sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the two third parts or shares of and in the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Hedsor, that is to say, every turn or right of nomination or presentation to the said Benefice which shall occur or arise on a vacancy of the said Benefice happening after the date hereof for ever (with the exception of the next such turn or right of nomination or presentation and of every third succeeding turn or right of nomination or presentation thereafter) which said two third parts or shares of and in the said Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage are now vested in him, the said George Florance, Baron Boston, as aforesaid shall be transferred to the said Hubert Murray, Bishop of Oxford, and his successors in the same Bishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Hubert Murray, Bishop of Oxford, and by his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Regis-

trar of the said Diocese of Oxford.
