, 1920), as set out in Part V of the Trade Board's Notice W.D. (12), IN WHICH THE EMPLOYER SUPPLIES THE GARMENT DIRECT TO THE INDIVIDUAL WEARER AND EMPLOYS THE WORKER DIRECT.

PART IV.

APPLICABILITY OF THE PROPOSED MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES.

Subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, the Proposed Minimum Rates of Wages set out in this Schedule shall apply to all Female Workers in England and Wales in respect of all time during which they are employed in the Retail Bespoke Dressmaking Branch of the Dressmaking and Women's Light Clothing Trade, as defined in the Regulations made by the Minister of Labour dated 24th November, 1919 (as varied by the Trade Boards (Shirtmaking) Order, 1920), and as set out in Part V of the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice W.D. (12), dated 6th April, 1922.

PART V.

PROPOSED CANCELLATION OF PIECE-WORK BASIS TIME-RATES FOR FEMALE WORKERS IN THE RETAIL BESPOKE DRESSMAKING BRANCH OF THE TRADE.

The Trade Board PROPOSE TO CANCEL the following Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates for Female Workers employed in the Retail Bespoke Dressmaking Branch of the Trade, at present effective under an Order of the Minister of Labour dated 30th March, 1922, and set out in Section I of Part II of the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice, W.D. (12), dated 6th April, 1922, viz.:
