The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by Section 69 of the Government of Ireland Act, 1920, His Majesty was empowered by Order in Council to make such Regulations as seemed necessary or proper for setting in motion the Parliaments and Governments of Southern and Northern Ireland, and also for any other matter for which it seemed to His Majesty necessary or proper to make provision for the purpose of bringing the said Act into full operation or for giving full effect to any of the provisions of the said Act, and in particular His Majesty was empowered, amongst other things, by any such Order in Council to make such adaptation of any enactments as appear to Him necessary or proper with respect to the execution of reserved services and services with respect to which the Parliaments of Southern Ireland and Northern Ireland had not power to make laws:

And whereas by Sections 4 and 5 of the Railway and Canal Traffic Act, 1888 (hereinafter referred to as the Act of 1888), certain powers in respect of the nomination of an ex-officio

Commissioner of the Railway and Canal Commission were conferred upon the Lord Chancellor of Ireland:

And whereas by the Supreme Court of Judicature (Northern Ireland) Order, 1921, and the Supreme Court of Judicature (Southern Ireland) Order, 1921 (being Orders in Council made under Section 69 of the Government of Ireland Act, 1920, and expressed to have effect subject to any subsequent Order in Council made under the said Act), certain adaptations were made of the provisions of Section 4 of the Act of 1888:

And whereas by the Irish Free State (Consequential Provisions) Act, 1922, it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the First Schedule to that Act, the Government of Ireland Act, 1920, shall cease to apply to any part of Ireland other than Northern Ireland:

And whereas it is expedient that the provisions of Sections 4 and 5 of the Act of 1888 should in their application to Northern Ireland be adapted in manner hereinafter appearing, and that so much of the Supreme Court of Judicature (Northern Ireland) Order, 1921, as relates to the said Section 4 should be revoked:

And whereas it is necessary on account of the urgency of the matters dealt with by this Order that this Order should come into operation forthwith:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Government of Ireland (Railway and Canal Commission) Order, 1923, and shall come into operation provisionally as from the date hereof, in accordance with the provisions of Section 2 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893.

2.—(1) The powers conferred on the Lord Chancellor of Ireland by Sections 4 and 5 of the Railway and Canal Traffic Act, 1888, shall, so far as they are exercisable in relation to Northern Ireland, be exercised by the Secretary of State.

(2) So much of the Supreme Court of Judicature (Northern Ireland) Order, 1921, as relates to Section 4 of the Railway and Canal Traffic Act, 1888, is hereby revoked.

WHEREAS by section six of the Irish Free State (Consequential Provisions) Act, 1922, it is provided that His Majesty may by Order in Council make such adaptations of any enactments so far as they relate to any of His Majesty's Dominions other than the Irish Free State as may appear to Him necessary or proper as a consequence of the establishment of the Irish Free State, and that any such Order in Council may contain such supplemental, consequential, and incidental provisions as may appear necessary or proper for the purposes of the Order:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Irish Free State (Consequential Adaptation of Enactments) Order, 1923.

2. Subject to the provisions of this Order and of any subsequent Order in Council made under section six of the Irish Free State (Consequential Provisions) Act, 1922, references in any enactment passed before the establishment of the Irish Free State to "the United Kingdom" or "the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland," or "Great Britain and Ireland" or "Great Britain or Ireland," or "the British Islands" or "Ireland," shall, in the application of the enactment to any part of Great Britain and Ireland other than the Irish Free State, be construed as exclusive of the Irish Free State, except that in the Acts mentioned in the Schedule to this Order any such expression as aforesaid shall, to the extent specified in that Schedule, be construed as including the Irish Free State:

Provided that nothing in this Article shall—

(a) apply to any enactment so as to affect the liability to, or the assessment or collection of, any tax or duty the liability whereof, or the assessment or collection whereof, is regulated by section two of the Irish Free State Constitution Act, 1922, or to sections ninety-four and ninety-five of the Probates and Letters of Administration

(Ireland) Act, 1857, and sections thirteen and fourteen of the Confirmation of Executors (Scotland) Act, 1858, as respectively modified by the Government of Ireland (Re-sealing, &c., of Probates) Order, 1922, in relation to cases where death duties payable on the death of the person to whom representation is granted are regulated by the said section two; or

(b) apply to any enactment regulating the administration of any public service the transfer of the administration whereof to the Government of the Irish Free State is, by virtue of Article seventy-nine of the Constitution of the Irish Free State, deferred, so as to affect the administration of that service prior to the transfer; or

(c) apply to any enactment designed for the enforcement of any international convention which is binding on the Irish Free State so as to prejudice the powers of fulfilling the obligations imposed by the convention.

3. Subject as aforesaid, references to "the United Kingdom" or "the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland," or "Great Britain and Ireland" or "Great Britain or Ireland," or "the British Islands" or "Ireland," in any enactment passed before the establishment of the Irish Free State which applies to parts of His Majesty's Dominions outside the United Kingdom, or outside the British Islands, as the case may be, shall, in the application of the enactment to any such part, be construed as references both—

(a) to Great Britain and Ireland or the British Islands exclusive of the Irish Free State, or as the case may be, to Ireland exclusive of the Irish Free State; and

(b) to the Irish Free State.

Provided that where by any such enactment the Isle of Man and the Channel Islands are to be deemed for the purposes of the enactment to form part of the United Kingdom, they shall not for the purposes of this Article be deemed to be parts of His Majesty's Dominions outside the United Kingdom.

4.—(1) Subject to the provisions of section two of the Irish Free State Constitution Act, 1922, the Irish Free State shall, in relation to any part of Great Britain or Northern Ireland, be deemed to be parts beyond the seas for customs purposes and for the purposes of sub-section (1) of section six of the Post Office Act, 1908.

(2) Subject as aforesaid a ship trading between any port in any part of the British Islands other than the Irish Free State and a port in the Irish Free State shall be deemed to be employed in coasting trade for the purposes of sections four hundred and thirty-seven and four hundred and thirty-eight of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, and for the purposes of any enactment relating to rates, tolls, dues and other charges leviable by a port, dock or harbour authority in Great Britain or Northern Ireland.

5.—(1) Sub-section (2) of section thirty-nine of the Larceny Act, 1916, shall be construed as authorizing the indictment, trial and punishment in any part of Great Britain and Ireland other than the Irish Free State of a person who steals or otherwise feloniously takes any property in the Irish Free State if he has the property so stolen in his possession in such part of Great Britain and Ireland as

aforesaid, as if he had actually stolen or taken it in that part.

(2) Sub-section (3) of section thirty-nine of the Larceny Act, 1916, shall be construed as authorizing a person who receives in any part of Great Britain and Ireland other than the Irish Free State any property stolen or otherwise feloniously taken in the Irish Free State to be dealt with, indicted, tried and punished in the part of Great Britain and Ireland where he so receives the property in the same manner as if it had been originally stolen or taken in that part.

6. A railway or canal company in Ireland whose system is situate partly in Northern Ireland and partly in the Irish Free State shall not be deemed to be a railway or canal company in Northern Ireland for the purposes of paragraph (g) or paragraph (h) of section one of the Trustee Act, 1893, as adapted by this Order.

7. Sub-section (4) of section two hundred and fifty-four of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, shall have effect as if for references to the Registrar-General of Births and Deaths in Ireland there were substituted references to the officer who performs the duties of registrar of births and deaths in the Irish Free State and Northern Ireland respectively.

8.—(1) The provisions of any enactments which are applicable to—

(a) the endorsement and execution in England, Scotland, the Channel Islands, or the Isle of Man of warrants issued by justices, courts or judges of courts in Ireland;

(b) the service in England or Scotland of writs of subpoena of superior courts in Ireland and the punishment in England or Scotland of persons disobeying the same;

(c) the enforcement in England or Scotland of the attendance of witnesses before persons appointed for the examination of witnesses in England or Scotland by a commission, order, or other process of courts in Ireland;

(d) the operation in England of inquisitions taken or writs of supersedeas issued in proceedings in lunacy in Ireland, or the management and administration of property in England or Scotland of a person found lunatic by inquisition in Ireland, or of property in England of a person of unsound mind in Ireland;

shall apply respectively to—

(i) warrants issued by justices, courts or judges of courts in the Irish Free State;

(ii) writs of subpoena of superior courts in the Irish Free State;

(iii) commissions, orders, or other processes of courts in the Irish Free State;

(iv) inquisitions taken and writs of supersedeas issued in proceedings in lunacy in the Irish Free State, and property of a person found lunatic by inquisition in the Irish Free State, or a person of unsound mind in the Irish Free State;

and such warrants, writs of subpoena, commissions, orders and other processes, and inquisitions and writs of supersedeas shall in Northern Ireland have the like effect and shall be dealt with in like manner and with the like consequences as if they had originated in England.

(2) For the purposes of the Fugitive Offenders Acts, 1881 and 1915, in their appli-

cation to any part of His Majesty's Dominions outside the British Islands, the Irish Free State and the British Islands exclusive of the Irish Free State shall be treated as if they were separate parts of His Majesty's Dominions.

9. The Old Age Pensions Act, 1911, in its application to Great Britain and Northern Ireland, shall have effect as if in the proviso to sub-section (2) of section three the following paragraph was inserted after paragraph (e):—

(f) any periods spent in any part of Ireland before the establishment of the Irish Free State.

10. Section twenty of the Superannuation Act, 1834, shall, in its application to any person who at the date of the establishment of the Irish Free State was in receipt of any such superannuation allowance or compensation as is mentioned in that section, have effect as if the expression "any office in any public department" included an office in a public department of the Irish Free State.

11. Where any Act applies to, or may be applied to, any part of His Majesty's Dominions outside the United Kingdom or the British Islands as the case may be, nothing in this Order shall be construed as applying the Act or making the Act applicable to the Irish Free State as such a part of His Majesty's Dominions as aforesaid unless and until provision is made for the purpose by the Parliament of the Irish Free State in pursuance of the powers conferred by section three of the Irish Free State Constitution Act, 1922:

Provided that the Irish Free State shall, for the purposes of the enactments relating to the Post Office, be deemed to be a British Possession the legislature whereof has made provision for the establishment, maintenance and regulation of posts within the possession.

12. Subject to the provisions of section two of the Irish Free State Constitution Act, 1922, spirits and plate manufactured in the Irish Free State shall not be deemed to be British spirits and British wrought plate respectively within the meaning of the Customs Acts in the application to those Acts to Great Britain and Northern Ireland.

13. Nothing in this Order shall affect the construction to be placed on any expression if and so far as the provision in which the expression occurs has reference either expressly or by necessary implication to a state of affairs existing before the establishment of the Irish Free State.

14. Nothing in this Order shall affect any rates, tolls, dues, or other charges leviable under any Act of Parliament by any port, dock, or harbour authority in Great Britain or Northern Ireland in respect of any traffic going to or coming from any place in the Irish Free State, nor shall the establishment of the Irish Free State be deemed to have affected any such charges.

