### RETAIL BESPOKE TAILORING TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN):

#### MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS.

This Notice sets out all the Minimum Rates of Wages which have been fixed or varied by the Trade Board and confirmed by Orders of the Minister of Labour, and which are at present effective under the Trade Boards Acts, and takes the place of all Notices other than the Trade Board's Notice R.B. (23).
