

The Home Secretary gives notice that, in pursuance of Section 2 (1) of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920, he has made an Order authorising the employment on two day shifts of women and young persons of 16 years of age and over, in glass grinding—the finishing of glass articles—at the works of Messrs. Duroglass Ltd, Blackhorse Lane, Walthamstow, E. 17, subject to the conditions that a worker shall not be employed in the afternoon shift in consecutive weeks; that suitable protective clothing, cloakroom and messroom accommodation, and washing facilities shall be provided and that arrangements shall be made for the effective and regular supervision of the workers by a responsible forewoman or welfare supervisor.
