

February, 1923, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, of the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and of the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme or Representation for altering the boundaries of the New Parish of Christ Church, Brixton Road, and the New Parish of Saint John the Divine, Kennington, both in the County of Surrey and in the Diocese of Southwark:

“ Whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the 25th day of February, 1856, and published in the London Gazette on the 14th day of the following month, part of the District Parish of Saint Mark, Kennington, in the said County of Surrey, and at that time in the Diocese of Winchester but now in the said Diocese of Southwark, was assigned as a District Chapelry to the consecrated Church, called Christ Church, situate in Brixton Road, in the said District Parish of Saint Mark, Kennington, and the said District Chapelry was named ‘ The District Chapelry of Christ Church, Brixton Road ’:

“ And whereas the said District Chapelry of Christ Church, Brixton Road, has under the provisions of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, become a New Parish of the character contemplated by that Act, by the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and by the above mentioned Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94:

“ And whereas by the authority of another Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the 19th day of March, 1872, and published in the London Gazette on the 22nd day of the same month portions of the said District Parish of Saint Mark, Kennington, of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Brixton Road, of the District Parish of Saint George, Camberwell, and of the District Parish of Emmanuel, Camberwell, both in the said County of Surrey, and at that time in the said Diocese of Winchester but now in the said Diocese of Southwark, were constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes, and the said District was named ‘ The District of Saint John the Divine, Kennington ’:

“ And whereas the said District of Saint John the Divine, Kennington, has become a New Parish of the character contemplated by the said Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, by the said Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, and by the said Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94:

“ And whereas it has been represented to us, and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Brixton Road, and of the said New Parish of Saint John the Divine, Kennington, should be altered in the manner hereinafter mentioned:

“ Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Cyril Forster, Bishop of

Southwark (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme or Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or Representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Brixton Road, and of the said New Parish of Saint John the Divine, Kennington, shall be altered so that (first) all that portion of the said District Parish of Saint Mark, Kennington, which is described in the First Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the Map or Plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured green, shall be dis severed from such District Parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Brixton Road; and (secondly) all that portion of the said District Parish of Saint Mark, Kennington, which is described in the Second Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the said Map or Plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured pink shall be dis severed from such District Parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint John the Divine, Kennington.

“ And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

“ The Schedules to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

#### “ THE FIRST SCHEDULE.

“ The territory to be annexed to the New Parish of Christ Church, Brixton Road, in the County of Surrey, and in the Diocese of Southwark, being:—

“ All that portion of the District Parish of Saint Mark, Kennington, in the said County and Diocese, which forms part of an isolated portion of that Parish and which is bounded upon the south by the New Parish of Saint John the Divine, Kennington, in the said County and Diocese, upon the west by the said New Parish of Christ Church, Brixton Road, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north and upon the east, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Christ Church, Brixton Road, from the said isolated portion of the said District Parish of Saint Mark, Kennington, crosses the middle of Cancell Road, and extending thence first north eastward and then eastward along the middle of Cancell Road for a distance of 3½ chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the northern end of the fence forming the eastern boundary of the land which by Deed, dated the 27th day of April, 1922, was conveyed by the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, as an addition to the site of the Parsonage House belonging to the Benefice of Christ Church, Brixton Road, and extending thence southward to and along the said fence for a distance in all of 2¼ chains or thereabouts to its southern end upon the boundary