15.—(1) Nothing in this Order shall affect the construction of any expression in the Land Purchase Acts so as to prevent the provision of funds required for the purpose of completing transactions in relation to land in the Irish Free State which are pending under those Acts on the thirty-first day of March, nineteen hundred and twenty-three.

(2) The powers of the Lord Lieutenant

under section thirty-seven of the Irish Land Act, 1903, shall be exercisable by the Secretary of State, and shall include power with the approval of the Treasury to make regulations for the purpose of determining the persons entitled to draw upon the Land Purchase Fund after the thirty-first day of March, nineteen hundred and twenty-three, in respect of such transactions as aforesaid, and the manner in which such drafts may be made.

16. Nothing in this Order shall affect the construction, in its application to the Irish

Free State, of any Act which by virtue of Article seventy-three of the Irish Free State Constitution is to continue in force within the Irish Free State.

17. This Order, so far as it relates to Northern Ireland, and as the matters contained therein are matters with respect to which the Parliament of Northern Ireland has power to make laws shall be subject to alteration or revocation by Acts passed by that Parliament.

WHEREAS in pursuance of the powers conferred by section sixty-nine and section twenty-eight of the Government of Ireland Act, 1920, His Majesty in Council was pleased to make an Order to be cited as The Government of Ireland (Resealing of Probates &c.) Order, 1922:

And whereas in consequence of the establishment of the Irish Free State, and by reason of the Government of Ireland Act, 1920, ceasing to apply to any part of Ireland other than Northern Ireland, it is necessary to make other provision with respect to the resealing or certification in Great Britain of representations granted in Northern Ireland, and the

resealing in Northern Ireland of representations granted in Great Britain:

And whereas it is necessary on account of the urgency of the matters dealt with by this Order that this Order should come into operation immediately:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Government of Ireland Resealing of Probates, &c., Order 1923, and shall come into operation provisionally as from the date hereof in accordance with the provisions of the Rules Publication Act, 1893.

(2) In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires—

The expression "the Act of 1857" means the Probates and Letters of Administration Act (Ireland), 1857, including any enactments, rules and regulations by which that

Act has been extended, amended or applied.

The expression "the Act of 1858" means the Confirmation of Executors (Scotland) Act, 1858, including any enactments, rules and regulations by which that Act has been extended, amended or applied.

2. This Order shall apply in the case of persons dying on or after the 1st April, 1923, and save as respects persons dying before that date the Government of Ireland (Re-sealing of Probates, &c.) Order, 1922, shall cease to have effect.

3.—(1) Where in pursuance of the provisions of section ninety-four of the Act of 1857 probate or letters of administration granted by the Court in England are deposited for the purpose of being resealed under those provisions in Northern Ireland, then in lieu of a certificate showing that estate duty has been paid on the issue of the original grant in respect of the assets situate in Northern Ireland, there shall be delivered to the authority charged with re-sealing, together with the grant to be resealed, an affidavit accounting, in like manner as upon an application for an original grant of representation, for the estate duty or duty in the nature of estate duty (if any) payable in Northern Ireland in respect of the personal property of which the deceased was competent to dispose at his death.

(2) Where in pursuance of the provisions of section ninety-five of the Act of 1857 probate or letters of administration granted by the Court in Northern Ireland are deposited for the purpose of being resealed under those provisions in England, then in lieu of a certificate showing that estate duty has been paid on the issue of the original grant in respect of the assets situate in England, there shall be delivered to the authority charged with re-sealing, together with the grant to be resealed, an Inland Revenue affidavit accounting, in like manner as upon an application for an original grant of representation, for the estate duty (if any) payable in Great Britain in respect of the personal or moveable property of which the deceased was competent to dispose at his death.

Provided always that if the British estate duty has already been paid on a prior certification of the Northern Irish grant in Scotland under the terms of sub-section (4) of this article, then the Inland Revenue affidavit shall be endorsed to this effect by the Commissioners of Inland Revenue.

(3) Where in pursuance of section thirteen of the Act of 1858 Scottish confirmation is produced for the purpose of being sealed in Northern Ireland, then before the confirmation is so sealed an affidavit shall be filed accounting, in like manner as upon an application for an original grant of representation, for the estate duty or duty in the nature of estate duty (if any) payable in Northern Ireland in respect of the personal property of which the deceased was competent to dispose at his death.

(4) Where in pursuance of section fourteen of the Act of 1858 a Northern Irish grant of representation is produced for the purpose of being certified in Scotland, then before the grant is so certified an inventory shall be filed accounting, in like manner as if an original application were being made for confirmation,

for the estate duty (if any) payable in Great Britain in respect of the moveable or personal property of which the deceased was competent to dispose at his death:

Provided that if the British estate duty has already been paid on a prior re-sealing of the Northern Irish grant in England under the terms of sub-section (2) of this article, then the inventory shall be endorsed to this effect by the Commissioners of Inland Revenue.

(5) Notwithstanding the provisions of section forty-eight of the Finance (No. 2) Act, 1915, grants of representation by any Court in Great Britain shall not have effect with respect to Government stock in Northern Ireland, and grants of representation in Northern Ireland shall not have effect with respect to Government stock in Great Britain, unless sealed or certified in the country where the stock is situate, in accordance with the provisions of the Acts of 1857 and 1858 as modified by this article.

And whereas the public services in connection with the general subject matter of the Acts relating to land purchase in Ireland are reserved services, subject to the exceptions mentioned in subsection (3) of section nine of the said Act:

And whereas by section one of the Irish Free State (Consequential Provisions) Act, 1922, it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the First Schedule to the said Act, the Government of Ireland Act, 1920, shall cease to apply to any part of Ireland other than Northern Ireland, and shall, in the events which have happened, have effect subject to the modifications set out in the said Schedule, and by section two of and the Second Schedule to the same Act provision is made with respect to the abolition of the office of Commissioner of the Irish Land Commission as from the date upon which the administration of public services relating to land purchase is transferred as respects the Irish Free State to the Executive Council thereof, and by section six of the same Act it is provided that His Majesty may by Order in Council make such adaptations of any enactments so far as they relate to any of His Majesty's dominions other than the Irish Free

State as may appear to Him necessary or proper as a consequence of the establishment of the Irish Free State:

And whereas it is necessary on account of the urgency of the matters dealt with by this Order that this Order should come into operation forthwith:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Land Purchase (Northern Ireland) Order, 1923, and shall come into operation provisionally as from the date hereof in accordance with the provisions of section two of the Rules Publication Act, 1893.

(2) In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires,

the expression "Land Purchase Acts" means the Land Purchase Acts as defined in the Irish Land Act, 1909, so far as they relate to matters which are not within the powers of the Parliament and Government of Northern Ireland, and includes any subsequent enactment amending those Acts;

the expression "officers" includes a solicitor, secretary, accountant, examiners, inspectors and clerks;

the expression "powers" includes rights, jurisdiction, authorities and immunities,

the expression "duties" includes responsibilities and obligations;

the expression "securities" includes Government securities and any security of any British possession, foreign state or any body corporate or company or standing in books kept by any body corporate, company or person and all stock, funds and effects.

(3) The Interpretation Act, 1889, applies to the interpretation of this Order in like manner as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

2.—(1) The Land Purchase Acts in their application to Northern Ireland shall have effect, subject to the modifications and adaptations set out in this Order save where inconsistent with the Government of Ireland Act, 1920, the Irish Free State Constitution Act, 1922, or the Irish Free State (Consequential Provisions) Act, 1922, or the provisions of any subsequent Order in Council under any of those Acts, and subject, as respects matters within the powers of the Parliament of Northern Ireland, to repeal or alteration by Acts of that Parliament.

(2) Subject to the express adaptations and modifications made by this Order, the General Adaptation of Enactments (Northern Ireland) Order, 1921, and any other Order made under the Government of Ireland Act, 1920, the Irish Free State Constitution Act, 1922, or the Irish Free State (Consequential Provisions) Act, 1922, containing adaptations of general application shall, if and so far as they are applicable to the enactments adapted by this Order, apply thereto in like manner as to other enactments.

(3) The adaptations and modifications made by this Order shall apply to any order, scheme, rule, regulation or instrument made or issued under any of the enactments so adapted or modified and in force as respects Northern Ireland immediately before the date of this Order, in like manner as they apply to the

enactment under which it was made or issued, and any such order, scheme, rule, regulation or instrument shall continue in force as respects Northern Ireland in like manner and subject to the like powers of revocation and alteration as if it had been made or issued under the said enactment as so adapted and modified.

3.—(1) For the purpose of the administration of the Land Purchase Acts in Northern Ireland there shall be a Commission called the "Land Purchase Commission, Northern Ireland," and all the powers and duties under the Land Purchase Acts of the Irish Land Commission or the court of that Commission shall, so far as respects Northern Ireland and subject to the provisions of this Order, be exercised and performed by the Land Purchase Commission, Northern Ireland, which by that name shall be a body corporate with power to acquire and hold land and a common seal which shall be officially and judicially noticed.

(2) The Land Purchase Commission, Northern Ireland (hereinafter referred to as the Commission), shall consist of one or more Commissioners appointed by the Secretary of State, and the powers and duties under the Land Purchase Acts of the Judicial Commissioner, the Estates Commissioners or any other Commissioner or Commissioners of the Irish Land Commission shall, so far as respects Northern Ireland and subject to the provisions of this Order, be exercised and performed by the Commissioner so appointed or, if more than one Commissioner is so appointed, by any Commissioner so appointed; provided that—

(a) at least one Commissioner so appointed shall be a person who has practised for not less than 10 years at the Bar in Ireland or in some part of Ireland, and the power and duties of the Judicial Commissioner shall not be exercised and performed by a Commissioner who does not possess this qualification; and

(b) for the purposes of subsection (1) of section sixty-three of the Irish Land Act, 1909, the powers of the Judicial Commissioner shall be exercised by a judge of the Supreme Court of Judicature of Northern Ireland nominated under the Land Purchase Acts, as they apply to Northern Ireland, to act as Judicial Commissioner or additional Judicial Commissioner.

4.—(1) For the purposes of the Land Purchase Acts in their application to Northern Ireland, there shall be a public trustee for Northern Ireland who by the name of "The Land Purchase Trustee for Northern Ireland" shall be a corporation with perpetual succession and a common seal which shall be officially and judicially noticed, and all powers and duties under the Land Purchase Acts of the Public Trustee appointed under the Irish Land Act, 1903 (except powers and duties under section 39 of the Irish Land Act, 1903), shall, so far as respects Northern Ireland, and subject to the provisions of this Order, be exercised and performed by the Land Purchase Trustee for Northern Ireland.

(2) The Land Purchase Trustee for Northern Ireland shall be appointed by the Secretary of State.

5.—(1) The tenure, remuneration and superannuation rights of a Commissioner appointed under this Order and of the Public Trustee for Northern Ireland shall be such as

may be determined by the Secretary of State with the consent of the Treasury.

