enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:---

Removal of prohibition on landing of animals from Guernsey.

1. From and after the date of this Order, the Foreign Animals (Amendment) Order of 1923 shall cease to apply to animals brought from Guernsey, and thereupon the First Schedule (Prohibited Countries and Parts of Countries) to the Foreign Animals Order of 1910 shall be read and have effect as if that Island was excluded from the list of Prohibited Countries and parts of Countries mentioned in that Schedule.

Interpretation.

2. In this Order terms have the same meaning as in the Foreign Animals Order of 1910.

Short Title.

3. This Order may be cited as the Foreign Animals (Amendment) Order of 1923 (No. 2).
