"The Schedule to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint Andrew, Sudbury, comprising: --

"All those contiguous portions of the Parish of Harrow on the Hill, of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Christ Church, Roxeth, and of the New Parish (sometime Particular District) of Saint John the Evangelist, Wembley, all in the County of Middlesex and in the Diocese of London, which taken together, are comprised within and are bounded by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Harrow on the Hill from the said New Parish of Christ Church, Roxeth, at the junction of the road known as Sudbury Hill with Wood End Lane, and extending thence first southward and then in various directions along the middle of Wood End Lane (thereby crossing the main line of the Great Central Railway) for a distance of 42 chains or thereabouts to the point in the middle of such lane where the boundaries of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Roxeth, the Parish of Northolt and the Parish of Greenford, both in the said County and Diocese, all meet, and extending thence first south eastward and then in various directions along the boundary which divides the said Parish of Greenford from the said New Parish of Christ Church, Roxeth, for a distance of 1 mile and 6 chains or thereabouts to the point where such boundary meets the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Wembley, from the said New Parish of Christ Church, Roxeth, and extending thence first north eastward and then north westward along the last mentioned boundary for a distance of 151 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries Brewery Lane across the line of the Great Central Railway, and extending thence first south eastward and then eastward along the middle of such line of railway for a distance of 59 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the junction of Sylvester Road with Sudbury Avenue, and extending thence northward in a straight line for a distance of 42 chains or thereabouts to the junction of Sylvester Road with Sudbury Avenue, and extending thence still northward along the middle of Sudbury Avenue for a distance of 40½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with East Lane, and extending thence north eastward along the middle of East Lane for a distance of 9 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries such lane across the main line of the London and North Western Railway, and extending thence north westward along the middle of such line of railway (thereby crossing the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Wembley, from the said Parish of Harrow on the Hill) for a distance of 38 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the culvert which carries the same line of railway across the stream which flows from the northern side of the grounds attached to the Visitation Convent into Wealdstone Brook, and extending thence first westward and then in various directions along the middle of the said stream for a distance of 1 mile and 17 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the northern end of the fence which divides the close numbered 14 upon the Ordnance Survey Map of the Civil Parish of Harrow on the Hill published in the year 1914 upon the scale of 25 inches to a mile and also upon the map or plan which is annexed to this Scheme from the close numbered 16b upon the said maps, and extending thence first southward to the northern end of the said fence and then first westward and then in various directions along the fences forming the northern boundaries of the said close numbered 16b and the closes numbered 16, 256 and 110 upon the said maps and the north western boundaries of the said close numbered 110 and the close numbered 16e upon the same maps (i.e., the fences forming the northern boundary of the grounds attached to the Visitation Convent) for a distance in all of 34½ chains or thereabouts to the point where the fence forming the north western boundary of the said close numbered 16e meets the eastern side of the road known as Sudbury Hill, and extending thence south westward in a straight line for a distance of 20 yards or thereabouts to the junction of Sudbury Hill with Wood End Lane, at which point the said imaginary line commenced."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures out of which it is intended that the District recommended in such Scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such Patrons and Incumbents have with the exception hereinafter mentioned respectively signi-

fied their assent to such Scheme:

And whereas one of the Patrons of the Vicarage of the New Parish of Christ Church, Roxeth, and also of the Vicarage of the New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Wembley, has not signified his assent to the said Scheme:

And whereas a period of more than one calendar month has elapsed since drafts of the said scheme were transmitted to the said Patrons and Incumbents:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of London.