(2) A Commissioner appointed under this Order shall not, by virtue of his office, become a judge of the Supreme Court of Judicature of Northern Ireland.

(3) Nothing in this Order shall be taken as impairing the power of nominating a judge of the Supreme Court of Judicature of Northern Ireland to act as Judicial Commissioner or additional Judicial Commissioner of the Commission under section 28 of the Purchase of Land (Ireland) Act, 1891, as it applies to Northern Ireland, or the jurisdiction of a judge so nominated.

6.—(1) The Secretary of State may, with the consent of the Treasury, make provision for the transfer to the Commission of any officers of the Irish Land Commission and for the continuance, so far as practicable, of the service of officers so transferred in corresponding offices upon conditions not less favourable as respects remuneration and superannuation than those of the offices previously held by them, and subject as aforesaid, the Commission may, with the consent of the Secretary of State and the Treasury, appoint or employ such officers or persons as they think necessary for the execution of their powers and duties.

(2) The provisions of the last preceding subsection shall apply as respects officers of the Public Trustee in like manner as they apply as respects officers of the Irish Land Commission, with the substitution of the Land Purchase Trustee for Northern Ireland for the Commission.

7. In the application of the Land Purchase Acts to Northern Ireland, so far as is consistent with the foregoing provisions of this Order—

references to the Irish Land Commission or to the court of the Irish Land Commission shall be construed as references to the Commission;

references to the Judicial Commissioner, to the Estates Commissioners or to other Commissioners of the Irish Land Commission or to any one or more of them shall be construed as references to a Commissioner appointed under this Order;

references to the Public Trustee appointed under the Irish Land Act, 1903, shall be construed as references to the Land Purchase Trustee for Northern Ireland;

references to Dublin shall be construed as references to Belfast;

references to the Dublin Gazette shall be construed as references to the Belfast Gazette.

8.—(1) Any matter or proceeding relating to land in Northern Ireland which is pending in the Irish Land Commission on the day of transfer shall be transferred to and continued in the Commission.

(2) Where the Public Trustee appointed under the Irish Land Act, 1903, is on the day of transfer trustee of a settlement, either alone or jointly with some other trustee or trustees, if the settled land in consequence of the sale of which the Public Trustee was appointed trustee of the settlement was land in Northern Ireland, then the Land Purchase Trustee for Northern Ireland, subject as hereinafter provided, shall, by virtue of this Order, become trustee of the settlement in his stead, provided that if the income of the investments repre-

senting such settled land or any part of that income is at the day of transfer payable to a person ordinarily resident in the Irish Free State, the Land Purchase Trustee for Northern Ireland shall not become trustee of the settlement unless and until he is appointed trustee thereof by a court competent to appoint new trustees of the settlement.

(3) All land in Northern Ireland which, at the date of transfer is vested in the Irish Land Commission, and all securities and money (including any interest or dividends not theretofore received) which at that day are vested in that Commission and represent purchase money or proceeds of sale of land in Northern Ireland, shall, on the day of transfer, be transferred to and vest in the Commission without the necessity of any conveyance, transfer, assignment, or other instrument, and shall be held by the Commission upon the like trusts and for the like purposes upon and for which they were held immediately before that date.

(4) All securities and money (including any interest or dividends not theretofore received) which at the day of transfer are vested in the Public Trustee appointed under the Irish Land Act, 1903, as trustee of a settlement, either alone or jointly with some other trustee or trustees, shall in any case where the Land Purchase Trustee for Northern Ireland by virtue of this Order becomes trustee of the settlement instead of the Public Trustee first mentioned, on the day of transfer, be transferred to and vest in the Land Purchase Trustee for Northern Ireland, or in that trustee and the other trustee or trustees jointly, as the case may be, without the necessity of any transfer, assignment, or other instrument, and shall be held by the Land Purchase Trustee for Northern Ireland, or by that trustee and the other trustee or trustees as the case may be, upon the like trusts and for the like purposes upon and for which they were held immediately before the day of transfer.

(5) Where any such pending matter or proceeding relates both to land in Northern Ireland and to land elsewhere, or where any such securities or money vested in the Land Commission represent the purchase money or proceeds of sale of land in Northern Ireland and of land elsewhere, the foregoing provisions of this Article shall apply to the matter or proceeding so far as it relates to land in Northern Ireland, and to the money and securities so far as they represent the proceeds of sale or purchase money of land in Northern Ireland, and any question that may arise as to the application of this Article to the matter proceeding, money or securities, shall be determined by the person who at the date of this Order is Judicial Commissioner of the Irish Land Commission, and any division or apportionment that may be necessary shall be made by him, provided that if it appears to that person that a division of the matter or proceeding or the apportionment of any money or security is impracticable, he may direct that, for the purpose of this Article, the matter or proceeding shall be treated as relating exclusively to land in Northern Ireland or exclusively to land elsewhere, or that the money or security shall be treated as representing exclusively the purchase money or proceeds of sale of land in Northern Ireland or of land elsewhere, according as the greater part of the

land to which the matter or proceeding relates or which is represented by the money or security, is situated in Northern Ireland or is situated elsewhere.

(6) For the purpose of this Article, the day of transfer shall be the thirty-first day of March, nineteen hundred and twenty-three.

WHEREAS by section sixty-nine of the Government of Ireland Act, 1920, His Majesty is empowered by Order in Council to make such regulations as seem necessary or proper for setting in motion the Parliament and Government of Northern Ireland and also for any other matter for which it seems to His Majesty necessary or proper to make provision for the purpose of bringing the said Act into full operation or for giving full effect to any provision of the said Act; and in particular His Majesty is empowered amongst other things by any such Order in Council to make such adaptation of any enactments as appear to Him necessary or proper with respect to the execution of reserved services:

And whereas the public services in connection with the registration of deeds in Ireland are reserved services:

And whereas by section one of the Irish Free State (Consequential Provisions) Act, 1922, it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the First Schedule to the said Act, the Government of Ireland Act, 1920, shall cease to apply to any part of Ireland other than Northern Ireland, and shall, in the events which have happened, have effect subject to the modifications set out in the said Schedule, and by section six of the same Act it is provided that His Majesty may by Order in Council make such adaptations of any enactments so far as they relate to any of His Majesty's Dominions other than the Irish Free State as may appear to Him necessary or proper as a consequence of the establishment of the Irish Free State:

And whereas it is necessary on account of the urgency of the matters dealt with by this Order that this Order should come into operation forthwith:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Government of Ireland (Registration of Deeds in Northern Ireland) Order, 1923, and shall come into operation provisionally as from the date hereof in accordance with the provisions of section two of the Rules Publication Act, 1893.

(2) In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires:—

The expression "Registration of Deeds Acts" means an Act of the Parliament of Ireland of the sixth year of the reign of Queen Anne, chapter two, and every enactment amending that Act or otherwise relating to the Registry established under that

Act or the registration of instruments or documents therein;

The expression "deeds" means deeds, orders, affidavits and other instruments or documents registrable under the Registration of Deeds Acts;

The expression "Dublin Registry" means the registry established in Dublin under the Registration of Deeds Acts.

(3) The Interpretation Act, 1889, applies to the interpretation of this Order in like manner as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

2.—(1) As from the thirty-first day of March, 1923, the Registration of Deeds Acts shall, in their application to Northern Ireland, have effect subject to the modifications and adaptations set out in this Order save where inconsistent with the Government of Ireland Act, 1920, the Irish Free State Constitution Act, 1922, or the Irish Free State (Consequential Provisions) Act, 1922, or the provisions of any subsequent Order in Council under any of those Acts and subject as respects matters within the powers of the Parliament of Northern Ireland to repeal or alteration by Acts of that Parliament.

(2) Subject to the express modifications and adaptations made by this Order, the General Adaptation of Enactments (Northern Ireland) Order, 1921, and any other Order made under the Government of Ireland Act, 1920, the Irish Free State Constitution Act, 1922, or the Irish Free State (Consequential Provisions) Act, 1922, containing adaptations of general application shall, if and so far as they are applicable to the Registration of Deeds Acts apply thereto in like manner as to other enactments.

(3) The modifications and adaptations made by this Order shall apply to any Order, scheme, rule, regulation or instrument made under any of the Registration of Deeds Acts and in force as respects Northern Ireland on the thirty-first day of March, 1923, in like manner as they apply to the enactment under which it was made or issued, and any such Order, scheme, rule, regulation or instrument shall continue in force as respects Northern Ireland in like manner and subject to the like powers of revocation and alteration as if it had been made or issued under the Registration of Deeds Acts as adapted and modified by this Order.

3. For the purposes of the Registration of Deeds Acts, in their application to Northern Ireland, there shall be established in Belfast a Registry of Deeds for Northern Ireland (hereinafter referred to as the Belfast Registry) and any deed registrable under those Acts, if and so far as it affects lands in Northern Ireland, shall, after the thirty-first day of March, 1923, be registrable in the Belfast Registry instead of in the Dublin Registry; and if after that day any such deed is registered in the Dublin Registry such registration shall not be effective for the purposes of the said Acts so far as respects land in Northern Ireland.

Provided that this Order and any registration made in the Belfast Registry in pursuance thereof shall not affect the validity as respects land in Northern Ireland of any registration duly made under the said Acts in the Dublin Registry before the first day of April, 1923.

4.—(1) The staff of the Belfast Registry

shall consist of a registrar, an assistant registrar and such other officers or persons as in the opinion of the Treasury are required for the service of the registry.

(2) Provision may be made by the Secretary of State for the transfer to the Belfast Registry of officers employed in the Registry in Dublin (other than officers transferred to the Government of the Irish Free State), and for the continuance of the service of officers so transferred upon conditions not less favourable as respects remuneration and superannuation than theretofore. Subject as aforesaid the registrar, assistant registrar, and other members of the staff of the Belfast Registry shall be appointed by the Secretary of State with the consent of the Treasury and their tenure, remuneration and superannuation rights shall be such as the Secretary of State may with the like consent determine.

(3) Provisions of the Registration Acts requiring recognizances to be entered into and oaths to be taken by the registrar or assistant registrar shall not apply to the registrar or assistant registrar of the Belfast Registry. The powers and duties of the registrar of the Belfast Registry may, in the absence of the registrar and the assistant registrar, be exercised and performed by an officer nominated in that behalf by the Secretary of State.

5.—(1) For the purpose of the application of the Registration of Deeds Acts to deeds registrable in the Belfast Registry and to the registration of such deeds and all matters incidental thereto and consequential thereon, so far as is consistent with the foregoing provisions of this Order, and save where the context otherwise requires, references in whatever form expressed—

(a) to the Dublin Registry or the registrar or assistant registrar of that registry or to the registers kept therein, shall be construed as references to the Belfast Registry or the registrar or assistant registrar of that registry or to the registers kept therein as the case may be;

(b) to Ireland, shall be construed as references to Northern Ireland;

(c) to the City of Dublin, shall be construed as references to the City of Belfast;

(d) to the "Dublin Gazette," shall be construed as references to the "Belfast Gazette."

