In the case of all Female Workers employed on piece-work, each piece-rate paid must be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an ORDINARY WORKER, i.e., a worker of ordinary skill and experience in the class of work in question, not less than the Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate of 8½d. per hour.

PART IV.

OVERTIME RATES.

Overtime Rates calculated on the appropriate minimum rate of wages set out in Part I, II or III of this Schedule in the manner described in Part III of the Trade Board's Notice H.M.S. (14), dated 1st June, 1923, apply in substitution for the rates set out in Parts I, II and III of this Schedule in respect of all hours worked in excess of the number declared by the Trade Board to be the normal number of hours of work in the trade and set out in Part III of the above-mentioned Notice H.M.S. (14).

The above Minimum Rates of Wages must be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any Superannuation or other Provident Fund.
