PART II.

SECTION I.

In the application of the proposed General Minimum Time-Rates set out in Part I. of this Notice, the following provisions shall apply:

- (a) In the case of classes of whole-time workers employed by the week or longer period whose usual working week, as agreed between the employer and the workers, consists of a number of hours less than 48 but not less than 44, " a week " means a week of the number of hours usually worked by the class in question as so agreed:
- (b) In all other cases, " a week " means a week of 48 hours.

SECTION II.

For the purpose of calculating the hourly rate applicable in respect of each hour of employment, the weekly rates set out in Sections I and II of Part I of this Notice must be divided:

- (a) In the case of the workers referred to in Section I (a) above, by the number of hours constituting the usual working week as agreed between the employer and the workers;
- (b) In all other cases by 48.

SECTION III.

Payment at not less than the hourly rate calculated as described in Section II must be made for ALL hours of employment (not merely for those constituting " a week," as described in Section I), except in so far as higher overtime rates are payable under the provisions of Part IV of this Schedule.

In the case of all workers employed on Piece-Work, each Piece-Rate paid must be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an ORDINARY WORKER, that is, a worker of ordinary skill and experience, not less than the equivalent of the appropriate Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate.
