

6. Section twenty of the Superannuation Act, 1884, in its application to any person appointed, whether before or after the date of this Order, to an office in a public department of the Government of Northern Ireland, who, at the time of his appointment was or is in receipt of a superannuation allowance or compensation payable out of the Consolidated

Fund or moneys provided by the Parliament of the United Kingdom, such as is mentioned in that section, shall have effect as if the expression "any office in any public department" included an office in a public department of that Government.

Scheme for authorizing the sale and disposal of certain property situate in the County of Lincoln now vested in us:

"Whereas the property, particulars whereof are set forth in the Schedule hereunder written, is now vested in us not subject to any outstanding beneficial lease or grant but in possession, and we are desirous of selling the same or some portion thereof for the improvement of our Common Fund:

"Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty that we may be authorized and empowered to sell or dispose of and duly to transfer or convey from time to time all or part of the said property described in the said Schedule for such consideration as shall appear to us to be just and reasonable.