(2) The powers of the Treasury under section seven of the Land Transfer (Ireland) Act, 1848, shall include power to make by Order such alterations in form and character of the indexes which are required to be kept for the purposes of the Registration of Deeds Acts and of the manner in which the indexes are to be kept as appear to them to be necessary or proper for the purpose of adapting the system of indexes to the requirements of the new registers to be kept in the Belfast Registry.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of

His late Majesty King William the Fourth, Chapter 77, and of the Act of the 5th year of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria (session 2), Chapter 26, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 23rd day of November, 1922, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, Chapter 77, and of the Act of the 5th year of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria (session 2), Chapter 26, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for authorizing certain improvements at the Episcopal Residence belonging to the See of Peterborough, which is known as The Palace, Peterborough:

"Whereas the Right Reverend Frank Theodore, now Bishop of the Diocese of Peterborough, is desirous that certain improvements should be made at the said Episcopal Residence known as The Palace, Peterborough, and has submitted to us the particulars of such improvements and we have specified our general approval of the same:

"And whereas the said Bishop is also desirous and it appears to us to be expedient that towards the cost of effecting the aforesaid improvements a sum of £300 (being a sum which together with the outstanding balance of the sum already borrowed upon the same security under the authority of the statutes hereinbefore mentioned, does not exceed two years' income of the See) should be provided by his borrowing the same by way of mortgage upon the security of all and every part of the lands tenements and hereditaments endowments or emoluments which now belong or may hereafter belong to the Bishopric of Peterborough:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Frank Theodore, Bishop of the said Diocese of Peterborough (testified by his having affixed his signature and Episcopal Seal to this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that the said Bishop be authorized to borrow from the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne, and that the said Governors be empowered to lend under the provisions of the above-mentioned Acts any sum not exceeding £300 and that as a security for the same the said Bishop do mortgage all and every part of the lands tenements and hereditaments and endowments or emoluments which now belong or may hereafter belong to his said See to the said Governors by Deed for a term of 15 years or until the said sum of £300, with interest for the same as hereinafter mentioned, and all costs and charges which may attend the recovery thereof, shall be fully paid and satisfied and that such principal sum shall be repaid with interest in the manner following, that is to say, during and in respect of the first period of 12 months of the said term computed from the day of the date of the mortgage, no part of the said principal sum shall be repayable but the said Bishop or his successors shall yearly at the end of the second period of 12 months so computed and at the end of every such like period of 12 months thereafter, pay to the said Governors their successors or assigns one-tenth part of the said principal sum of £300 until the whole thereof shall be repaid, and shall also at the end of the first and each

succeeding period of 12 months, computed as aforesaid, pay interest at the rate of £4 per centum per annum on the said principal sum or on so much thereof as shall from time to time remain unpaid. And that if and when it shall happen that either the principal or the interest directed to be paid as hereinbefore mentioned shall be in arrear and unpaid for the space of 40 days after the same shall have become due it shall and may be lawful for the said Governors their successors and assigns to recover the same and the costs and charges attending the recovery thereof by distress and sale in the like manner as rents may be recovered by landlords or lessors from their tenants by the laws in force at the time of such distress and sale. And that such mortgage Deed shall be in the form and to the effect to be approved by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and shall bind as well the said Frank Theodore, now Bishop of the said Diocese of Peterborough, as every succeeding Bishop of the same Diocese, until the principal money and interest costs and charges shall have been paid off and discharged.

"And we further recommend and propose that the said sum of £300 so to be borrowed as aforesaid shall be paid to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, that the said Governors and their successors shall not be bound or required to see to the application thereof, and that upon the receipt of the said sum so to be borrowed as aforesaid the whole or any part or parts thereof shall be applied by us at such time or times and in such manner as shall appear to us to be expedient towards effecting the said proposed improvements at the Episcopal Residence aforesaid.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in conformity with the provisions of the herein named Acts, or of either of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Peterborough.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, and of the Act of the 17th and 18th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 84, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for apportioning the income of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Newton, with Saint Mary's Chapel in the Marsh annexed (hereinafter called 'the said Benefice of Newton'), in the County of Cambridge and in the Diocese of Ely, between that Benefice and four other Benefices, namely, the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Saint Luke, Chesterton, the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Saint John the Evangelist, Cherry Hinton, the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Great Shelford, and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Linton, all in the said County of Cambridge and in the said Diocese of Ely (which four Benefices are hereinafter called 'the said four Benefices'):

"Whereas the Bishop of the said Diocese of Ely is Patron in right of his See of the said Benefice of Newton and also of each of the said four Benefices:

"And whereas the present endowments of the said Benefice of Newton include the sum of £31,186 10s. 8d. £4 per centum per annum Funding Stock (1960-1990) held by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, in trust for and for the benefit of the Rector or Incumbent of the said Benefice of Newton:

"And whereas it has been made to appear to us that the said four Benefices are at present insufficiently endowed, and that after the transfer to or for the benefit of the Incumbents of the said four Benefices of the sums of £4 per centum per annum Funding Stock (1960-1990) hereinafter mentioned the said Benefice of Newton will still be sufficiently endowed:

"And whereas the Right Reverend Frederic Henry, Bishop of Ely, has represented to us, and we are of opinion, that it is desirable that additional provision should be made for the cure of souls within the Parishes of the said four Benefices by means of that apportionment of the income of the said Benefice of Newton which is hereinafter recommended and proposed:

"And whereas the said Benefice of Newton is now vacant, the late Incumbent thereof being the Reverend Thomas William Thomas, in whose favour an annual pension of £425 is payable out of the income of the Benefice:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Archbishop of Canterbury, acting as Archbishop of the Province within which the said Benefice of Newton and the said four Benefices are situate (in testimony of which consent he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Archiepiscopal Seal), and with the consent of the said Frederic Henry, Bishop of the said Diocese of Ely, acting as such Bishop and also as Patron in right of his See of the said Benefice of Newton and of each of the said four Benefices as aforesaid (in testimony of which consent he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners,

“ And provided always that the whole of the First Fruits and Tenths now payable to the Governors of Queen Anne’s Bounty in respect of the said Benefice of Newton, shall continue to be payable by the Rector or Incumbent of such Benefice.

“ And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of either of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.”

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

WHEREAS it is provided by sub-section (1) of section five of the Irish Free State (Consequential Provisions) Act, 1922, that if His Majesty in Council is pleased to declare—

(a) that under the law in force in the Irish Free State any tax is payable in respect of a subject of charge in respect of which a corresponding tax is payable also in Great Britain; and

(b) that arrangements as specified in the declaration have been made with the Government of the Irish Free State with a view to the granting of relief in cases where there is a charge both to the British tax and to the Irish tax in respect of the same subject matter;

then, unless and until the declaration is revoked by His Majesty in Council, the arrangements specified therein shall, so far as they relate to the relief to be granted from the British tax, have effect as if enacted in the said Act, but only if and so long as the arrangements, so far as they relate to the relief to be granted from the Irish tax, have the effect of law in the Irish Free State:

And whereas it is provided by sub-section (5) of the said section that the section shall in relation to any tax which is a reserved tax within the meaning of the Government of Ireland Act, 1920, have effect as if Great Britain included Northern Ireland and shall in relation to any tax which is not such a reserved tax as aforesaid, apply to Northern Ireland in like manner as it applies to Great Britain, but, if and so far as a declaration made under the said section relates to any such last mentioned tax, the declaration shall not extend to Northern Ireland without the consent of the Government of Northern Ireland:

And whereas the Government of Northern Ireland has consented to the extension to Northern Ireland of the arrangements specified in Parts II and III of the Schedule to this declaration with respect to Estate Duty and Stamp Duties:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to declare, and it is hereby declared, that under the laws in force in the Irish Free State, Income Tax, Super-tax, Estate Duty and Stamp Duties are payable in respect of subjects of charge in respect of which corresponding taxes are payable also in Great Britain; and that the arrangements specified in Parts I, II and III of the Schedule to this declaration have been made with the Government of the Irish Free State with a view to the granting of relief in cases where there is a charge both to the British tax and to the Irish tax in respect of the same subject matter, and that this declaration may hereafter be referred to as “ The Relief in respect of Double Taxation (Irish Free State) Declaration, 1923.”

*Schedule.*ARRANGEMENTS FOR RELIEF IN
RESPECT OF DOUBLE TAXATION.

PART I.

Income Tax (including Super-tax).

(a) Relief shall be allowed from British Income Tax in accordance with and under the provisions of section twenty-seven of the Finance Act, 1920, subject to the proviso that for the purpose of determining the Dominion rate of tax the first paragraph of sub-section (8) (d) of that section shall not apply, but the rates of Irish Free State Income Tax and Super-tax respectively shall be ascertained in the same manner as the rates of British Income Tax and Super-tax respectively are required to be ascertained by the second paragraph of sub-section (8) (d) of that section.

(b) The Irish Free State Government shall grant relief from Irish Free State Income Tax at the lower of the two rates following, viz. :—

(i) the rate of relief from British Income Tax allowable under section twenty-seven of the Finance Act, 1920, as modified by this arrangement; and

(ii) the excess of the Irish Free State rate of Income Tax (or, where Irish Free State Super-tax is payable, the excess of the sum of the rates of Irish Free State Income Tax and Super-tax) over the rate of relief from British Income Tax allowable as aforesaid.

(c) This arrangement applies to Income Tax (including Super-tax) for the year of assessment commencing on the sixth day of April, nineteen hundred and twenty-three and subsequent years.

PART II.

Estate Duty.

(a) Where the Commissioners of Inland Revenue are satisfied that Estate Duty is payable in the Irish Free State by reason of a death of a person dying on or after the first day of April, nineteen hundred and twenty-three in respect of any property situate in the Irish Free State and passing on such death, they shall allow a sum equal to the amount of that duty to be deducted from the Estate Duty payable in Great Britain in respect of that property on the same death.

(b) Where the Revenue Commissioners of the Irish Free State are satisfied that Estate Duty is payable in Great Britain by reason of a death of a person dying on or after the said first day of April in respect of any property situate in Great Britain and passing on such death, they shall allow a sum equal to the amount of that duty to be deducted from the Estate Duty payable in the Irish Free State in respect of that property on the same death.

(c) Any question as to whether any property is to be treated for the purposes of this arrangement as situated in Great Britain or in the Irish Free State shall be determined according to the laws in force in England and Ireland on the sixth day of December, nineteen hundred and twenty-two.

(d) This arrangement shall apply as between Northern Ireland and the Irish Free State in like manner as it applies as between Great Britain and the Irish Free State until the Government of Northern Ireland signify that they have withdrawn their consent to such application.

PART III.

Stamp Duties.

