ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES. - 4

(DATED 29TH JUNE 1923.)

SHEEP-DIPPING (BLACK MOUNTAIN DISTRICT) ORDER OF 1923.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1922, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:

Application of Part I of Sheep (Double Dipping) Order of 1920.

1.—(1) Part I (Restriction on Movement of Sheep out of a Movement Area) of the Sheep (Double Dipping) Order of 1920, hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Order," is referred to as "the Principal Order," is hereby applied to the Area described in the First Schedule hereto, which shall be a Movement Area for the purposes of that Order.

(2) This Article shall come into operation on the tenth day of August, nineteen hundred and twenty-three, and shall cease to operate on the tenth day of September, nineteen hundred and twenty-three.
