PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Right Reverend Arthur Cayley, Lord Bishop of Gloucester, has, under Section 26 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, made a Representation to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, in the following terms:—

“ We, Arthur Cayley, by Divine Permission Bishop of Gloucester, do in pursuance of the 26th Section of the Pluralities Act, 1838, hereby represent to Your Grace as follows:—

“ 1. There is in the County of Gloucester and our Diocese of Gloucester the Vicarage of Hawkesbury with the Chapelry of Tresham annexed, the Parish whereof contains an estimated present population of about eleven hundred. The said Chapelry of Tresham includes also the Tithing of Saddlewood and the Manor of the Waste of the Manor. The net annual value of the Benefice arising from Tithe Rent Charge, Queen Anne's Bounty, Glebe lands, and fees, and other sources is Two hundred and eighty-four pounds or thereabouts. The Parish Church of St. Mary

Hawkesbury aforesaid contains three hundred sittings and a chapel of ease at Tresham aforesaid contains fifty sittings.

“ 2. There is also in the same County and Diocese the Rectory of Alderley the Parish whereof contains an estimated present population of about one hundred. The net annual value of this Benefice arising from Tithe Rent Charge and dividends from investments representing the proceeds of sale of glebe lands is two hundred pounds or thereabouts. The Parish Church of St. Kenelm Alderley aforesaid contains one hundred and fifty sittings.

“ 3. The said Chapelry of Tresham lies at a distance of about five and a half miles from the Parish Church of Hawkesbury and about one and a half miles from the Parish Church of Alderley. The Parish of Hillesley in the said County and Diocese of Gloucester lies between the said Chapelry of Tresham and the said Parish of Hawkesbury.

“ 4. It appears to us that under the provisions of the said Pluralities Act the said Chapelry of Tresham (more particularly delineated and described on the Plan annexed to the Scheme appended to this Representation) may advantageously be separated from the said Parish of Hawkesbury with Tresham and annexed to the said Parish of Alderley to which it is contiguous.

“ 5. The Benefice of Hawkesbury with

Tresham is in the Patronage of the Trustees of the late Sir George Banks Jenkinson, Baronet. The Benefice of Alderley is in the Patronage of Thomas Edward Sherwood Hale, Esquire, J.P.

" 6. The Reverend Howard Evelyn Betts, M.A. is the present Incumbent of the Benefice of Hawkesbury with Tresham. The Reverend Daniel Yarnton Mills is the present Incumbent of the Benefice of Alderley.

" 7. Pursuant to the directions contained in the 26th Section of the said Pluralities Act we the said Bishop have drawn up a Scheme in writing annexed to this Representation describing the District so as aforesaid proposed to be annexed to the said Parish of Alderley and the mode in which it appears to us the alteration may best be effected and how the changes consequent thereon in respect to Ecclesiastical jurisdiction, Glebe lands, Tithes, Rentcharges, and other Ecclesiastical dues rates and payments and in respect to Patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested. And we do hereby submit the same to Your Grace together with the Consents in writing of the said Patrons and Incumbents to the intent that if Your Grace shall on full consideration and enquiry be satisfied with such Scheme you may certify the same and such Consents by your Report to His Majesty in Council."

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop and the Consents referred to in the said Representation are as follows:—

" SCHEME.

" That the Chapelry of Tresham shall be separated from the said Parish of Hawkesbury with Tresham and annexed for ecclesiastical purposes to the contiguous Parish of Alderley. The said Chapelry is delineated and described in the plan hereunto annexed and thereon edged with pink.

" That the Incumbent of the said Parish of Alderley to which such Chapelry shall be annexed shall have the sole and exclusive cure of Souls within the said Chapelry.

" That the Parishioners of the said Chapelry shall be entitled to accommodation in the Church of the said Parish of Alderley but shall cease to be entitled to accommodation in the Church of the said Parish of Hawkesbury or the Chapel of ease in the said Chapelry of Tresham excepting nevertheless any person or persons possessing a legal right by faculty or otherwise to any pew or sitting in the said Parish Church of Hawkesbury or the Chapel of ease in the said Chapelry of Tresham and who may not be willing to relinquish and give up the same.

" That marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials shall be solemnized and performed for the inhabitants of the said Chapelry in the said Parish Church of Alderley.

" That all fees, dues, ecclesiastical offerings and emoluments arising from the said Chapelry shall belong to the Incumbent of the said Parish of Alderley to which such Chapelry shall be annexed.

" That no alteration shall be made in the Patronage of the said Benefices or either of them.