(a) Where on or after the first day of April, nineteen hundred and twenty-three an instrument is chargeable with Stamp Duty in Great Britain and in the Irish Free State, and has been stamped in one of those countries, the instrument shall, to the extent of the duty it bears, be deemed to be stamped in the other country.

Provided that, if the Stamp Duty chargeable on any instrument in such other country exceeds the Stamp Duty chargeable in respect of that instrument in the country in which the instrument has previously been stamped, the instrument shall not be deemed to have been duly stamped in such other country unless and until stamped in accordance with the laws of that country with a stamp denoting an amount equal to such excess.

(b) Where composition for Stamp Duty is made or agreed to be made in one of such countries, any instrument which by virtue of the composition is exempt from the payment of duty in that country shall, on and after the said first day of April, be treated in the other country as having been stamped in the first-mentioned country with a stamp denoting the amount of duty which, but for the composition, would have been chargeable on that instrument.

(c) This arrangement shall apply as between Northern Ireland and the Irish Free State in like manner as it applies as between Great Britain and the Irish Free State until the Government of Northern Ireland signify that they have withdrawn their consent to such application.

And whereas it is provided by sub-section (1) of Section 2 of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that every Special Order may be varied or revoked by a subsequent Special Order;

And whereas the Minister of Labour is of opinion that it is desirable to vary the Trade Boards (Stamped or Pressed Metal-wares) Order, 1919, with a view to correcting the description of the trade specified in the Appendix to the said Order;

And whereas the Minister of Labour is further of opinion that it is desirable to vary the Trade Boards (Button-making) Order, 1919, in so far as it may apply to any operations or processes specified in the Appendix to this Order;

Now, therefore, the Minister of Labour in pursuance of the powers in him vested, as before recited, does hereby make a Special Order that from and after the day of 1923, the following provisions shall have effect (that is to say):—

ARTICLE 1.—The description of the trade specified in the Appendix to the said Trade Boards (Stamped or Pressed Metal-wares) Order, 1919, is hereby varied by the substitution thereof of the description set out in the Appendix to this Order.

ARTICLE 2.—The Trade Boards (Button-making) Order, 1919, is hereby varied by the exclusion therefrom of any operations and processes comprised therein which may be included in the Appendix to this Order.

ARTICLE 3.—This Order may be cited as the

Trade Boards (Stamped or Pressed Metal-wares) Order, 1923.

Main Manufacturing Processes.

1. the manufacture from metals in sheet or strip form (other than precious metals or base metals covered when in sheet or strip form wholly or partially by any process or operation with precious metals) by the processes or operations of cold stamping or cold pressing (including cutting, forming, drawing or piercing) of any of the articles or parts of articles described in the First Schedule hereto;

Auxiliary Processes.

Annealing, Hardening, Cutting.

2.—(i) the processes or operations of annealing or hardening or cutting up of metal by circular shears or guillotine when done (a) to produce any of the articles or parts thereof of which the manufacture forms, by reason of paragraph 1 hereof and the First Schedule hereto, part of the trade defined in this Order, and (b) in association with or in conjunction with such manufacture;

Assembling.

(ii) assembling for the purpose of producing any of the articles described (otherwise than by way of exclusion) in the First Schedule hereto or any parts of such articles or any combinations thereof, if the things assembled were mainly manufactured (either inside or outside Great Britain) by the processes or operations described (otherwise than by way of exclusion) in paragraph 1 hereof, when such assembling is done by any process or operation including brazing, soldering, spinning, beading, trimming and any other assembling processes or operations whether similar or not and is done in a department mainly dealing with articles or parts of articles wherever manufactured of which the manufacture if done in Great Britain would form part of the trade defined by this Order;

Finishing, Viewing, Warehousing, etc.

(iii) the processes or operations described in the Second Schedule hereto when done:—

(a) to any of the articles described (otherwise than by way of exclusion) in the First Schedule hereto or any parts of such articles or any combinations thereof which are mainly manufactured (whether inside or outside Great Britain) by the processes or operations described (otherwise than by way of exclusion) in paragraph 1, and

(b) in a department mainly dealing with articles or parts of articles or combinations of articles wherever manufactured of which the manufacture if done in Great Britain would form part of the trade defined by this Order, and

(c) in association with or in conjunction

with any of the processes or operations which form by reason of paragraphs 1 or 2 (ii) part of the trade defined in this Order;

Corset Steels, etc.

(iv) the capping, counting, covering (prior to capping or tipping), looping, studding or tipping of corset busks or steels when done in association with or in conjunction with the manufacture of any of the articles described in the First Schedule hereto by the processes or operations described in paragraph 1 hereof;

Manufacture of Buttons, etc.

3. the processes or operations described in the Third Schedule hereto when carried on in an establishment mainly engaged in performing the processes or operations described (otherwise than by way of exclusion) in paragraphs 1 or 2 hereof, and the Second Schedule hereto, for the purpose of producing the articles or parts thereof or combinations thereof described (otherwise than by way of exclusion) in the First Schedule hereto;

Exclusions.

Provided that—

4. nothing in this Order shall be deemed to include as part of the trade hereby defined any of the processes or operations described in the Fourth Schedule hereto.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

Articles or parts thereof, known in the trade as:—

Cabinet, etc., Fittings.

(i) blind, cabinet or window fittings; curtain accessories; shop fitters' sundries;

Door, etc., Fittings.

(ii) door or door-lock fittings or furniture (including escutcheons, finger-plates, handles, key-hole plates, knobs, knockers, letter-plates, number-plates, numerals, roses and any other door or door-lock fittings or furniture, whether or not similar to the articles specified);

(iii) brackets, chandeliers, electroliers, pendants or standards for electric or gas light; gas burners;

Bag Fittings, etc.

(iv) fittings or frames for attaché cases, hat-boxes, suit cases, trunks; trunk furniture; fittings or frames (including locks which are part of such fittings) for cutlery cases, jewel cases, purses, betting-bags, brief-bags, cash-bags, cricket-bags, hand-bags, kit-bags, tennis-bags, or similar bags,

except when manufactured in an establishment mainly engaged in the manufacture of locks or latches;

(v) ferrules; sunshade or umbrella furniture, namely, caps, ferrules, notches, runners, tip-cups, tips (excluding the making-

up or assembling of sunshades or umbrellas); mounts for sunshades, umbrellas or walking-sticks; whip mounts;

Clothing Fittings, etc.

(vi) badges, fittings, letters, numerals and ornaments (other than medals and other similar orders and decorations) for use on belts, clothing or headgear; braces or suspenders used as articles of clothing; buckles; corset busks, steels and tips;

Bedstead Mounts, etc.

(vii) mounts or ornaments for bedsteads or fenders; fender supports;

Toilet Sundries, etc.

1. The provisions contained in the Schedule to the said Act are hereby altered and modified in the manner hereinafter appearing.

2. Regulation 1 (2) (b) of the said Schedule shall be altered and modified so as to be in the following terms:—

“(b) premises (including a slaughter-house) other than a market.”

3. Regulation 2 (1) of the said Schedule shall be altered and modified so as to be in the following terms:—

“(1) Imported cattle which have been moved to an authorised market shall at all times while therein be kept separate from all animals other than imported cattle, sheep or goats, and shall not, if part only of a market is authorised for the purposes of this Schedule, be permitted while any animals other than imported cattle, sheep or goats are in the market, to enter any part of the market other than the authorised part.”

4. Regulation 2 (2) of the said Schedule shall be altered and modified so as to be in the following terms:—

“(2) No animals other than imported cattle, sheep or goats shall be permitted to enter an authorised market while it is being used as such.”

5. Regulation 4 (1) (b) of the said Schedule shall be altered and modified so as to be in the following terms:—

“(b) the lairs or enclosures must not be used for any animals other than imported cattle, sheep or goats in course of being moved to an authorised market under this Schedule.”

ANIMALS (LANDING FROM IRELAND,
CHANNEL ISLANDS, AND ISLE OF
MAN) ORDER OF 1923.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1922, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Interpretation.

1. In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires—

“The Act of 1894” means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894;

“The Act of 1922” means the Importation of Animals Act, 1922 (Session 2):

“Animals” means cattle, sheep and goats and all other ruminating animals, and swine;

“Approved dip” means a sheep dip approved by the Minister for sheep-scab, or purporting to be so approved:

“Carcase” means the carcase of an animal, and includes part of a carcase, and the meat, bones, hide, skin, hoofs, horns, offal, or other part of an animal, separately or otherwise, or any portion thereof;

“Disease” means cattle-plague (that is to say, rinderpest, or the disease commonly called cattle-plague), contagious pleuropneumonia of cattle, foot-and-mouth disease, sheep pox, sheep-scab, swine-fever (that is to say, the disease known as typhoid fever of swine, soldier, purples, red-disease, hog-cholera) or anthrax;

“Fodder” means hay or other substance commonly used for food of animals;

“Imported” means brought to Great Britain from a country out of Great Britain:

“Inspector” means a person appointed by the Minister to be a Veterinary Inspector for the purposes of the Act of 1894:

“Lairage-men” means men specially appointed by the occupier of a Landing Place for the purpose of landing animals at a Landing Place and feeding and watering and tending them in a reception lair;

“Landing Place” means a part of a port approved by the Minister for the landing of imported animals:

“Litter” means straw or other substance commonly used for bedding or otherwise for or about animals;

“Local Inspector” means a person appointed by the Local Authority of the district to be an Inspector for the purposes of the Act of 1894.

“Market” includes a fairground or saleyard:

“Master” includes a person having the charge or command of a vessel (other than a pilot):

“The Minister” and “the Ministry” mean the Minister and Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries respectively;

“Person” includes a body corporate;

“Reception-lair” means a lair adjacent or near to the place of landing which is set apart for the reception of any animals immediately after landing for the purpose of their examination;

“Sheep” includes lambs.

“Slaughterhouse” means any premises where animals are habitually slaughtered:

“Superintendent of a Landing Place” includes a foreman or wharfinger or other person in charge of a Landing Place:

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Acts of 1894 and 1922.

PART I.

LANDING REGULATIONS.

IMPORTATION OF ANIMALS FROM IRELAND,
CHANNEL ISLANDS, AND ISLE OF MAN.

Importation from Ireland.

2.—(1) Imported animals brought from Ireland shall not be landed in Great Britain unless—

(a) the animals have been put on board at a port specified in the First Schedule to this Order; and

(b) the animals are accompanied by a certificate of a Veterinary Officer appointed, in the case of animals shipped from a port within the jurisdiction of the Government of Northern Ireland, by that Government, and in the case of animals shipped from a port within the jurisdiction of the Irish Free State, by the Ministry of the Free State Government, certifying that the animals have been inspected by him immediately prior to shipment and found to be free from disease; and

(c) the landing is at a Landing Place approved for that purpose by the Minister; and

(2) The animals shall be landed in such manner, at such times, and subject to such supervision as the Commissioners of Customs and Excise direct.

