

Any such objection should state:—

- (a) the specific grounds of objection; and
- (b) the omissions, additions or modifications asked for.

A copy of the objection should be forwarded to the undersigned at the same time as it is sent to the Board of Trade.

A copy of the draft Order and a map showing the existing works of the Corporation, and the boundaries of the proposed area of supply and the area in which the Corporation are already authorised to supply gas, have been deposited for public inspection with the Clerk of the Peace for the County of Berks, at his office at the Shire Hall at Reading; with the Clerk of the Peace for the County of Southampton, at his office at the Castle at Winchester; and at the Town Clerk's Office, Municipal Buildings, Newbury.

NORTH SOMERSET ELECTRICITY.

1. The North Somerset Electric Supply Company Ltd. (hereinafter referred to as "the Company"), whose registered office is at the Electricity Works, Portishead, have applied to the Electricity Commissioners under the Electricity (Supply) Acts, 1882 to 1922, for a Special Order for the following objects:—

(a) To authorise the Company to generate, transform and distribute electrical energy for all public and private purposes as defined by the above Acts within the following area (hereinafter referred to as "the area of supply"), that is to say:—

The parishes of Banwell, Blagdon, Bleadon, Burrington, Butcombe, Christon, Churchill, Congresbury, Hutton, Kewstoke, Locking, Loxton, Puxton, Rowberrow, Shipham, Week Saint Lawrence (otherwise Wick St. Lawrence), Winscombe, Worle and Wrington (otherwise Wrington-with-Broadfield) in the rural district of Axbridge, and the parishes of Backwell, Barrow Gurney, Brockley, Dundry, Kenn, Kingston Seymour, Winford and Yatton in the rural district of Long Ashton, all in the county of Somerset.

(b) To authorise the Company to exercise within the area of supply the powers usually conferred on distributors of electrical energy.

2. The names of the streets and parts of streets in which electrical lines are to be laid down within a specified time are as follows:—

Rural district of Axbridge:—

Parish of Blagdon.—The road from

Orchard House to the George Inn, and thence to the Seymour Arms Inn;

Parish of Congresbury.—From Congresbury Bridge to the railway bridge; from Congresbury Bridge to Yeo Bank;

Parish of Shipham.—High-street from the Court House to Chestnut Tree Farm;

Parish of Wrington.—Broad-street; Station-road from Broad-street to All Saints' Church;

Rural district of Long Ashton:—

Parish of Backwell.—The road leading from Weston-super-Mare to Bristol between Dark-lane and the house known as Fir Grove; the road from Fir Grove to Clifton House;

Parish of Barrow Gurney.—The road between the church and the post office;

Parish of Kenn.—The main road leading from Kenn to Clevedon between the church and the vicarage;

Parish of Yatton.—Station-road from the railway bridge to the Cabinet Works; High-street from the railway bridge to Henley Lodge.

3. The streets and parts of streets not repairable by the local authority and railways which the Company propose to take special powers by the Order to break up are as follows:—

(A) Streets.

Rural district of Axbridge:—

Parish of Congresbury.—The lane leading from Cadbury Farm to Cadbury-lane;

Parish of Kewstoke.—Elmsley-lane, Foss-lane;

Parish of Shipham.—Lippiat-lane from Chestnut Tree Farm to Long Bottom;

Parish of Week St. Lawrence.—School-lane;

Parish of Winscombe.—Barton Drove, Winscombe Hill, Eastwell-lane, Yadley-lane, Church-lane, Winscombe Drove;

Rural district of Long Ashton:—

Parish of Backwell.—Tinkers-lane, Downside-road, Pit-lane, road from Dark-lane to Cole's Quarry;

Parish of Brockley.—Brockley Combe, Brockley Elm;

Parish of Winford.—Hay-lane, King-down-lane, Rocks-lane;

Parish of Yatton.—The road leading from Railway Inn to Great Western Railway Station, the road leading from main road to Great Western Railway cottages, road opposite Cherry Grove Farm, Stowey-lane, Cour de Wyck Tannery-road, Claverham-road, Blind-lane, road near the ninth milestone at Cleeve.

(B) Main Roads.

(i) Leading from Bristol to Weston-super-Mare through the parishes of Backwell, Brockley, Yatton, Congresbury, Puxton and Worle; and

(ii) Leading from Bristol to Axbridge through the parishes of Barrow Gurney, Winford, Wrington, Churchill, Winscombe, Rowberrow and Winscombe.

(C) Level Crossings.

The following level crossings:—

(i) Weston Clevedon and Portishead Light Railway.—Kingston-road Station,