" That Rentcharges charged upon and issuing out of hereditaments situate as to part in the said Parish of Hawkesbury with Tresham and as to the remainder thereof in the adjoining Parish of Hillesley (such Rentcharges being in lieu of the Vicarial Tithes now belonging to the Incumbent of the said Parish of Hawkesbury with Tresham and being specifically set forth in the Schedule hereto) shall belong to the Incumbent of the said Parish of Alderley.

" That no alteration other than the annexation of Tithe Rentcharges as aforesaid shall be made in the Endowments of the said Benefices.

(10) issued by the Trade Board and dated 30th May, 1922, the proposed minimum rates being as set out in the Schedule below.

This Notice is issued with the consent of the Minister of Labour.

SECTION I.

EACH " COST OF LIVING " PERIOD referred to in Columns I to VI of Part I and in Part II of this Schedule, shall be a period from the first day of the month following the publication in the " Ministry of Labour Gazette " of a " Cost of Living " figure (as defined in Section II below); within the range of percentage specified in the appropriate column, until the first day of the month following the publication of a figure within the range specified in another column.

Provided that in cases where the first day of the month does not coincide with the beginning of the weekly pay period, the " Cost of Living " period shall begin or end (as the case may be) at the beginning of the next following weekly pay period.

SECTION II.

THE COST OF LIVING FIGURE specified in this Schedule is:—the average percentage increase since July, 1914, in retail prices (all items) in the United Kingdom, as published each month in the " Ministry of Labour Gazette."

SECTION III.

The Minimum Rates set out in this Schedule shall be operative only during the several periods specified, or until such time as the cancellation or variation thereof may become effective.

PART V.

The Proposed Minimum Rates of Wages set out in Parts I, II and III of this Schedule shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all Male Workers in Great Britain in respect of all time during which they are employed in the Coffin Furniture Section of the Trade specified in the Trade Boards (Coffin Furniture and Cereament-Making) Order, 1919, as set out in Part V of the above-mentioned Notice U. (10).

The Trade Board will consider any OBJECTIONS to the above Proposals which may be lodged with them within two months from the 17th day of August, 1923. ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 14TH AUGUST, 1923.)

HAMPSHIRE AND DISTRICT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1923 (No. 4).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1922, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Areas Affected.

1.—(1) This Order applies to the Areas described in the Schedule hereto. In this Order the Areas are referred to as the Prohibited Areas.

(2) If any farm (except any detached part) is partly within and partly outside the Prohibited Areas the whole shall be deemed to be within the Prohibited Areas.

Prohibition of Movement of Animals into, out of, or within Prohibited Areas.

2. (a) The movement of cattle, sheep, goats or swine into or out of the Prohibited Areas is

prohibited, except as provided in the next following article; provided that this Order shall not prevent the movement of animals through such Areas direct by railway without avoidable delay if the animals are not untrucked within such Areas.

(b) The movement of any such animal along or across any road or other highway or by water within the Prohibited Areas is prohibited.

(c) No such animals shall be allowed by the owner or person in charge thereof to stray upon a road or other highway within the Prohibited Areas

(d) No slaughterhouse manure or refuse shall be moved out of the Prohibited Areas or be brought into contact with animals in such Areas.

Provision for Movement of Animals into Prohibited Areas for Immediate Slaughter.

3. Animals may be moved from premises outside the Prohibited Areas to a slaughter house in any borough or urban district in those Areas, subject to the following conditions:—

(i.) A licence authorising the movement must be obtained from the Local Authority of the destination before the movement commences. This licence must accompany the animals throughout the whole movement.

(ii.) The animals must be put on rail at a station outside the Prohibited Areas and be moved by railway without being untrucked within the Prohibited Areas until arrival at the railway station nearest to the place of destination.

(iii.) On completion of the movement the licence shall be delivered up to the nearest police station without delay by the person in charge of the animals at the time of completing the movement.

Closing of Footpaths and Premises.

4.—(1) An Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority may (notwithstanding the existence of any footpath or right of way) prohibit the entry of any person into any field, shed, or other place in the Prohibited Areas by giving notice in writing to that effect to the occupier. In such cases the owner of any cattle, sheep, goats or swine in such places or his agents or servants may enter for the sole purpose of feeding or tending the animals, but no other person shall enter any such place until such notice has been withdrawn by a further Notice from an Inspector, unless he has obtained a licence to do so from an Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority.

(2) Copies of such notices shall be affixed or exhibited by the Inspector in such manner as he may think desirable for ensuring notification of the restrictions thereby imposed.

(3) Copies of such Notices when served shall be sent to the Ministry.

Control of Dogs and Poultry.

5.—(1) An Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority may, by a written notice served upon the occupier of any premises in the Prohibited Areas on which dogs or poultry are kept, require such occupier to keep such dogs or poultry under such control as may be prescribed in the Notice, or to confine them to any specified part of the premises.