(3) When landed the animals shall be under such supervision and control of an Inspector as may be necessary for the purposes of this Order; and until the arrival of the Inspector be under the supervision and control of the Superintendent of the Landing Place.

Additional Restrictions applicable to Landing of Swine from Ireland.

3.—(1) The landing in Great Britain of swine brought from Ireland shall be subject to the following additional provisions:—

(2) Swine not intended for immediate slaughter shall be accompanied on landing and movement from the Landing Place by a licence authorising such landing and movement granted by an officer duly authorised in that behalf by the Government of Northern Ireland or of the Irish Free State, as the case may be, and subject to the following conditions, namely:

(i) Every application for such licence shall be accompanied by—

(a) a declaration in the Form A set forth in the Second Schedule to this Order or to the like effect signed by the occupier of the premises where the swine to which the application relates have been kept, and countersigned by a member of the Police force of the District in which such premises are situate; and

(b) a declaration in the Form B set forth in the said Second Schedule or to the like effect signed by the applicant for the licence.

(ii) A licence shall become void if the swine to which it relates are during the voyage to Great Britain permitted to come in contact with swine which are not accompanied by a similar licence under this Article.

(iii) Swine moved with a licence under this Article shall not, for a period of 28 days after arrival at the place of destination specified in the licence, be moved from such place of destination except to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse, and then only with permission in writing from a local inspector. Swine, while detained under this Article, shall be kept separate from all other swine. This provision does not restrict the removal of the carcase of a pig.

(3) Fat swine intended for immediate slaughter may be landed for the purpose of movement to a particular bacon factory or slaughterhouse, or to any particular lairs, market, or saleyard specially authorised to be used for the purpose of this Article by the local authority of the district, if accompanied by a licence authorising the landing and movement granted by an officer duly authorised in that behalf by the Government of Northern Ireland or of the Irish Free State, as the case may be, and subject to the following conditions, namely:

Swine moved under this Article to any lairs, market, or saleyard shall not be moved therefrom except with a licence authorising such movement granted by an Inspector of the local authority of the district in which the lairs, market, or saleyard are situate and only to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse specified in the licence.

(4) Swine moved under this Article to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse shall after their arrival thereat be there detained until they are slaughtered.

(5) A copy of every special authority for the use of any lairs, market, or saleyard shall be forthwith sent to the Ministry by the Local Authority granting it.

(6) If any swine, other than swine moved under this Article, are moved into any lairs, market, or saleyard while such premises are being used for the purposes of this Article, those swine shall be subject to the same restrictions as swine moved under this Article to such premises.

(7) For the purposes of this Article the expressions "market" and "saleyard" shall include "part of a market" and "part of a saleyard."

Provisions as to Movement of Swine and Licences for such Movement.

4.—(1.) Where swine are moved with a licence under Article 3 of this Order to any lairs, market, or saleyard, the licence shall be delivered up in exchange for the licence for movement of the swine from such premises. Where swine are moved with a licence under Article 3 of this Order to any premises other than a lair, market or saleyard, the licence shall forthwith after completion of the movement be delivered or sent to the nearest police station by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing the movement.

(2.) A copy of a licence for movement from any lairs, market, or saleyard, shall be sent by the Inspector granting the same to the local authority of the district in which is situate the bacon factory or slaughterhouse specified in the licence.

(3.) Swine, while being moved under this Order, shall so far as is practicable be kept separate from all other swine, and shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay to the place of destination specified in the licence and not elsewhere.

(4.) Swine moved with a licence under Article 3 of this Order shall not, unless otherwise expressly provided by Order of the Minister, be subject to any restriction on movement of swine imposed by an Order of the Minister or by regulations of a local authority relating to swine-fever.

(5.) Licences shall be produced by the person in charge of the swine moved therewith on demand to any inspector or to a constable, and such person shall, if required by such officer, give his name and address.

Importation from the Channel Islands and Isle of Man.

5.—(1) Animals brought from the Channel Islands or the Isle of Man may be landed in Great Britain without being subject to the provisions of the Third Schedule to the Act of 1894 which relate to slaughter or quarantine, but subject to the provisions of this Order.

(2) The landing shall be at a Landing Place approved for that purpose by the Minister.

(3) The landing of animals from the Channel Islands under this Article is hereby made subject to the following conditions:—

First. That the vessel in which they are imported has not, within twenty-eight days before taking them on board, had on board any animal exported or carried coastwise from a port or place in any country other than Great Britain, Ireland, the Channel Islands or the Isle of Man.

Second. That the vessel has not, within twenty-one days before taking on board the animals imported, or at any time since taking them on board, entered or been in any port or place in any country other than Great Britain, Ireland, the Channel Islands or the Isle of Man.

Third. That the animals imported have not, while on board the vessel, been in contact with any animal exported or carried coastwise from any port or place in any country other than Great Britain, Ireland, the Channel Islands or the Isle of Man.

(4) The animals from the Channel Islands shall not be landed unless and until the master of the vessel has delivered to a proper officer of Customs and Excise a declaration signed by him that all the animals then imported therein are properly imported according to the provisions of this Article.

(5) The animals shall be landed in such manner, at such times and subject to such supervision, as the Commissioners of Customs and Excise direct.

(6) When landed the animals shall be under such supervision and control of an Inspector as may be necessary for the purposes of this Order; and until the arrival of the Inspector be under the supervision and control of the Superintendent of the Landing Place.

PART II.

PROVISIONS APPLICABLE TO
LANDING PLACES.*Restrictions on Use of Landing Places.*

6. Subject to the provisions of the approval of a Landing Place, no animals other than such as are landed under this Order shall be landed at or be moved into the Landing Place.

Examination of Animals.

7.—(1.) Each cargo of animals landed at a Landing Place under this Order shall on landing be driven to a reception lair or reception lairs approved by an Inspector for reception of the cargo, and the animals shall be there detained and isolated from all other animals until their movement from the reception lair is authorised by an Inspector, which authority shall not be granted unless and until the whole cargo has been examined in daylight by an Inspector, and until the expiration of ten hours after the landing of the last animal of the cargo. Cattle, sheep or goats may not be removed from the Landing Place except in accordance with the provisions of Part IV. of this Order.

(2.) If two or more cargoes or parts of cargoes are permitted to be in a reception lair at the same time, they shall for the purposes of this Order be treated as one cargo.

(3.) Until permission has been given for the removal of an animal from the reception lair it shall not be allowed to come in contact with any animal which does not form, or is not treated as, part of the same cargo.

(4.) If an animal forming part of a cargo dies or is slaughtered on board or before its examination, the carcass shall not be removed from the Landing Place where the animal or carcass is landed without the permission of an Inspector.

(5.) In the case of a cargo of animals landed or intended to be landed at different times or at different ports in Great Britain, an Inspector shall cause the animals in a reception lair to be there detained until he has examined, or become acquainted with the result of the examination of, the rest of the cargo.

(6.) An Inspector may, if he considers it necessary, require the person in charge of any cattle in a Landing Place to cause the same to be securely tied by the head or neck in such manner as not to cause unnecessary suffering.

(7) The occupier of a Landing Place shall afford such assistance to the Inspector as he may require to enable him to examine the animals.

Restrictions on Access to Landing Place.

8. No person, except officers of Customs and Excise, lairage-men, the Superintendent of the Landing Place, Officers of the Ministry, and such other persons as may be specially authorised in writing by an Inspector shall during the time of the landing of the animals be admitted to the landing stage, pier, quay, or other part of the Landing Place at which the animals are landed, and no person except as aforesaid shall at any time be admitted to any part of the Landing Place which is being used as a reception-lair.

Landing Place Charges.

9. Charges made by the occupier of a Landing Place in respect of animals landed under this Order shall be sanctioned by the Ministry where the charges relate to the following matters, *i.e.*, landing, lairage, or dipping.

Provisions for Movement into and through a District in which a Landing Place is Situate.

10.—(1) Any Order of the Minister which imposes restrictions in respect of an area in Great Britain in which a Landing Place is situate shall not be deemed to prohibit the landing of animals at such Landing Place under this Order unless expressly so stated.

(2) Regulations made by a Local Authority of the District in which a Landing Place is situate as to movement into or within the District of that Local Authority shall not apply to the landing of animals at the Landing Place, or to their removal therefrom if the animals are consigned to a place of destination outside the District of such local authority, and are moved from a railway loading bank in or adjoining the Landing Place forthwith by railway out of the District of the local authority.

Power of Occupier to remove Animals from Landing Place.

11. Animals landed at a Landing Place shall, subject to the necessary licence being granted under this Order, be removed by the owner or person in charge thereof from the Landing Place forthwith if such removal is directed by the Superintendent of the Landing Place, and if an animal is not so removed by the owner or person in charge thereof, the occupier of the Landing Place, or the Superintendent thereof acting on behalf of the occupier, shall have power to remove the animal from the Landing Place, and to recover from the owner of the animal at the time of default the costs of and incidental to the removal.

Provision of Overall Clothes.

12. The occupier of a Landing Place shall at all times provide to the satisfaction of the Ministry proper and suitable suits of overall clothes for the use of lairage-men and other persons entering the Landing Place, to be worn at such times as an Inspector may direct.

Food and Water.

13.—(1) Animals landed at a Landing Place shall, until they are taken charge of by the owners or consignees, be supplied by the occupier of the Landing Place, or the Superintendent thereof acting on behalf of the occupier, with a proper and sufficient supply of food and water, and the expenses incurred by them in respect thereof shall be defrayed by the owners or consignees of the animals, and may be recovered by such occupier from the owners or consignees in any court of competent jurisdiction.

(2) The animals shall, after they have been taken charge of by the owners or consignees, be supplied by the owners or consignees with a proper and sufficient supply of food and water.

(3) If an animal remains without a proper and sufficient supply of food and water in contravention of the provisions of this Article, the occupier of the Landing Place and the Superintendent thereof, and the owner and the consignee and the person in charge of the animal, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts or omissions, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894; and it shall lie on the person liable to supply food and water to the animal when charged to prove the proper and sufficient supply of food or water or both, and the time when the same was so supplied.

(4) An Inspector may in any such case require the detention of the animal in the Landing Place until it has received a proper and sufficient supply of food and water; and, until the Inspector is satisfied that the animal has received it, the animal shall not be moved from the Landing Place.

Disinfection of Landing Place, &c.

14.—(1) An Inspector may give notice to the occupier or Superintendent of a Landing Place requiring the cleansing and disinfection by such occupier of any portion of the Landing Place, or any fittings, pens, hurdles or other things that have been used in connection with the landing of animals under this Order, and when such notice shall have been given, that portion of the Landing Place, or those things, as the case may be, shall not be used for animals unless and until the same shall have been cleansed and disinfected to the satisfaction of an Inspector.

(2) The provisions of Article 2 (*Cleansing and Disinfection of Markets and Sales*) of the Markets and Sales Order of 1910 or of any Order amending those provisions shall not apply to any market or sale of animals held in a Landing Place.

Disinfection of Persons and Clothes.

