NEWBURY GAS.

(Application by the Newbury Corporation for a Special Order under Section 10 of the Gas Regulation Act, 1920.)

NOTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made forthwith to the Board of Trade by the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Newbury, acting by the Council (hereinafter called "the Corporation"), whose address is the Municipal Buildings, Newbury, in the county of Berks, for a Special Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order"), under Section 10 of the Gas Regulation Act, 1920, for all or some of the following purposes (that is to say):—

1. To extend the existing limits of supply of the Corporation so as to include the parishes of Enborne, Greenham, Sandleford, Speen and Shaw-cum-Donnington, in the Rural District of Newbury, in the County of Berks, and the parish of Newtown, in the Rural District of Kingsclere, in the County of Southampton, and parts of the parishes of Cold Ash and Thatcham in the said Rural District of Newbury, in the County of Berks, and to authorise the Corporation within the said extended limits to supply gas and to exercise all other powers exercisable by them within the existing limits.

- 2. To authorise the Corporation to charge for gas supplied in the extended limits a price exceeding the price charged for the time being within the existing limits of supply by not more than one decimal six pence per therm.
- 3. To empower the Corporation to lay pipes in private streets, to purchase, erect, maintain and let dwelling houses for their employees, to supply gas fittings, to require the use of antifluctuators with gas engines and the provision of a valve where high pressure air is used, to refuse to supply persons in debt for other premises, to make a minimum charge for stand-by supplies of gas, to supply and purchase gas in bulk, and to lay down pipes for ancillary purposes.
- 4. To make provision as to charges to be made for gas supplied by means of prepayment meters, and for the hire of prepayment meters and fittings to be used therewith.
- 5. To make provision with reference to the cutting off supplies to consumers in certain cases, and for payment by occupiers of premises of the cost of reconnecting supplies.
- 6. To enable the Corporation to make specifications with regard to the minimum size and the material of the pipes with the fittings thereof which are to be laid by the owner or occupier of any premises on those premises either in the first instance or on the occasion of any renewal.
- 7. To empower the Corporation to compel consumers to repair piping or appliances which may be found to be in a dangerous condition.
- 8. To amend the obligations of the Corporation as to giving a supply of gas in any case where the capacity of a main is insufficient for the purpose.
- 9. To amend the powers and obligations of the Corporation with respect to the application of revenue and deficiency of receipts in respect of the Gas Undertaking.
- 10. To confer upon the Corporation other powers commonly conferred upon Gas Undertakings, and to enact all such provisions as may be deemed expedient for effecting the purposes aforesaid, or any of them.
- 11. To incorporate with the Order all or some of the provisions of the Gas Works Clauses Acts, with or without modification, and to incorporate, amend, extend or repeal some of the provisions of the Newbury Borough Extension Act, 1878, and any Act or Order affecting the Corporation.
