NOTE.—In the case of all Workers employed on Piece-Work, each Piece-Rate paid must be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, not less than the appropriate Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate to an ORDINARY worker, *i.e.*, a worker of ordinary skill and experience in the class of work in question.

## PART III.

## PROPOSED OVERTIME RATES.

Overtime Rates calculated on the Proposed Minimum Rates specified in Parts I and II of this Schedule in the manner set out in Part III of the Notice Q (22), issued by the Trade Board, dated 21st December, 1922, shall apply in substitution for the proposed Minimum Rates otherwise applicable, as set out in Parts I and II of this Schedule in respect of all hours worked in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board in the above mentioned Notice Q (22), to be the normal number of hours of work in the Trade.

## PART IV.

## APPLICABILITY OF PROPOSED MINIMUM RATES.

The above proposed minimum rates of wages shall apply subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts to all FEMALE WORKERS in respect of all time during which they are employed in Great Britain in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Stamped or Pressed Metal Wares) Order, 1919, as set out in Part IV of the above mentioned Notice Q (22).

The Trade Board will consider any OBJECTIONS to the above PROPOSAL TO VARY which may be lodged with them within two months from the 24th day of April, 1923. Such Objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to The Secretary of the Stamped or Pressed Metal Wares Trade Board (Great Britain), 1, Whitehall Gardens, London, S.W. 1.

It is desirable that the Objections should state precisely, and so far as possible with reasons, what is objected to.