(2) Copies of such Notices when served are to be sent to the Ministry.

NOTICE is hereby given, that the following Bye-Laws and Regulations were made by the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Wolverhampton (hereinafter called "the Corporation") as the Local Authority under Section 46 of the Tramways Act, 1870, on the 1st day of August, 1923.

INTERPRETATION.

(1) Throughout these Bye-laws the word "Corporation" means the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Wolverhampton; the word "Tramways" means the Tramway and Motor Omnibus System worked by the Corporation, whether situate within the Borough of Wolverhampton or in any other District where the Corporation have running powers; the word "Car" means any Carriage or Car run upon the Tramways and any Motor Omnibus owned and used by the Corporation for the purpose of conveyance of passengers; the word "Passenger" shall mean every person being conveyed or attempting to be conveyed by a Car; the word "Conductor" means any Officer or Servant of the Corporation having charge of a Car, and the word "Driver" means any Officer or Servant of the Corporation driving or helping to drive a Car. The expression "interior of a Car" shall not include the upper deck of covered cars.

EXTENT.

(2) The Bye-laws and Regulations hereinafter set forth shall extend and apply to all cars of the Corporation and to all places with respect to which the Corporation have powers to make Bye-laws and Regulations.

ENTERING CARS.

(3) Every passenger shall enter a car by the step of the hindermost or Conductor's platform, and not otherwise.

All persons desiring to board a Car (for the purpose of travelling thereon) shall first permit all persons intending to alight from that end of the Car to do so.

LEAVING CARS.

(4) Except at the terminus, every passenger shall leave the Car by the step of the hindermost or Conductor's platform, and not otherwise, unless specially directed by the Driver or Conductor, provided that except at a terminus no passenger shall in any case leave the car by an exit on the off side of the car.

At the terminus passengers desiring to leave the Car shall (if so directed by the Conductor) leave such Car at the Driver's end thereof.

BOARDING CARS IN MOTION.

(5) No person shall enter, or mount, or leave, or attempt to enter, mount, or leave any Car in motion.

SMOKING.

(6) No person shall smoke or carry a lighted pipe, cigar or cigarette in or upon any Car, except in a compartment or on seats specially set apart for the purpose.

OBJECTIONABLE PERSONS.

(7) No person in a state of intoxication, or affected with any dangerous, contagious or infectious disorder, nor any person who from any other cause in the opinion of the Conductor is unfit to be a passenger shall enter or mount upon any Car, and any such person found in or upon any Car shall leave the car on being requested to do so by the Conductor, and on his refusal he may be removed from the Car by or under the direction of the Conductor.

OFFENSIVE LANGUAGE OR CONDUCT.

(8) No person shall swear or use obscene or offensive language or conduct himself offensively whilst in or upon any Car, Tramway Station, Waiting Room, or any premises used in connection with the Tramways, or spit or commit any nuisance, in or upon or against any Car, Tramway Station, Waiting Room, or premises as aforesaid, or in any way wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger.

OFFENSIVE CLOTHING.

(9) No person whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of the Conductor of a Car, soil, injure, or damage the seats, linings, curtains, or cushions of the Car, or the dress or clothing of any passenger or who, in the opinion of the Conductor might for any other reason be offensive to any passenger, shall be entitled to enter or remain in or upon any Car, and such person may be prevented from entering or remaining in or upon any Car.

No such person shall enter in or upon any Car after having been requested not to do so by the Conductor, and if any such person be found in or upon any Car, he shall, on the request of the Conductor, leave such Car upon the fare,

if previously paid, being returned or tendered to him, and on his refusal to do so he may be removed by or under the direction of the Conductor. Provided that on cars specially run for artisans, mechanics and daily labourers no person shall be prevented from entering or remaining in or on a car under the provisions of this Bye-law on the ground of the condition of his dress or clothing if such condition is due solely to the nature of his employment.

PLAYING MUSICAL INSTRUMENTS.

(10) No passenger or any other person shall, while travelling in or upon any Car or whilst upon any Tramway Station, Waiting Room or premises used in connection with the Tramways, play or perform upon any musical instrument or distribute advertisements or tracts of any kind, or beg or collect money, alms or subscriptions, or sell any article or play any game, or gamble, or throw down and leave in or upon any Car any waste paper or other refuse, or deposit remnants of food or fruit, or any other objectionable matter in or upon any Car.

DAMAGE TO CAR.

(11) No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil, or damage the seats, cushions, curtains, or linings, or remove or deface any number plate, printed or other notice, in or on any Car, or break or scratch any windows of or otherwise wilfully damage any Car.

