ENGLAND, SOUTH COAST-SPITHEAD.

Sturbridge Shoal—New Spoil Ground established; Spoil Ground discontinued.

(1) New spoil ground established:

Position.-Northward of Sturbridge shoal, lat. 50° 45' N., long. 1° 09' W. (approx.).

Details.---The limits of the new spoil ground are as follows:

(a) On the North.—By a line drawn from the green and white chequered lightbuoy with group flashing white light, marking the north-western corner of the Mining ground, in a 270° direction for a distance of 6.4 cables.

(b) On the East.—By a line joining the green and white chequered light-buoy marking the north-western corner of the Mining ground, and the green and white horizontally striped buoy marking the south-western corner of the Mining ground.

(c) On the South.-By a line joining the green and white horizontally striped buoy, marking the south-western corner of the Mining ground and the West Sturbridge buoy.

(d) On the West.-By a line joining the West Sturbridge buoy and the western extremity of limit (a).

Note.—A red and green vertically striped can buoy has been established at a distance of 11.3 cables 037° from the flagstaff on Ryde pier head, to mark the centre of the southern limit of this spoil ground.

The area is to be indicated in pecked lines on the charts and marked "Spoil Ground (1923)."

(2) Spoil ground discontinued:

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Position .- Southward of the eastern end of Sturbridge shoal.

Note.—This spoil ground, which has been discontinued, is to be marked "(Disused 1923) " on the charts.

Rémarks.-The red and green can buoy, about 31 cables south-westward of the charted position of East Sturbridge buoy, formerly marking this spoil ground, has been removed.
