APPOINTMENT OF STANDING FOR CARRIAGES WITHIN HACKNEY THE METROPOLITAN POLICE DIS-TRICT, AND REGULATIONS TO BE OBSERVED.

By virtue of the Act 13 and 14 Victoria, Chapter 7, intituled "An Act for Con-solidating the Office of the Registrar of Metropolitan Public Carriages with the Office of Commissioners of Police of the Metropolis, and making other Provisions in regard to the Consoli-dated Offices."

THOMAS FRANCIS WILLIAM HORWOOD, Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, do hereby appoint a Standing for ten Hackney Carriages at Grosvenor Road, S.W. 1, and do make the following Regulations with regard to the boundaries for the same, viz.:

On south side of roadway, commencing at a point opposite the front door of No. 98, Grosvenor Road, extending westward, by far as necessary for ten enclosure, as carriages.

Front of vehicles towards the East.

Provided that no Hackney Carriage shal' be suffered to stand across any street c. thoroughfare, or opposite the end of any street or carriageway, or upon any place where foot passengers usually cross the carriageway.