15. An Inspector or the Superintendent of a Landing Place is hereby empowered to affix at or near the entrance thereof or of any building therein a notice to the effect that persons before leaving such Landing Place or building will be required to disinfect themselves and their clothes in the manner specified in such notice, and thereupon every person shall disinfect himself and his clothes accordingly.

Power to exclude Persons.

16.—(1) An Inspector or the Superintendent of a Landing Place is hereby empowered to affix at or near the entrance thereof or of any building therein a notice forbidding persons to enter therein without the permission mentioned in the notice; and thereupon any person who enters or goes into, on, or over such premises without that permission shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2) An Inspector or the Superintendent of a Landing Place is hereby empowered to direct any person to quit such Landing Place, or any particular building, lair, landing-stage, pier, quay, or other portion thereof; and thereupon any person who fails to quit such premises on direction as aforesaid shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

General Power of Detention.

17.—(1) No carcase, fodder, litter, dung or manure, or any fittings, pens, hurdles or utensils that have been used for or about animals, shall be moved from a Landing Place or from any lair or other place therein, except with the permission of an Inspector.

(2) If it appears to an Inspector with respect to any carcase, fodder, litter, dung, or other thing brought in the same vessel with animals landed under this Order, that disease may be thereby introduced, he may seize and detain the same; and he shall forthwith report the facts to the Minister, who may give such directions as he thinks fit, either for the destruction, disinfection or further deten-

tion thereof or for the delivery thereof to the owner on such conditions, if any (including payment by the owner of expenses incurred by them in respect of detention thereof), as he thinks fit.

Conditional Permits.

18. An Inspector may impose conditions on the removal of anything from a Landing Place for which a permission granted by an Inspector is required, and if any person fails to comply with any such condition, which is specified in the permission, and which he is thereby required to observe, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Movement within a Landing Place.

19. Notwithstanding any provision in this Order, an animal may, with the permission of an Inspector, and shall forthwith, if so directed by an Inspector, be moved from a reception lair or other part of the Landing Place to any other reception lair or part of the Landing Place authorised or directed by the Inspector.

Injured Animals.

20. If an Inspector is of opinion that an animal in a Landing Place is mortally injured, or so severely injured, or otherwise in such physical condition, that it is cruel to keep it alive, he may require the person in charge of the animal to slaughter it forthwith with such instruments or appliances and with such precautions and in such manner as to inflict as little suffering as practicable, and if the person so required shall refuse or neglect to do so, or if there is no person in charge present in the Landing Place, the Inspector may cause the animal to be slaughtered.

PART III.

DISEASE OR CALVING IN A LANDING PLACE.

Procedure in Case of Cattle-Plague, Pleuro-Pneumonia, Foot-and-Mouth Disease, or Sheep-Pox.

21.—(1.) If an Inspector is of opinion that an animal in a Landing Place is affected with or suspected of cattle-plague, pleuro-pneumonia, foot-and-mouth disease, or sheep-pox, he shall so certify and forthwith direct the Landing Place to be closed, and the Inspector shall give notice of such closing to such persons and in such manner as he may think expedient for the purposes of carrying into effect the provisions of this Article.

(2.) Where a certificate has been so made the following Rules shall apply to the Landing Place unless and until the Minister by Order otherwise directs:—

Rule 1. Animals shall not be landed at, or moved into or out of, the Landing Place except with, and subject to the conditions imposed by, a Licence of an Inspector.

Rule 2. Carcases shall not be removed from the Landing Place except with the permission in writing of an Inspector.

Rule 3. Fodder, litter, dung, utensils, pens, hurdles, or other things shall not be removed from the Landing Place except with the permission in writing of an Inspector, which permission shall not be granted until such things have been thoroughly disinfected to the satisfaction of the Inspector.

Rule 4. No person shall, unless authorised in writing by an Inspector, enter any shed or other place, being part of the Landing Place, in which the diseased or suspected animal is or recently has been.

Rule 5. Every person upon leaving any such shed or other place shall thoroughly wash his hands with soap and water and disinfect his boots and clothes.

Rule 6. A person tending a diseased or suspected animal shall not tend any animal not so diseased or suspected except with the permission in writing of an Inspector.

Rule 7. Where the disease is sheep-pox, Rules 1, 2 and 6 shall apply only to sheep and the carcases of sheep.

Disinfection where Foot-and-Mouth Disease exists.

22.—(1.) If an animal brought from Ireland or the Channel Islands or the Isle of Man for the purpose of being landed in Great Britain is affected with or suspected of foot-and-mouth disease, the following provisions shall apply whether the animal is so landed or not.

(2.) The animal or its carcase and all animals carried in the same vessel shall only be landed at such place and at such time and in such manner as an Inspector may direct.

(3.) The parts of the vessel in which the animals have been carried shall be cleansed and disinfected by the owner or charterer of the vessel to the satisfaction of an Inspector as soon as practicable, and, if so required by a notice given by any such Inspector to the master of the vessel, before any cargo, other than the animals or their carcases, is removed from the vessel.

(4.) All dung of animals, and all partly consumed fodder that has been supplied to the animals, and all litter that has been used for or about the animals, shall be landed and disposed of by destruction or otherwise by the owner or charterer of the vessel in such manner as an Inspector shall direct.

(5.) Every person who has tended the animals or who shall land from the vessel shall, if so required by an Inspector, thoroughly wash his hands with soap and water and disinfect his boots and clothes in such manner as the Inspector may direct.

(6.) If any person acts in contravention of this Article, or fails to comply with the provisions thereof, he shall, according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Procedure in case of Sheep-scab.

23.—(1.) A sheep shall not be moved out of a Landing Place if and so long as it is, in the opinion of an Inspector, affected with or suspected of sheep-scab.

(2.) If an Inspector is of opinion that a sheep in a Landing Place is affected with or suspected of sheep-scab, any other sheep which were brought in the same vessel with the diseased or suspected animal, or which, in the opinion of the Inspector, have been exposed to infection by contact with the diseased or suspected animal or otherwise, shall not be moved out of the Landing Place unless they are accompanied by a licence authorising such movement granted by an Inspector and containing the conditions upon which such movement is authorised.

(3.) Sheep authorised by a licence so granted to be moved to a slaughterhouse shall be there detained and be slaughtered within four days after their arrival at the slaughterhouse.

(4.) Sheep authorised by a licence so granted to be moved to any premises other than a slaughterhouse shall not be moved out of the Landing Place unless and until they have been caused to be dipped in the Landing Place, to the satisfaction of an Inspector, by a thorough immersion in an approved dip; and sheep moved under the authority of any such licence shall after their arrival at the place of destination specified in the licence, be there detained and isolated from other sheep until an Inspector of the local authority is satisfied that they have been dipped, between the seventh and fourteenth days after the date of their previous dipping in the Landing Place, by a thorough immersion in an approved dip, and the movement licence is endorsed by the Inspector with the word "Released":

Provided that sheep required to be detained and dipped under this provision may before the expiration of the period within which their dipping is required at the place of destination be moved, without having been so dipped, to a slaughterhouse for immediate slaughter, if such movement is authorised by a licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District from which the sheep are to be moved. Sheep so moved shall be detained at the slaughterhouse and there slaughtered within four days.

(5.) The sheep shall be moved by the nearest available route and without avoidable delay to the place of destination specified in the licence, and not elsewhere, and during the movement the sheep shall, as far as practicable, be kept separate from sheep which are not being moved with a licence under this Article.

(6.) Every licence under this Article shall forthwith after completion of the movement be delivered, or sent to, the nearest police station by the person in charge of the sheep at the time of completing the movement.

(7.) A copy of every licence granted under this Article shall be sent by the Inspector granting the same to the local authority of the District in which the place of destination is situate.

(8.) An Isolation Notice under Article 6 of the Sheep-Scab Order of 1920 shall not be served on sheep to which this Article relates in respect of their exposure to the infection of sheep-scab in the Landing Place or previously.

Sheep-scab found on Examination before Shipment.

24.—(1.) Where in the opinion of a Veterinary Officer appointed to act under Part I of this Order for the examination of animals intended for conveyance to Great Britain any sheep is affected with or suspected of sheep-scab, the provisions of Article 23 of this Order shall apply to sheep which have been exposed to infection by contact with diseased or suspected sheep.

(2.) For the purposes of this Article a certificate by any such Officer that an animal is affected with, or suspected of, sheep-scab, or that an animal has been exposed to infection by contact with an animal so affected or suspected, shall be conclusive evidence of those facts.

Procedure in Case of Anthrax.

25.—(1.) If an Inspector is of opinion that an animal in a Landing Place is affected with, or suspected of, anthrax, he shall so inform the local authority and the Medical Officer of Health of the District.

(2.) Article 10 (*Disposal of Carcases*) and Article 11 (*Precautions to be adopted with respect to Milk*) of the Anthrax Order of 1910 shall apply, but otherwise that Order shall not apply.

Calving Cows.

26. A cow which has calved during the voyage to Great Britain or in the Landing Place shall not be moved from the Landing Place until such movement is permitted by an Inspector, which permission shall in no case be granted until the Inspector is satisfied that twenty-four hours have expired since the time of calving.

Exemption of Landing Places from certain Provisions in Orders of the Minister.

27.—(1.) A Landing Place shall not be declared to be an Infected Place under any Order of the Minister, and any provision in any such Order which relates to Infected Places shall not apply to a Landing Place.

(2.) A Detention Notice or Isolation Notice under the Sheep-Scab Order of 1920, or any Order amending that Order, shall not be served in relation to any sheep in a Landing Place.

PART IV.

This Part of this Order as regards cattle embodies in effect the regulations contained in the Schedule to the Act of 1922.

REGULATION OF MOVEMENT OF IMPORTED CATTLE, SHEEP AND GOATS.

Licence for Movement from Landing Place.

28.—(1) No imported cattle, sheep or goats shall be moved from the Landing Place at which they are landed except under a licence granted by an Inspector and in accordance with such conditions, if any, as may be imposed by the licence and with the regulations contained in this Part of this Order.

(2) A licence granted under this provision shall be a licence authorising the cattle, sheep or goats to be moved either to—

(a) a market specially authorised in writing by the local authority of the district for the purposes of this provision (in this Part of this Order referred to as "an authorised market"); or

(b) premises (including a slaughterhouse) other than a market.

(3) A local authority may, if they think fit, instead of granting an authority for the purposes of this provision in respect of the whole of a market, grant such an authority in respect of some part of a market, and where a part of a market is so authorised the provisions of this Part of this Order shall, unless the context otherwise requires, have effect as though references to a part of a market were substituted for references to a market.

(4) A copy of every authority granted by a local authority for the use of a market for the purposes of this provision shall be sent forthwith by the local authority to the Ministry.

Conditions to be Complied with in the Case of Cattle, Sheep and Goats in Authorised Markets.

