GENERAL MINIMUM TIME-RATES AND OVERTIME RATES AS VARIED FOR MALE WORKERS.

Effective as from 9th April, 1923, except where otherwise shown.

Should this date not correspond with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid by an employer who pays wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, the rates (as varied) shall become effective as from the beginning of the next full pay period, but in any case not later than 15th April, 1923.

GENERAL MINIMUM TIME-RATES.

- I. Certain Special Classes of Male Workers of 21 years of age and over (see Section I of Part I of the Schedule below), 1s. 2d. per hour.
- II. All other Male Workers of 21 years of age and over, 11½d. per hour.
- III. Male Workers under 21 years of age. (See Section II of Part I of the Schedule below.)
