FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE
INFECTED PLACE.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries,
by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested
in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts,
1894 to 1914, and of every other power
enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as
follows:—

The premises mentioned in the Schedule
hereto are hereby declared to be a place in-
fected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease.

In witness whereof the Official Seal of the
Minister of Agriculture and
Fisheries is hereunto affixed this
ninth day of March, nineteen
hundred and twenty-three.