Any person acting in contravention of this Bye-law shall in addition to the penalty prescribed by these Bye-laws be liable to pay the amount of any damage so done.

PAYMENT OF FARES.

(12) Each passenger shall pay to the Conductor the fare legally demandable for the journey, whether the same shall or shall not be demanded, and accept a ticket therefor.

TICKETS.

(13) Each passenger shall show his ticket (if any) when required so to do, to the Conductor or any duly authorised servant of the Corporation, and shall also when required so to do either deliver up his ticket or pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by such passenger.

No passenger shall alter, cut, tear or deface his ticket so as to render the number or any material portion thereof illegible.

WORKMEN'S TICKETS.

(14) A passenger not being an artisan, mechanic or daily labourer, within the true intent and meaning of the Statutory provisions relating to the Corporation shall not use or attempt to use any ticket intended only for such artisans, mechanics or daily labourers.

LUGGAGE.

(15) Personal or other luggage (including the tools of artisans, mechanics and daily labourers) shall, unless otherwise permitted by the Conductor, be placed on the front or driver's platform and not elsewhere.

TRAVELLING ON STEPS AND PLATFORMS.

(16) No passenger or other person not being a servant of the Corporation shall travel on the steps or platforms of any Car or stand on

the upper deck or sit on the railing, guards or buffers of any car, and any persons so travelling standing or sitting, shall cease to do so immediately on request by the Conductor.

No person except a passenger or intending passenger shall enter or mount any Car.

FULL NUMBER OF PASSENGERS.

(17) No person shall hold or hang on by or to any part of any car or travel therein or thereon otherwise than on a seat provided for passengers except in the interior of the car with the consent of the Conductor. When any car contains the full number of passengers which it is licensed to contain no additional person shall enter, mount or remain in or on any such car when warned by the Conductor not to do so.

DISABLED CARS.

(18) If at any time a Car becomes disabled, or damaged, or from any cause unable to proceed, all passengers shall upon the request of the Conductor, leave the Car, and if such passengers have paid their fares, shall not be entitled to demand back the amount of their fares so paid, but shall be entitled to continue their journey by the next available Car on any section. No person shall, except with the permission of the Conductor, mount or enter a disabled or damaged Car.

FIREARMS.

(19) No person shall place upon or travel in or on any Car with loaded firearms, or any article, instrument or implement, or any material or substance which may be dangerous or offensive to the passengers, or likely to cause a nuisance or to soil or damage any Car or the clothing of any passenger.

INTERFERENCE WITH DRIVER OR CONDUCTOR

(20) No person other than the Conductor or Driver, or other servant of the Corporation acting in the performance of his duty, shall change or remove the route indicators or destination boards, or interfere with the controller, brakes, switches, lights, trolley, cord, gate, chains, or any part of a Car or its equipment, and, except in case of emergency or accident, no person other than the Conductor or other Servant of the Corporation acting in the performance of his duty shall signal a Car to start or stop.

OBSTRUCTION.

(21) No person shall wilfully obstruct or impede any Conductor, Driver, or other Servant of the Corporation acting in the performance of his duty, upon or in connection with any Car. No person shall in any way wilfully obstruct or impede any Car.

ILLEGAL OFFENCE.

(22) Any person who shall commit whilst in or on any car any breach of these Bye-laws and Regulations shall, if the offence is continued, be liable in addition to incurring the penalty hereinafter provided to be immediately removed from the Car by, or under the direction of the Conductor, and if such person shall have paid his fare he shall not be entitled to claim its return.

PASSENGERS TO FORM A QUEUE.

(23) On occasions when six or more persons being intending passengers are waiting at any stopping station or terminus upon the Tramways to enter a Car they shall form up in a line or queue and enter the Car in the order in which they stand, and no persons shall take or endeavour to take a place in such line or queue when formed, out of proper order, or shall enter or endeavour to enter a Car out of the order in which he stood in such line or queue.

CONDUCTORS AND DRIVERS TO ENFORCE
BYE-LAWS.

(24) Every Inspector, Conductor and Driver of a Car shall, to the best of his ability, enforce these Bye-laws, and prevent any breach thereof.

PENALTY.

(25) Any person offending against or committing a breach of any of these Bye-laws shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings.

COPIES OF BYE-LAWS.

(26) There shall be placed and kept placed in a conspicuous position inside of each Car in use a printed copy of these Bye-laws and Regulations.

REPEAL OF EXISTING BYE-LAWS.

(27) From and after the date of these Bye-laws coming into force, the Bye-laws and Regulations made by the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Wolverhampton on the 8th day of June, 1903, shall be repealed.

DATE OF OPERATION OF BYE-LAWS.