29.—(1) Imported cattle, sheep and goats

which have been moved to an authorised market shall at all times while therein be kept separate from all animals other than imported cattle, sheep or goats, and shall not, if part only of a market is authorised for the purposes of this Part of this Order, be permitted, while any animals other than imported cattle, sheep or goats are in the market, to enter any part of the market other than the authorised part.

(2) No animals other than imported cattle, sheep or goats shall be permitted to enter an authorised market while it is being used as such.

(3) Imported cattle or sheep exposed for sale at an authorised market shall not be moved therefrom otherwise than under a licence granted by a local inspector and in accordance with such conditions, if any, as may be imposed by the licence or otherwise than to premises, not being an authorised market, to be there detained in accordance with the provisions of this Part of this Order.

Detention of imported cattle, sheep or goats on arrival at premises other than market.

30. When imported cattle, sheep or goats have under a licence in that behalf been moved to premises other than an authorised market, whether from the Landing Place or from an authorised market, they shall on arriving at those premises be detained therein, unless previously slaughtered therein, for a period of six days from the date of arrival.

During the said period the cattle, sheep or goats shall not be moved from the said premises otherwise than under a further licence to be granted by a local inspector, or otherwise than to a slaughterhouse, to be therein detained until they are slaughtered, or to a vessel for export.

Temporary detention in special enclosures of cattle, sheep and goats awaiting sale at market.

31.—(1) Where a licence has been granted under this Part of this Order authorising the movement of imported cattle, sheep or goats to an authorised market, the animals may by virtue of that licence, subject as hereinafter provided, be temporarily detained in special lairs or other enclosures adjoining or near to the market while awaiting exposure for sale in the market:

Provided that—

(a) the lairs or enclosures must be lairs or enclosures the use of which has been authorised by the local authority for the purpose of this provision, and the use of the lairs or enclosures for the purpose aforesaid shall be subject to such directions as may be given by or on behalf of the local authority;

(b) the lairs or enclosures must not be used for any animals other than imported cattle, sheep or goats in course of being moved to an authorised market under this Part of this Order;

(c) the cattle, sheep or goats shall not remain in the lairs or enclosures for a period exceeding seventy-two hours.

(2) If the Minister after making enquiries is satisfied that it is for any reason inexpedient or undesirable that any lairs or other enclosures, the use of which has been authorised for the purpose aforesaid, should be used for that purpose, the Minister may direct that those lairs or enclosures shall cease to be autho-

rised lairs or enclosures for the purpose of this provision.

Dipping of Store Sheep in Landing Place.

32. Sheep shall not be authorised by an Inspector to be moved out of the Landing Place unless and until they have been caused to be dipped in the Landing Place, to the satisfaction of the Inspector, by a thorough immersion in an approved dip: Provided that this Article shall not apply to sheep which, in the opinion of the Inspector, are fit and intended for immediate slaughter or are declared in writing by the owner or person in charge thereof to be intended for immediate slaughter. Every such declaration shall be given to the Inspector and retained by him.

Movement of Sheep from Landing Place to be subject to special conditions as to dipping or slaughter.

33.—(1) A licence authorising movement of sheep from a Landing Place shall be subject to the following conditions, namely:—

(a) In the case of sheep which have been dipped once in the Landing Place under Article 32 of this Order the sheep may be moved with the licence either

(i) to premises in Great Britain, other than a market, whereon the sheep shall be detained and isolated from other sheep until they have been certified by a local inspector of the place of destination to have been dipped by a thorough immersion in an approved dip between the seventh and fourteenth days after the date of their previous dipping in the Landing Place; or

(ii) to an authorised market, from which the sheep may be moved with a licence of a local inspector of the District in which the market is held, to a slaughterhouse, or to premises for detention and isolation, until they have been certified by a local inspector of the place of destination to have been dipped by a thorough immersion in an approved dip between the seventh and fourteenth days after the date of their previous dipping in the Landing Place.

(b) In the case of sheep which have been declared in writing by the owner to be intended for immediate slaughter and which have not been dipped in the Landing Place in an approved dip to the satisfaction of an Inspector, the sheep may be moved with the licence either

(i) to a slaughterhouse, or

(ii) to premises in Great Britain, other than a market, whereon the sheep shall be detained and isolated from other sheep until they have been certified by a local inspector of the place of destination to have been twice dipped on the premises by a thorough immersion in an approved dip, with an interval of not less than seven and not more than fourteen days between the dippings; or

(iii) to an authorised market, from which the sheep may be moved with a licence of a local inspector of the District in which the market is held, to a slaughterhouse, or to premises for detention and isolation until they have been certified by a local inspector of the place of destination to

have been twice dipped on the premises by a thorough immersion in an approved dip, with an interval of not less than seven and not more than fourteen days between the dippings.

Provided that—

(c) sheep required to be detained and dipped in accordance with this Article may, before they have been so dipped, be moved to a slaughterhouse, if such movement is authorised by a further licence of a local inspector; and

(d) sheep moved to a slaughterhouse with a licence under this Order shall be detained thereat until slaughtered.

(2) Where under any Order of the Minister relating to Sheep-Scab or any regulation made thereunder sheep moved under this Order are required to be dipped as a condition of movement into or out of any district, the dipping of any sheep under this Order shall be deemed to be the dipping or double-dipping of the sheep necessary in order to comply with such condition. Sheep dipped under this Order shall also be exempt from dipping under any other Order (except the Sheep Scab Order of 1920) or regulation for a period of 56 days after the date of the second dipping under this Order, provided that the sheep are kept separate during that period from sheep which have not been so dipped.

Provisions as to Licences and Movement.

34.—(1) A licence granted under this Part of this Order for the movement of imported cattle, sheep or goats shall remain in force for a period of five days, inclusive of the day on which it is granted, and no longer.

(2) A copy of every licence granted under this Part of this Order shall be sent forthwith by the Inspector or local inspector by whom it is granted to the local authority of the district in which the authorised market or other authorised place of destination is situate, and also, where the place of destination is not an authorised market, to the occupier of that place.

(3) Every licence granted under this Part of this Order shall accompany the cattle, sheep or goats to which it relates throughout the time during which they are being moved thereunder, and shall on demand be produced by the person for the time being in charge of the animals to any Inspector or local inspector or police constable.

(4) A licence authorising the movement of imported cattle, sheep or goats to an authorised market shall be delivered up at the entrance to the market by the person for the time being in charge of the animals to the person appointed by the local authority for the purpose of receiving such licences, and every licence authorising imported cattle, sheep or goats to be moved elsewhere than to an authorised market shall forthwith after the arrival of the animals at the authorised place of destination be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest police station in the district by the person then in charge of the animals.

(5) Imported cattle, sheep or goats to be moved under a licence granted under this Part of this Order shall, so far as is practicable, be

moved by rail, and shall in all cases be moved without unnecessary delay and direct to the authorised place of destination.

(6) Where imported cattle, sheep or goats are being moved by rail they shall not, until they reach the railway station from which they are to be moved to the premises specified in the licence, be removed from their trucks for any purpose other than the purpose of being fed or watered, and then only at some railway station, and if removed for that purpose shall not be taken outside the station premises:

Provided that, nothing in the foregoing provision shall prevent the removal from its truck of any animal on account of any injury sustained by it or for any other necessary purpose.

Savings.

35.—Nothing in this Part of this Order shall be deemed to authorise the movement of any cattle, sheep or goats in contravention of any Order of the Minister, or any regulation of a local authority prohibiting or regulating the movement of cattle, sheep or goats.

PART V.

GENERAL PROVISIONS.

Duties of Local Authority and Police.

36. The Local Authority and all constables and police officers shall assist the Inspectors of the Ministry to carry into effect and enforce this Order, and shall do or cause to be done all things necessary for the effectual execution of the same.

Power of Local Authorities to make Regulations as to Landing and Removal of Dung, Fodder, &c.

37.—(1.) A Local Authority may for the purpose of preventing the spreading of disease make Regulations for:—

(a) regulating the landing in the District of the Local Authority of dung of animals brought from Ireland, the Channel Islands, or the Isle of Man, or of partly consumed or broken fodder that has been supplied to such animals, or of litter that has been used for or about such animals; or

(b) regulating the removal of dung, fodder, or litter out of a Landing Place in the District.

(2.) A Local Authority shall forthwith send to the Ministry two copies of every Regulation made by them under this Article.

(3.) If the Ministry is satisfied on inquiry, with respect to any Regulation made by a Local Authority under this Article, that the same is for any reason objectionable, and directs the revocation thereof, the same shall thereupon cease to operate.

Revocation of Orders.

38. The Orders specified in the Third Schedule to this Order are hereby revoked to the extent therein specified, and this Order

shall apply to animals landed under any Order hereby revoked as if they had been landed under this Order.

Offences.

39.—(1.) If any animal or thing shall be landed or moved in contravention of this Order, or any Regulation made under this Order, or a licence thereunder, the owner thereof, and the occupier of the place of landing or other place where or from which such animal or thing is landed or moved, and the person causing, directing or permitting the landing or movement, and also in the case of the landing thereof, the owner and the charterer and the master of the vessel from which the same is landed, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts or defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2.) If an animal is not detained or isolated or is not slaughtered as required by this Order, or by a licence thereunder, the owner of the animal, and the person in charge thereof, and the occupier of the place where the animal is detained, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts or defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(3.) If any person, whose entry into a Landing Place or any part of a Landing Place is prohibited, enters or attempts to enter into such Landing Place or part of a Landing Place he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(4.) If anything is done or omitted to be done as regards cleansing or disinfection in contravention of this Order the occupier of the Landing Place in which, and the owner and the lessee and the occupier of any other place or thing in respect of which; as the case may be, the same is done or omitted to be done; shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(5.) If any person fails to carry out or observe any direction as regards cleansing or disinfection, which he is by this Order required to carry out or observe, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Commencement.

40. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of April, nineteen hundred and twenty-three.

Short Title.

41. This Order may be cited as the ANIMALS (LANDING FROM IRELAND; CHANNEL ISLANDS AND ISLE OF MAN) ORDER OF 1923.

IRISH ANIMALS (MARKING) ORDER
OF 1923.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1922, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Marking of Irish Animals.

1.—(1) Cattle, sheep, goats or swine brought from Ireland shall not be landed in Great Britain unless the animals have been marked by and at the expense of the owner or his agent in the following manner:—

Cattle.—By the clipping of a cross, thus +, on the left hind quarter, each of the two lines forming the cross being not less than nine inches long.

Sheep and Pigs.—By the painting or stamping with a red adhesive composition of

a broad line down the back and another broad line across the loins, thus +, each line being not less than nine inches long.

(2) If any person shall efface, obliterate or remove, or attempt to efface, obliterate or remove, any mark on an animal whilst such animal is subject to the provisions of this Order he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Short Title and Commencement.

2. This Order may be cited as the IRISH ANIMALS (MARKING) ORDER OF 1923, and shall come into operation on the first day of April, nineteen hundred and twenty-three.
